# MACFIE CLAN COMMANDER: Vacant COUNCIL OF PRESIDENTS PROGRESS REPORT

**NEW COMMANDER AND SETTLING THE CLAN NAME** 

## April 2024

As reported before, the Council of Presidents for our Clan was formed in the Spring of 2023 to lead the process for finding a new Commander. Our Previous Commander lain McFie following many years of service had stepped down in 2021.

During our Gathering in September 2023 Dr. Bruce Durie, our consultant, presented to the attendees what the process would entail and held a Q&A session for attendees as an integral part of communications. Since the Gathering in Scotland the Council has made considerable progress on behalf of all Clan members worldwide with the guidance of Bruce Durie.

The Petition to convene a Family Convention for selection of a Commander candidate was presented to the Lord Lyon King of Arms Dr. Joseph Morrow. That Petition has now been approved and in the last few weeks Lord Lyon has appointed Linlithgow Pursuivant Extraordinary, Professor Gillian Black as our Supervisory Officer. Linlithgow's role will be to monitor our progress for communication, openness and how we build consensus for our actions. Lord Lyon has also asked the Council to settle the name of the clan prior to the submission of a candidate for Commander. These decisions will be made by eligible clan members. Please note that membership in a Clan Society is not required for participation.

Our next actions as a Council are to communicate our opening effectively and broadly for a new Commander to all members of our clan worldwide. There will be a dedicated website for all individuals to access multiple background documents to review the necessary information regarding the process. The website will also have application documents for eligible individuals wishing to be considered for the position, for registering to participate in the decisions and for participation in the selection of a Clan name. We will announce when this site is completed for your use and reference. You are highly encouraged to review the material and understand eligibility. In addition, there will be a dedicated email account for specific questions that may arise. Based on discussions with the Court all communications with the Court regarding this process will be made via a designated representative of the Council of Presidents.

As part of the Petition process Lord Lyon requested that a date for the Family Convention be set before any assignment of a Supervisory Officer from the Lyon Court would be made. For planning purposes, the Council of Presidents has set Saturday May 17<sup>th, 2025</sup> (and May 18 for New Zealand and Australia) as the date of our Family Convention to be convened in Scotland. The plan is for eligible members to attend in person or virtually as we prefer broad input from the clan. We need to remember that the Court requires that we reach a consensus on our decisions as voting is not an option. The Council has been successful in maintaining a consensus throughout the process to date and looks forward to settling the Clan name and identifying our next Clan Commander.

There are many additional details to consider, and the Council will maintain open communications. We look forward to your participation in these important and historical decisions.

#### **HISTORY**

# Short Account of the Emigration from the Highlands of Scotland to North America And the establishment of the Catholic Diocese of Upper Canada (1939)

A few years previous to the year 1790 a system was introduced into the Highlands of Scotland, converting small agricultural farms into large Sheep Walks, thereby dispossessing small tenants. The landlords found that south country shepherds with larger capital were able to give much larger rents than small tenants. The consequence was, that a large proportion of the tenants throughout the Highlands were ejected from their farms. And they and their families reduced to the greatest distress, as the restrictions of the Emigration Act prevented them from emigrating to the Colonies. In May 1792, the Right Reverand Alexander Macdonell, Catholic Bishop of Upper Canada, then a Missionary Priest in the Braes of Badenoch, Invernesshire, understanding that a great many labourers were wanting in the manufactories of Glasgow and the neighbouring Counties, travelled down to Glasgow, and waited upon the Manufacturers of that city. To procure employment for the dispossessed Highlanders; and on informing the Manufacturers, that the greater portion of these people were Catholics, those gentlemen promised every protection and encouragement to such as would come down to their works, But, as the excitement caused in the year 4780 by Lord George Gordon and his enthusiasts, when the Catholic Chapel and the Preist's House in Glasgow were burnt by a riotous mob, had not yet subsided, the Manufacturers were apprehensive that some annoyance might be offered to the Catholic labourers. When Mr. Macdonell stated the necessity of a Clergyman's accompanying these men, to afford them the exercises and consolations of their religion, they assured him that every countenance in their power would be given to such Clergyman; but, as the Penal Laws against the Catholic Priests, were yet in existence, they could not insure or guarantee protection to him. Mr. Macdonell, however, declared his willingness to accoumpany the Highlanders, and take his chance of the Penal Laws. The Catholic Labourers to the number of between 700 and 800 souls, accordingly came down from the Highlands and gave every possible satisfaction to their employers, during the following two years they remained in their service.

It was about this time, that French Revolutionary principles began to make very rapid progress among the men of all denominations employed in the Manufactories; and the troubles in France, Holland and other parts of the continent having caused a stagnation in the exports of British Manufactories of all kinds, a general failure among the cotton Manufacturers of Galsgow was the consequence, who wee thus compelled to dismiss the great part of their hands Catholics as well others. The men thus thrown out of employment were obliged by necessity to enlist in the several New Corps then raising for the defence of the country.

Mr. Macdonell, finding the Catholics under his charge obliged to enlist into these Corps, and compelled, according to the then universal practice, to declare themselves Protestants, conceived the idea of embodying them into one corps as a Catholic regiment; and with this view, was instrumental in procuring a meeting of the Catholic gentlemen of the Highlands, who drew up a Loyal Address to His Majesty, with an offer to raise a Catholic Regiment, under the command of Young Macdonell of glengarry. Mr. Macdonell, together with John Flecher, Esq. of Dunans, were sent to London with the Address and the offer to raise the regiment. Several of the Fencible Corps which had been raised in Scotland, having refused to march out of that country, even to England, Messrs, Macdonell and Flecher offered on the part of the proposed regiment, to serve in any part of His Majesty's dominions, where their services might be required. The Rt. Honourble Henry Dundas, then Secretary at War, approving of the idea of this extending the services of Fencible Corps, procured a Letter of Service for

the First Glengarry Regiment, to be under the command of Alexander Macdonell, Esq. Of Glengarry, to serve in any part of Great Britain & Ireland, and in the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, & c. and Mr. Macdonell was appointed Chaplain to the Regiment, being the first Catholic Corps raised in the British Dominions since the Reformation. The recruiting for the regiment was finished in a few months, including all the unemployed Catholic Highland labourers of Glasgow and its vicinity, and was forthwith placed upon the regular establishment.



After that he went to work as a mechanic for Lunman's, Gibbs & MacIlvannie, later Gibbs & Edwards all at the same location in Adams, NY, working there for about 19 years. He then went to work for New York State as a mechanic for region 7 in Watertown, NY, repairing trucks for five counties. He retired in October 1991 at the grade of Inspector after 22 years.

His hobbies have included camping, leather, and wood working, and currently putting together puzzles.

On August 30, 1952, he married June Rose Wheller of Ellisburg, daughter of Iva Rawlings and John Wheller. They have 3 daughters, Julie Marie MacDuffie Hall, Kathleen Ann Patchen, and Laurie Jo Dickinson, 9 grandchildren 19 great grandchildren and 11 great great-grandchildren.

After he came here in 1949, he became a founding member of the Adams VFW in Adams, NY. He also joined the Ellisburg Fire Dept in Ellisburg, NY in the Fire Police section and did serve as Chief in that section. ## **MacDuffee the Younger Scholarship**

Following is a summary of our scholarship that is available for eligible students. Application cut off is May 15th. The MacDuffee Clan Society supports education and knowledge of our Scottish & family heritage. Winners will be announced at the Annual meeting in July each year.

**Purpose:** The MacDuffee Scholarship recognizes college bound high school seniors based on citizenship, contributions to Scottish Heritage, academics, and service to the MacDuffee

Clan Society.

**Criteria:** The students eligible for consideration must be graduating high school seniors who

have been accepted at either a two- or four-year college or university. Consideration will be given to accomplishments and activities such as: academics, community service, activities in their church and school, awareness of Scottish Heritage, knowledge of their family genealogy, and admission to a College or University. Successful applicants will

be asked to write a half page paper regarding their family history. All eligible students will be the children, grandchildren, stepchildren or adopted children of active MacDuffee Clan Society members in good standing.

**Guidelines:** Scholarships will be awarded and disbursed each year at the Annual General meeting in July. All eligible candidates are to submit their Scholarship Application by May 1<sup>st</sup> of their senior year in High School.

**Amount:** Scholarships may range from \$250 to \$500 at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee. One scholarship may be granted each year. The scholarship is for one year and is not renewable.

**Deadline:** The deadline for submission of a Scholarship Application is May 1st of each year. The post mark or media date on the submission will be strictly monitored.
