## KEY TO CREST BADGES

- Yellow name panel - Chief of the Name and Arms
  - Green name panel - Commander
  - Blue name panel - No present Chief
- There is a custom that where a clan or family has no chief the members may use the crest of the last known chief or last known head of the senior branch of the family surrounded by a strap and buckle.
