Polly Montgomery, born Aug. 24, 1819, married John W. Robb, a merchant of Stewartville, Ind., July 23, 1844. He was born Oct. 23, 1816; was a large land-owner in Posey county, Ind., at one time being in possession of nearly 4,000 acres. His start in life was from small beginnings. He was strictly honest in his dealings with his fellow men. He died April 11, 1894. He often told his children that the happiest days of his life were when all his children were small and he could place them on straw in a two-horse wagon and come in one day and visit the mother of his wife, near Owensville, and return next day. This was when he was a man of small means. He had eleven children: 1, Lepora Robb, born Sept. 16, 1845, married F. M. Welborn, of Owensville, Ind., Feb. 7, 1867. She has good landed possessions. Mr. Welborn was at one time engaged in the general mercantile business, also engaged in buying wheat and corn; probably has handled as much of these products as any man in the county. One child—George R. Welborn, born March 7, 1868, married Lillie Heston, Oct. 11, 1898, daughter of Joseph Heston, one of the largest land-owners in Gibson county. George R. Welborn is a graduate of DePauw University, at Greencastle, Ind.; is

now (1902) proprietor of the large department store in Owensville, Ind., and is also a stockholder in the state bank of Owensville: one child—Harold Heston Welborn, born Sept. 23, 1894, died Feb. 23, 1895.

I have been informed that Squire John Montgomery was in the battle of Tippecanoe.

Samuel Montgomery, Jr., born 1794, in Kentucky, ninth and youngest child of Samuel Montgomery, Sr. He belonged to the state militia, and at the time of the call by Gen. Harrison for assistance to fight the battle of Tippecanoe he was absent on a visit. On returning home and being informed that the company to which he belonged had joined General Harrison he procured a horse and hastily followed them; but he met his company at Vincennes, returning home. He was about 17 years of age at this time. He first married Sarah Montgomery, Nov. 15, 1814, who was born 1793, died Aug. 1829. This was the 38th license issued in Gibson county, Ind. He was on the first jury drawn in Gibson county. It was in a justice's court, held in a small log cabin south-west of Princeton, on the McCurdy farm, on the flat to the left as you go to Princeton, just after crossing the branch, on the old road. The first regular court was held in a stone house built by Judge Isaac Montgomery, now known as the John Hudeleon and Joseph McCarty farms. The children of his first wife were five:
