A Circle of Gentlemen invites members

A group that has its roots in a secret society which remained loyal to Bonnie Prince Charlie after the Battle of Culloden has opened up its membership. Until now people have had to receive an invitation to join *A Circle of Gentlemen* but Circle commodore Matthew Donnachie said by encouraging general membership, a fund could be created to support heritage and archaeology projects.

The move comes in the 265th anniversary year of the Battle of Culloden. Established in Edinburgh in 1748, the original secret circle continued to back the prince after the Jacobites' defeat at Culloden, near



Inverness, in 1746 and its members continued to meet late into the 18th Century.

The modern version of the society followed discussions between Jacobite enthusiasts during the 1990s.

Sir Lachlan Maclean: The Honourable Sir Lachlan Hector Charles Maclean of Duart and

Morvern, Bt, CVO, DL is the 12th Baronet and 28th Chief of Clan Gillean. Sir Lachlan succeeded his father Lord Maclean in 1990 and at the same time inherited Duart Castle on the Isle of Mull in Argyll. While Duart is his home; the family has always seen it as a home for the Clan as well. Sir Lachlan was commissioned as Deputy Lieutenant of Argyll and Bute in 1993, and has served as Adjutant of the Royal Company of Archers (the Queen's Bodyguard for Scot-

land). He acted as Silver Stick for Scotland (the ceremonial bodyguard to the British Monarch) during the State visit of Her Majesty to the opening of the Scottish Parliament. In 1999, he was appointed Commander of the Royal Victorian Order.

CLAN MACLEAN (Clan Gillean): The Clan Maclean (Clan Gillean) traces its origins to the Royal House of Loarn, Kings of Dalriada. The Clan is named for its founder and first Chief, Gilleain na Tuaidh (Gillean of the Battleaxe), born ca. 1174. The name Gillean is translated as “Servant of St. John,” so “Maclean” is an Anglicization of the Gaelic *Mac Gille Eoin* (or *MacGhillEathainn*), which means “Son of the Servant of St. John.

Clansman’s Crest Badge: Notable modern Macleans include the diplomat and adventurer, Sir Fitzroy Hew Maclean of Dunconnel, Bt., believed by many to be the model for James Bond, and actor Sir Sean Connery, whose mother was a Maclean, and who frequently wears a Maclean kilt. Alistair Maclean and Sir Charles Maclean of Dunconnel, Bt. are well known authors, as is Charles Maclean, the whisky expert.

DUART CASTLE: Duart is from the Gaelic *Dubh Aird*, which means “black height.” Duart Castle stands proudly on the Black Height, a peninsula on the far eastern coast of the Isle of Mull in the Inner Hebrides, guarding the confluences of the Sound of Mull, the Firth of Lorne, and Loch Linnhe. On a clear day Ben Nevis, the highest peak in the British Isles, can be seen from the ramparts.

There has almost certainly been a stronghold at Duart since at least early Viking times. The curtain walls, built in 1250 for Macdougall of Lorn, are the earliest part of the current castle. They are nearly 30 feet high and from 5 to 15 feet thick.

The current chief, Sir Lachlan Maclean, inherited Duart Castle in 1990 and soon embarked upon a second restoration. Sir Lachlan has likened the process to “feeding a bonfire with £20 notes!” Duart Castle is open to the public from April through October each year.

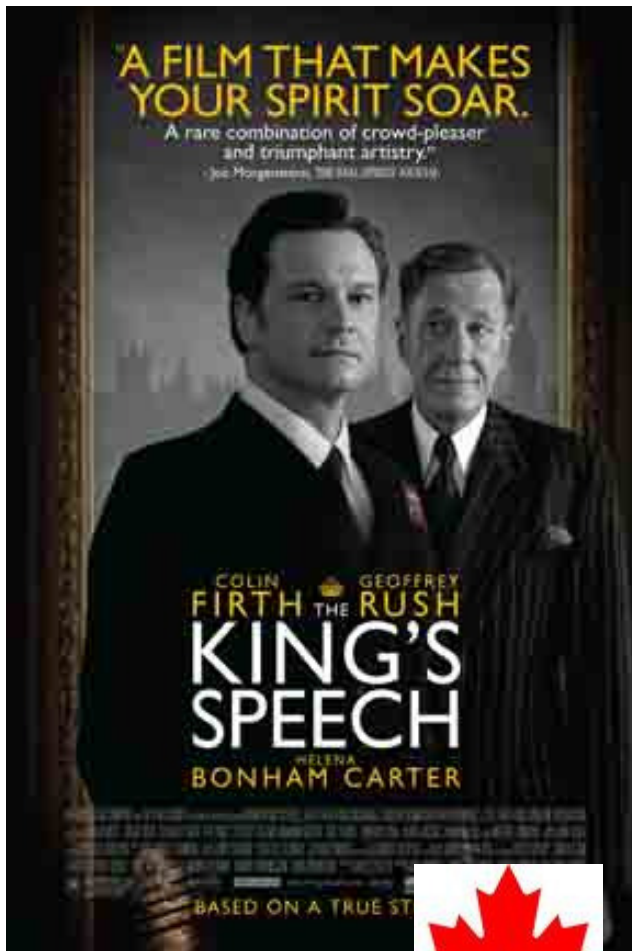

An Act to recognize the Maple Leaf Tartan as Canadian national tartan

"The Register of All Publicly Known Tartans formed the basis of a new International Tartan Index maintained by the Scottish Tartans Authority, a charitable organization started by several former members of the Scottish Tartans Society.

The Maple Leaf Tartan's International Tartan Index number is 2034, as identified in the original *Register of All Publicly Known Tartans*.

In February 2007, Secretary of State Jason Kenney asked the Scottish Tartans Authority in Edinburgh, Scotland, to issue a certifi-

"Tartan experts in Scotland have been left speechless by the highland dress worn by actor Colin Firth in the Oscar-tipped movie *The King's Speech*."

"The tartan is certainly not of any design that was available to the royals at that time," he added. "Things like this really get me going. The expertise would have been available to the film makers if they had bothered to ask."

"They seem to pay great attention to other costumes in the film yet they select a tartan from the late 20th century. To be honest, it's just poor research and sloppy attention to detail."

cate for the Maple Leaf Tartan in the name of the Dominion of Canada. I have a copy of that certificate, which confirms the Maple Leaf Tartan, as originally registered in 1964, as the de facto national tartan of Canada.

As the government indicated in a press release in 2008, by doing so, they wished to ensure that no other country or individual could lay claim to the tartan."

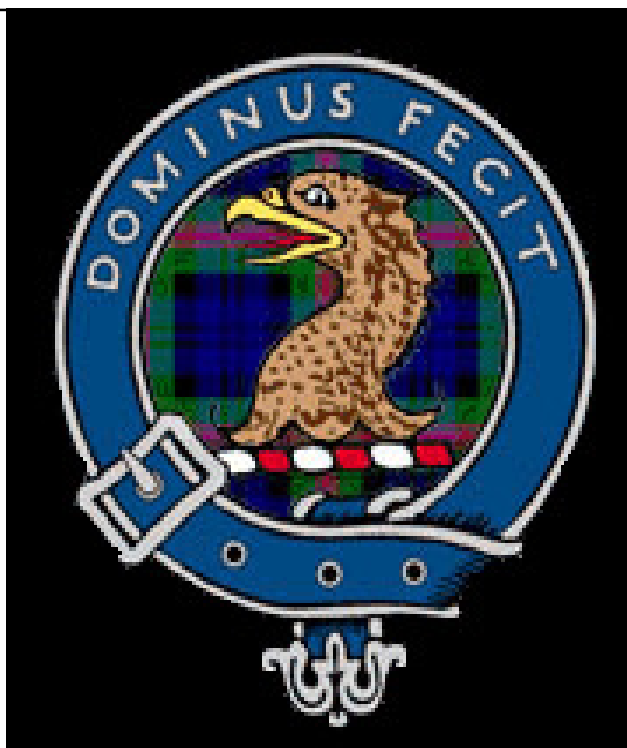

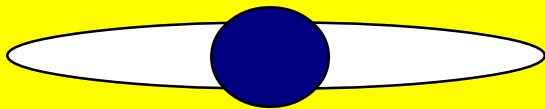

It is possible to locate ancestors in United States Serial Set Records

Genealogists who discover ancestors involved in activities that coincided with interests of the United States government should consult the United States Serial Set. Publication of the Serial Set began with the 15th Congress, 1st Session (1817). The Serial Set contains House and Senate Documents and House and Senate Reports dating from 1789 through 1969.

The reports are usually from congressional committees dealing with proposed legislation and issues under investigation. The documents also include other papers ordered printed by the House or Senate. Documents cover a wide variety of topics and may include reports of executive departments and independent organizations, reports of special investigations made for Congress, and annual reports of non-governmental organizations. During the late 19th and early 20th centuries, executive-branch materials were also included.

Women, African Americans, Native Americans, students, soldiers and sailors, pensioners, landowners, and inventors are all represented in the various records. The key factor that determines the likelihood of finding your ancestor in these records is their interactions with federal departments, the military, or life events that involved some contact with a federal jurisdiction.

In the post Revolutionary War (1789-1820), printing of congressional documents had been haphazard, and the Serial Set was an effort designed to rectify that situation. In 1831, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House ordered the publication of many early congressional and related federal documents. A total of 6,278 documents were published in 38 volumes between 1832 and 1861. In print format, the Serial Set is also known as the American State Papers. Because it was a retrospective effort, these 38

volumes were arranged chronologically within 10 subject areas: Foreign Relations, Indian Affairs, Finance, Commerce & Navigation, Military Affairs, Naval Affairs, Post Office, Public Lands, Claims, and Miscellaneous.

Important genealogical information may include: 1)

Information concerning land claims, especially those related to bounty grants for service to the government as well as to contested lands once under the jurisdiction of another nation; 2) Lists of names and addresses for individuals who applied for patents and documentation related to the inventions; 3) Lists of army and navy pensioners including their rank, place of residence; and amount of pension; 4) individual claims for

damages after military conflicts (such as the Civil War) or other incidents involving federal personnel; 5) Personnel information for non-governmental agencies and other private entities that provided outside services.

The *Heritage Quest* database, available through many public libraries, offers free access to this information. The best comprehensive print index is the Congressional Information Service's (CIS) *U.S. Serial Set Index*, produced in conjunction with their microfilming of the volumes through 1969 beginning in the mid-1970s. In this index, a two-volume subject index covers groups of Congresses, with a third volume providing an index to individual names for relief actions, as well as a complete numerical list in each report/document category.

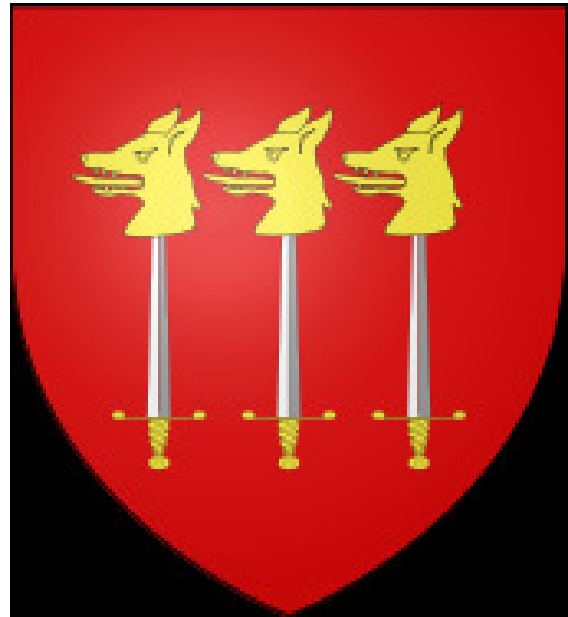

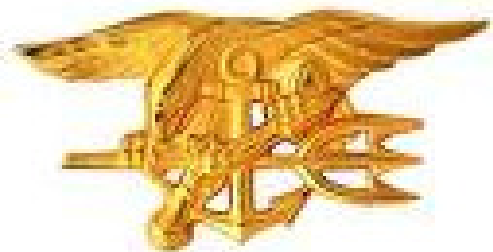

Understanding Pipe Band Competition: The Basics

When one attends a highland games, he can not leave without the bands having influenced his experience one way or another. He might casually listen to the music as it fades in and out in the background or stop and watch the events going. When watching the competition it is not always clear to the uninitiated. Who are the people walking around the circle and what are they doing? Is there any difference between the bands? What makes up the seemingly endless requirements? These competitions seem complex, but in reality are very logical and understandable to even those who do not play instruments.

The pipe bands have a set of requirements that govern the kinds of music they can play in competition as determined by their grade level. Grade V is required to play a selection of quick marches while grade IV prepares a medley. The medley can consist of any kind of music as long as the total performance is between 3 and 5 minutes. Grades III through I have two different sets they must prepare, a medley with the same requirements and a second set consisting of one March, Strathspey, and Reel, or MSR. They will only play one of the sets at any given competition, but all in the same grade will play the same set type. The time requirement is strictly enforced. If any band plays a set that is short or long, by even one second, they are automatically disqualified.

The piping competition is often performed on the main field of the games in

order that it may serve as entertainment for the crowds. The competition area is made of two circles, one inside of the other. The inner circle is a guide for the pipe band to form up in and play their music. The outer circle is for the judges. The judges are allowed to move all around the outer circle to listen, but are never allowed to move inside of it. When the band comes onto the field they approach a line that is drawn about ten feet from the outer circle and stop. At this point the competition begins.

For the lower grades, IV and V, they do not march in playing, but begin their set after they have formed a circle. The scoring begins when they start the drum rolls. For grade III, and higher, the drums will start their rolls at the line and the band will play while marching into the circle. Thus, scoring begins

as soon as they start.

This then leads into explaining the roles of the officials involved. The first person one will see is the steward, who ensures that the competitions run smoothly. This done by doing everything from ensuring that the judges have everything they need to making sure the next band to play is ready. Then comes the role of the judges. There are four to five judges now used to judge all official pipe and drum competitions. In the Eastern US they are tested on their knowledge and certified by the Eastern United States Pipe Band Association, or EUSPBA. The EUSPBA is the governing organization that sets the rules and manages the competition circuit in it's area. There will be either two or three piping judges; it is the games discretion. They are graded based on things such as how well the pipers manage to play in unison, clarity of the execution, smoothness of tempo changes, and note changes. In addition they judge on the expression, or how musical it sounded to them. Finally they score on how well the bagpipes were tuned throughout the performance.

One of the two remaining judges is the ensemble judge. This judge scores on the overall sound of the band. This can consist of things such as how well the pipers played with the drummers, and were the pipes and drums tuned in pitch and

volume to blend well. While a majority of people are not aware that you can tune drums, an out of tune drum is very noticeable. Finally, they grade on the quality of the music arrangement itself.

This leads to the final judge, the drumming judge. He judges all the drum corps, which consist of the side, which is often referred to as a snare, tenor, and bass drums. He judges on their technique and sound. Secondly, they are judged on their ability to achieve expression of rhythm and tempo. In general, he grades them based on their quality and variety; after all, nobody likes monotonous tapping!

At the end of the performances it is time to determine who is the winner based on the judges scores. The judges award all bands a placing based on their assessment. Then all the placings from the judges are added together and the lowest overall score wins. If there is a tie it is broken by who received a higher score from the ensemble judge.

Hopefully this has helped to clarify what exactly is going on in that closed circle they call the pipe band competitions. With this insight maybe it will be less confusing and easier to follow what is going on and to see what the judges are looking for. The next time someone in the crowd asks what is the man with the clipboard walking around the circle up to, you can give them an answer and help to take the mystery out of the competition!

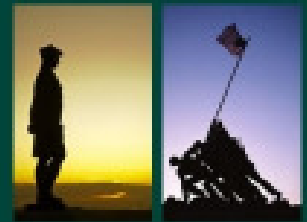

Celebrating Tartan Day 2011

To: America From: Scotland!

Scotland's ties with the United States date back to the founding of the USA. Scots and those of Scottish descent have helped shape the history of America in profound ways. Here are ten things Scotland has given the USA.

1. The US Navy - John Paul Jones (1747 - 1792) is famous in the United States as the 'Father of the American Navy'. A gardener's son from Kirkbean, Kircudbrightshire, Jones went to sea at the age of 13 and went on to become America's first naval hero in the American Revolutionary War.

2. The voice of Mickey Mouse You might be surprised to learn that the world's most famous mouse was voiced for almost 40 years by a Dundonian. Jimmy MacDonald (1906 - 1991), who became a Disney sound effects wizard, was chosen by Walt Disney to provide the voice of his most wellknown creation Mickey Mouse in 1947.

3. National Parks: Dunbar-born John Muir emigrated with his family, aged 11, in 1849 to rural Wisconsin, USA. Muir had



developed an early passion for the natural world, and pursued these interests across the Atlantic where he fell in love with the wilderness. He is credited with starting the national park movement in America - including Yosemite and the Grand Canyon. Muir has been voted 'Most Famous Californian of all Time', appeared on two US postage stamps and has dozens of places named after him. Muir died in Los Angeles on December 24, 1914.

4. At least 33 Presidents: Of the 43 men who have served as President, an astonishing 33 have been of either Scottish or Ulster-Scots descent. This includes George Washington, Theodore Roosevelt,

Woodrow Wilson, Gerald Ford, Ronald Reagan and Bill Clinton. According to genealogists, current president Barack Obama's ancestry can be traced back to William the Lion who ruled Scotland from 1165 to 1214.



5. American icon Uncle Sam: 'Uncle Sam', who is famously depicted on patriotic recruiting posters, is a national icon in the United States. The original 'Uncle Sam' is said to be Sam Wilson, a food business operator in New York, whose parents came from Greenock in Scotland. Wilson supplied meat to the US Army during the 1812 War and it was joked at the time that the 'U.S.' stamped on the crates stood for 'Uncle Sam', in reference to Wilson.

6. Thousands of its place names: Many locations in America were nostalgically named after the places Scottish immigrants had left behind. There are eight Aberdeens, eight Edinburghs, seven Glasgows and eight places simply known as Scotland in the United States today. In addition, many places are named after Scottish clan names with areas named Campbell, Cameron, Crawford and Douglas throughout the USA.

7. The Man on the Moon: Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon, took a scrap of Armstrong tartan with him on his historic space flight of 1969, in tribute to his ancestors from Langholm, now in Dumfries and Galloway. The astronaut was made a freeman of Langholm when he visited in 1972. Armstrong's fellow-moonwalker, Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin, also boasts Scottish antecedents.

8. Buick: Buick is the one of the most famous brand names in the motor industry and is stamped on more than 25 million cars in the USA. The car is named after David Dunbar Buick, a plumber from Arbroath, who emigrated to the USA in 1856 and went on to set up the Buick Motor Company.

9. The Private Eye: Glaswegian Allan Pinkerton founded the world's most well-known detective agency in Chicago in 1850. He became famous when he foiled a plot to assassinate President-Elect Abraham Lincoln. The distinctive Pinkerton agency logo, the All-Seeing Eye, inspired the phrase 'Private Eye'. A major crime-fighting force, the Pinkerton Agency and its methods are thought to have inspired the FBI.

10. Elvis Presley: Elvis Presley's roots can apparently be traced back to a village in Aberdeenshire. The musical icon is descended from Andrew Presley, who emigrated to North Carolina in 1745. Scotland was the location for The King's only visit to the UK, a brief landing at Prestwick Airport in 1960.
