13th Annual Tartan Day on Ellis Island Delights Thousands

NY Tartan Week Opener Celebrated with New Exhibition, Music and Dance

New York, NY - "Tartan Day on Ellis Island" – the nation's largest Tartan Day celebration - returned for its

13th annual observance from March 28-30, opening NY Tartan Week. The highlight of the weekend was "Scots in the American West," a new exhibition, produced by Buffalo Bill Center of the West in Cody, WY.

The exhibi-

tion looked at the lives of Scots and Scottish-American that shaped the American West, enduring a land with unforgiving climate and terrain further challenged by violent clashes between native Americans, feuding families and ruthless outlaws.

The 2014 edition of Clan Currie's popular program enjoyed impressive attendance records with over 20 thousand visitors from around the corner and around the world. In addition to the exhibition, a steady stream of visitors thrilled to the sights and sounds of the NY Celtic

Happy Days are Here Again!



Celtic Music Announced for Rural Hill Scottish Festival & Loch Norman Highland Games


HUNTERSVILLE, NC: The 21st Annual Rural Hill Scottish Festival and Loch Norman Highland Games announced the musician lineup for the festival weekend April 12 & 13, 2014. The Festival's Celtic sounds include Seven Nations (photo), Saor Patrol, and the traditional Celtic sounds of Ed Miller, Jil Chambless, Scooter Muse, John Taylor, and the southern swagger of NC's own Thistledown Tinkers. Performances will be held throughout the weekend including the Saturday Night Concert at the Celtic Rock Stage beginning at 6:30 PM. There will also be massed Pipe Band performances on Saturday and Sunday as well as individual pipers and drummers in sanctioned competition. The story of Seven Nations (photo) is that of a truly original and determined band based in Orlando, Florida. Throw away any preconceived notions you may have about Celtic music...this is a band that has invented its own sound and attracted a prodigious national and international following. With a passionate, tender, and rollicking style that winningly veers from roots and folk to dance and fusion-rock, Seven Nations has earned a growing reputation as an adventurous band with a charismatic stage presence.

From Central Scotland and Fife, the ancient Celtic Kingdom of Scotland, Saor Patrol and their unique sound of Scotland in the 21st century, brings together the sounds of the past into the present. The energy they share with their audience during a performance, with their vibrant pipe tunes and drum rhythms, pleases and excites many a crowd from all walks of life.

William Hunter of Nansemond County and His Early Descendants

A genealogical study of an early American family of Virginia and North Carolina

By the Hunter Family Research Group

In the seventeenth- and eighteenth-century records of Nansemond County, Virginia, William Hunter is documented as an immigrant, a weaver, a militia captain, a judge of the quorum, and a prosperous freeholder. Although evidence of his exact origins has not been proved, he seems to have come out of one of the shires of northern England, likely Northumberland, Durham, or Yorkshire, where the Hunter surname and the profession of weaving were prominent in the sixteenth century and earlier.

In America the Hunters initially were identified as Virginians, but after the refiguring of the state's southern boundary in 1728, their lands lay in North Carolina. Thus the Hunters of Nansemond became North Carolinians of Chowan County. William Hunter's descendants are legion. His children left many heirs, and this book traces them through five or more generations as they migrated to other counties of North Carolina, to South Carolina, to Georgia, and beyond.

Teeming with family names and identifications, this work, researched and compiled by the Hunter Family Research Group, is an essential resource for descendants wishing to know and understand their Hunter ancestry. It features meticulous documentation, citing wills, land records, military records, census records, and family papers. Included also are genealogical trees and an index of names.

The Hunter Family Research Group, headed by Raymond Hunter, is composed of descendants of William Hunter's sons. The group members are: Raymond Hunter, Still Hunter, Rob Hunter, Richard Hunter, Thomas Hunter, Martha Rester, Hunter Cole and Tony Hunter.

Originally from Montgomery, Alabama, Jil Chambless now resides in Tuscaloosa and has played an active role in the Celtic music scene for more than 20 years. As singer and flute and whistle player, Jil has completed many recording projects and performed at Celtic festivals and concerts across the US as well as in Canada, Scotland, and Israel with the band Henri's Notions, guitarist Scooter Muse, Scottish singer Ed Miller, Scottish fiddler John Taylor, the band Vulcan Eejits!, the Vogt Family Contra Band, and others.

Winner of countless banjo competitions throughout the southeast including the Tennessee Valley Championships 8 times, Scooter Muse has played with bluegrass legends, Clair Lynch, Vassar Clements and a host of others as well as handling first call banjo duties for the world famous Muscle Shoals, Alabama recording industry. He founded the Full Moon Ensemble, who achieved national recognition, toured the US and Canada as well as Scotland, and recorded 5 critically acclaimed CDs. After a successful 8 year run, the FME went their separate ways and Scooter was drafted as the guitar player for the longest running Celtic band in the south, Henri's Notions. The Notions have appeared with such great artists as Bob Dylan, Paddy Obrien, Patrick Street, Brian McNeill and countless others.

John Taylor is a fiddler and composer from Buckie in Scotland and a past winner of the Niel Gow award for

Scottish fiddling. Taylor is well known in Scottish country dance circles having appeared in many parts of the world including the USA, Canada, New Zealand and various parts of the UK. He has recorded specific country dance music CDs with Andrew Imbrie and has often appeared with Texas-based folk singer, Ed Miller. In a review of their first collaboration, The Edinburgh Rambler, the Austin American-Statesman called Taylor "brilliant."

Thistledown Tinkers, the powerful music duo featuring Trip Rogers and Tom Eure, are not the fragile, romanticized Celtic music you hear in movie soundtracks, but the kind that makes you sing along and stomp your feet. These seasoned music veterans from NC, weave traditional Scottish and Irish music with original creations while adding a southern swagger that sets the stage on fire. With an impressive arsenal of instruments including guitar, fiddle, mandolin, banjo, dulcimer, and concertina, musicianship is at the core of Thistledown Tinkers. Their stage presence creates a rebel rousing party that not only draws fans in, but makes them feel like a part of the **show**.

The Rural Hill Scottish Festival & Loch Norman Highland Games on April 12 & 13 offer live traditional and Celtic rock music, over 65 Scottish clans and their representatives, genealogy searches, Piping, Drumming, and Highland Dancing sanctioned competitions, Scottish country dancing, massed band performances, professional heavy athletics, and the popular Saturday night Celtic Jam. 



Flowers of the Forest

David Ronald Best, 90, of Greensboro, died Wednesday, March 26, 2014 at Moses Cone Hospital. A memorial service was held Monday, March 31 at Saint Francis Episcopal Church by Rev. Mike Mauldin.

Inurnment will follow the service in the memorial garden as well as a reception in the parish hall.

David was born May 21, 1923 in Cape Town, South Africa. At age 15 ½, he left home to join the British Merchant Marine (BMM) service. During WWII, he saw action doing Atlantic Convoy duty on freighters, tankers, and troop carriers. His ships were torpedoed three times. After 21 years with the BMM, he served on various ocean liners, tankers



and cargo vessels. He served on the Queen Mary for eleven and a half years, including time during WWII.

He travelled the world and had many stories of the places he visited. The only ones he never visited and wanted to see were Hawaii and Tahiti.

He was an accomplished chef and culinary educator. He taught at several culinary schools, including Johnson & Wales University in Providence, RI; Hudson County Community College in Jersey City, New Jersey; and Guilford Technical Community College in Jamestown, NC. 

A real murder mystery, thanks to Alastair

Hi Alastair and Friends,

Many thanks for your interesting e-mail to which I am pleased to respond. Whilst in my 80th year my memory is not 100% accurate, my notes, minutes of meetings and my memory of those dark days are as accurate now as they were twentynine years ago! I have tagged my take on the events of 1985+ on to the end of this short piece about Willies murder.

Willie MacRae was born on May 18th, 1923 – assassinated by British establishment, person or persons

unknown, on April 7th, 1985. He was a Scottish National Politician and a Scots Lawyer, remembered also for the mystery surrounding his death. Willie was an active member of the Scottish National Party and an anti-nuclear dumping campaigner.

He was active outside Scotland too, having served in the Royal Indian Navy and becoming active in the campaign for Independence for India. He was also

the author of the maritime law of Israel and emeritus professor at the University of Haifa. After his death a forest of 3,000 trees was planted in his Honour in Israel to mark his death.

On the fateful day of his untimely death Willie left his Glasgow flat at 18:30 on 5 April 1985, to spend the week at his cottage at Ardelve near Dornie. He was not seen again until the following morning around 10:00, when two Australian tourists saw his Volvo Estate car lying on the moor a short distance from the junction of the A87 and A887 roads, about 30 yds (27 ms) from the roadway, straddling a burn. The tourists flagged down the next car to pass by, which turned out to be driven by a doctor, Dorothy Messer, accompanied by her fiancé as well as David Coutts, a Dundee SNP councillor who knew Willie MacRae very well.

It was discovered that Willie was in the car. He was not wearing a seat belt. Another car was sent to call the emergency services. Dr Messer examined Willie and found that he was still alive and breathing. She noted that one of his pupils was dilated, indicating the possibility of brain damage, and estimated that he had been in that state for 10 hours.

Willie was removed by ambulance to Raigmore Hospital, Inverness, accompanied by Dr Messer. On arrival it was decided to transfer him to Aberdeen Royal Infirmary.

At Aberdeen it was realised that the incident was more than a road accident; six hours after he had been found, a nurse washing his head discovered what ap-

peared to be the entry wound of a gunshot. An X-ray confirmed that Willie McRae had been shot above his right ear and a bullet was detected in his head. His brain was severely damaged and his vital functions very weak.

The following day, on Sunday 7th of April, after consultation with his next of kin, Willie MacRae's life-support machine was switched off. An investigation into Willies death was headed by Chief Superintendent

Andrew Lester of Northern CID.

Despite no weapon having yet been found, Willies car was moved at 12:00 on 7 April. It later transpired that the police had kept no record of the precise location where the car had been found, and the position stated by them was later found to be 1 mile (1.6 km) in error, and was corrected by a witness who had been present at the scene.

A weapon was found the following day, in the burn, over which the car had been discovered, 60 ft (18 m) from the vehicle. It was a Smith and Wesson .45 revolver belonging to Willie MacRae which had been fired twice. No fingerprints were found on the gun, despite MacRae not wearing gloves when he was found.

Although it was ruled at the time by authorities that Willie Mcrae's death was a suicide, the official account has been disputed, some claiming that the distance from Macrae's car at which the gun was found and the lack of fingerprints on it rendered such a verdict, not credible.






From 1892 to 1954, more than 12 million immigrants passed through Ellis Island. Although many Scots arrived during the colonial period of our history – helping to build the new nation - an additional half-million Scots came through Ellis Island. It has been estimated that 40% of Americans today can trace at least one ancestor's entry into the United States through Ellis Island.

Describing the program, noted Scottish journalist and author Roddy Martine reported that of all the Tartan Day events held in the United States, the Ellis Island observance has, "stood out as a beacon of what USA Tartan Day is all about: the emigrant ancestors of ordinary Americans who over three centuries crossed the Atlantic Ocean to create the world's greatest democracy."

Tartan Day on Ellis Island is produced by the Clan Currie Society - one of the preeminent Scottish heritage organizations in the United States. The Clan Currie Society began its successful collaboration with the Ellis Island Immigration Museum in 2002 in the coordination and sponsorship of their first Tartan Day celebration. That year, Clan Currie and the National Museums of Scotland joined forces to host the traveling exhibit, "Home and Away: Highland Departures and Returns."

As part of the celebrations for Tartan Day 2011, the Clan Currie Society commissioned a specially designed Ellis Island Tartan© to mark the 10th Anniversary of Tartan Day on Ellis Island. Each color in the tartan reflects upon the American immigrant experience. The blue represents the ocean that had to be crossed to reach the American shores. The copper-green is the color of the Statue of Liberty. The red depicts the bricks of the Ellis Island buildings where 12 million Americans took their first steps towards freedom. The gold is the golden door that is the United States of America and the dawn of a new life in America.

The report found that many houses were served by merely one water tap in the yard. The basement rooms had little light or ventilation and inspectors found human excrement scattered about the yards and in the passages of houses.

Some 118,0000 people lived in the Dublin tenements and their conditions were comparable with some in Calcutta.

The report acknowledged that the high mortality rate in the Dublin area was a direct result of poor housing. Death from tuberculosis was the highest of any city in the United Kingdom.

The swirling lines of the rivers in northern France had by October given away to a new type of warfare, with lines of opposing trenches stretching from the English Channel to the Swiss border.

Fierce struggles were going on for strong points along this line with the BEF holding onto the Flanders town of Ypres (always known to the troops as "Wipers").

Aircraft, zeppelins and submarines had all played roles in the

fighting to a greater or lesser degree. Paris had been bombed and a German submarine sank three Brutish cruisers. British aircraft had raided the German Zeppelin sheds.

In January, successful treatment of cancer with the use of radium was claimed by doctors at the Middlesex Hospital in London.

From May, higher taxation was announced in the budget. Income Tax, now began at 4 p (modern money) in the £ on £1,000 income.

Leading British and Irish politicians failed in July to agree the future of Ireland at a conference held at Buckingham Palace with King George V in the chair.

He had been criticized for intervening by Irish Nationalists but did so with the government's support. He told the party leaders, "For months we have watched with deep misgivings the course of events in Ireland. Today, the cry of civil war is on the lips of my most responsible and sober minded citizens."

However, his royal plea for "generous compromise"

failed to end the crisis. A Home Rule Bill before Parliament in 1914 suggested allowing countries to vote on staying out of Home Rule for six years, until there had been two British General Elections.

This proved unpopular with the "loyalists" who opposed any exemptions.

In September, the imminent threat to Paris by the Germans was averted. They were stopped at the River Marne and started to retreat. It was however, a close run thing. At one stage, 600 Paris taxis were commandeered to rush troops to the front.

One French general, Ferdinand Foch, under severe

pressure, reported, "My centre is yielding, my right wing is giving way. An excellent situation. I attack tomorrow."

The BEF played a vital part in the battle, crossing the river into a gap between two German armies, threatening to outflank them and forcing them to abandon the battlefield.

British losses were heavy. Posters saying "Lord Kitchener needs you" started to appear,

aimed at recruiting the 500,000 German born citizens under the wide emergency powers of the Defence of the Realm Act.

Emmeline Pankhurst was among fifty-seven women who were arrested on May 22 after clashing with police guarding Buckingham Palace. They were attempting to deliver a petition to the King in support of their campaign for the vote.


Another franchise bill had been defeated earlier in the month as the protests by the suffragettes continued unabated. Some of the year's actions had however alienated their own supporters.

There had been attacks on paintings in the National Gallery and the Royal Academy. Bombs had been hurled at a London church and the pier at Great Yarmouth. There were arson attacks on private houses as well as public buildings.

These tactics were opposed by Emmeline Pethick Lawrence, one of the early leaders of the Women's Social and Political Union which was founded by Mrs. Pankhurst.

Hamish Watt, a Scottish Member of Parliament from 1974 to 1979, has been quoted as saying that Willie MacRae was assassinated for his too-extensive study of NATO activities in Scotland.

· At the time of his death, he had been working to counter plans to dump nuclear waste from Dounreay into the sea and on land at Mulwharcher in South Ayrshire. Due to his house being burgled on repeated occasions prior to his death, he had taken to carrying a briefcase containing copies of documents relating to all of his work. The briefcase was kept with him at all times. However, his briefcase was never found following his death, and all other sole copies kept in his office were stolen when it was burgled, no other items being taken.

In 2005, Fergus Ewing MSP requested a meeting with Elish Angiolini, the Scottish Solicitor General to

discuss allegations that have persisted that Willie MacRae was under Secret Service surveillance at the time of his death. The request was rebuffed, with Angiolini claiming that he had not been under surveillance and that she was satisfied that a thorough investigation into the case had been carried out. However, in July, 2006

a retired police officer, Iain Fraser who was working as a private investigator at the time of Willies death claimed that he had been anonymously employed to keep MacRae under surveillance only weeks before he died.

The death of Willie MacRae received further attention when the events surrounding it formed the basis of a broadcast of the STV show *Unsolved*, originally broadcast in November 2006.

In November 2010 John Finnie, the SNP group leader on Highland Council and a former police officer, wrote to the Lord Advocate urging her to reinvestigate Willie MacRae's death and release any details so far withheld. Finnie's request was prompted by the release the previous month of further details concerning the death of David Kelly. In January 2011 the Crown Office requested the files on the case from Northern Constabulary.

Ends here. Whats here. What follows are my personal recollections of those days.

My recall of the events of those dark days are as clear today as though they had happened yesterday, and, for what I trust, are obvious reasons to the reader.

What has not been properly placed on the public record may be best explained as to the reasons Willie was enroute to spend a weeks business and celebratory pleasure holiday at his cottage in Ardelve, Dornie, the weekend of his murder. Perhaps I may be allowed to explain, for what I hope are obvious reasons. Here is my take on the events leading to the untimely passing of a good friend, fellow PPC for the SNP, colleague and family Lawyer. So here goes. From my recall of those dark days Willie McRae was not in a suicidal mood, far from it.

My one and only daughter was to be married on Friday the 12th of April in St Duthacks Catholic Church in, Dornie, on the shores of Loch Long as it feeds into Loch Alsh.

The reception was arranged to be in the Balmacara Hotel also on the shores of Loch Alsh near Dornie. The wedding was to take place on Friday April 12th 1985 with celebrations going on all week in a traditional

Highland wedding format.

Among the invited guests, Willie McRae would have been there, but for his untimely death.

My daughters wedding was the reason Willie McRae was scheduled to be in his crofters cottage at Ardelve a few minutes drive over the bridge to St Duthacks Church and the Balmacara Hotel, just down the road from the church. And so the scene was set for a great week of celebrations. However, Willie McRae and I were due to have discussions on some issues we regarded as sufficiently important to take some time off from the fun and games of a Highland wedding. I will keep my explanation of these issues as brief as possible. Suffice to say the reader will understand the depth of

importance these issues were and indeed are still so to this day.

Apart from attending my daughters wedding Willie was due to speak at the reception, but more importantly we were due to discuss those issues in which he and I were involved.

Issues under discussion.

Willie was the Lawyer for our Campaign against Dumping Nuclear Waste on Mulwharcher in South Ayrshire of which I was the elected "campaign leader". We persuaded The Local Council not to allow planning per-

mission and we won the argument and stopped Nuclear Dumping taking place.

Some weeks later I was driving towards Glasgow to work, it was a Monday morning, when, just 100 yards north of what was then, the Fenwick slip on/off of the old A77, when my car, a 2.0L Saab, was struck by a high velocity bullet just in front of the rear onside tyre tearing a hole in the wheel arch forcing me off the road. I know this to be

true because the local Road Traffic Police towed me to Pitt Street Police Station in Glasgow. At Pitt Street I and my car were transferred, escorted by Police Forensic Scientists, to a Police low loader and transported to Helen Street Police Garage, where those Police Forensic Scientists examined the car for four hours before reporting to me that in their opinion the damage to my car was caused by a high velocity projectile, probably by a Deer Hunters Sporting Rifle. (Deer hunting in Fenwick?) I asked for a written report but needless to say, to this day, that report never materialised.

The Helen Street Police Garage returned my car at 5PM that day to my place of work, Miller Textiles, Castlemilk. My car had been expertly repaired. I was advised that "there is no need to report this accident to your insurance company".

This issue was also being investigated and pursued by Willie McRae.

However the bombshell Willie had in his briefcase that weekend was this.

He had incontrovertible evidence from a source

within the M.O.D that plans were in place to build an underwater burial casement offshore at Applecross, to store all of the United Kingdoms Nuclear Waste. Willie was beside himself and was due to publicise his findings that weekend.

These and other Scottish Political issues of those days were in his briefcase, never out of his sight, because of a series of unsolved break ins to his office in Buchanan Street in Glasgow. He trusted no one but his closest politically active associates. After his Volvo Estate was recovered from the so called "accident" site,

his brief case was never found.

Here I have to leave the scene of Willie McRae's assassination to say that on that fateful day I telephoned the Police at Kyle of Lochalsh, The Sunday Post and the Herald, giving each my input to the story. I also 'phoned the SNP. I then confirmed my evidence in writing to all those telephone contacts. None of my "witness information" was ever published. I was never interviewed by Police involved in the "investigation". End of story?

As far as the SNP was concerned I was utterly disgusted by their negative attitude and my relationship with the SNP ended. I have been involved in Scotland's National politics since 1948, so my departure was not easy.

To this day I have not heard from any of those institutions mentioned nor were any of my letters to the press ever published nor acknowledged on the matter of Willies death. It was as though my old "D" Notice had been resurrected by the British establishment.
