

## FamilySearch Microfilm Lending Program going away the end of the month

By now, almost everyone in the genealogy community is aware that FamilySearch will discontinue its microfilm distribution services as of Thursday, August 31, 2017. Many researchers are concerned because this change is occurring well before the projected completion date (2020) for digitizing the microfilm collection.

From an economics perspective, the evidence suggests that the decision was long overdue. Why?

- 1. The number of manufacturers of microfilm have dwindled down to no more than a handful, and the materials necessary for production are almost nonexistent.
  - 2. Manufacturing costs have increased.
- 3. The digitization project is well ahead of schedule. FamilySearch has digitized over 1.5 million of the 2.4 million rolls of microfilm.
- 5. The digitization process is expensive but more efficient.
- 6. Digitization enhances the availability of records. Online images are available to anyone with Internet access. As with any change in procedures, there likely will be some inconvenience.
- 1. Some filmed and digitized records came with access restrictions from the providing entity.
- 2. Depending on the nature of the restrictions, some records will only be accessible at Family History Centers and/or the Family History Library.
- 3. If the record is not available in digitized form (for example, if records at a Family History Center are available only to LDS members), researchers may have to contact the specific entity that created the record.

#### Options for researchers include


1. Submitting orders before the August 31st deadline. The cost will be \$7.50 per roll of microfilm and it



will be on permanent loan at the Family History Center or Library Affiliate.

- 2. Family History Centers and Library Affiliates have the option of keeping microfilm now on extended loan as well as any films currently on short-term loan.
- 3. Checking online using Family Search, Ancestry, My Heritage, Find My Past, etc.
- 4. Planning a trip to the Family History Library in Salt Lake City or visiting the nearest Family History Center.
- 5. Contacting the entity that generated the original records.
- 6. In the case of undigitized or Vault Records: Continue searching the website periodically to see if they have been added.
- b. See if the record is available on microfilm at the Family History Library, Family History Centers or Library Affiliates.
- c. If Family Search cannot resolve or negotiate the access restrictions, these records may never be available without going to the Family History Library and/or a Family History Center.






## Clan Ramsay, Int. is now a 501(c)(3) charitable organization

Simmer in Scotland is fell chauncy. Some years it juist disnae happen avaa!



Jean Anne Ferrier Ramsay was born March 3, 1926 in Moorestown, New Jersey and died peacefully of natural causes June 8, 2017.

She was a resident of the Carol Woods Retirement Community in Chapel



Hill since 1992 after relocating from Salisbury, North Carolina where she had lived with her husband, John Erwin Ramsay, since their marriage in 1945.

Anne was predeceased by her husband, and is survived by her children Anne Ramsay Saunders and husband Frank Lyle Saunders of Salisbury; John Erwin Ramsay, Jr., President of the Clan Ramsay, International, and wife Sue Hubbard Ramsay, Kerr Craige Ramsay II and wife Ann Clark Ramsay, George Bard Ferrier Ramsay and wife Anne Edmonds Ramsay, all of Raleigh. She is survived by eight grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.

Anne was best known for her extensive and remarkable involvement in and leadership of numerous service projects.

The citation recognized her as a "gentle but effective agitator" and continued that she had an "indomitable will, true courage, an empathetic nature, and a selfless, tireless, sacrifi-cial, resourceful, inspiring, modest and goal oriented spirit".

The family is indebted to the staff of Carol Woods for their remarkable care. The family received friends and family at 3314 Alamance Drive in Raleigh from 3:00-5:00 PM on Saturday, June 24. A second re-

ception followed at Carol Woods, Building 4, on Sunday, June 25 at 2:00 PM.

He thoroughly enjoyed bagpipe music, attending Scottish festivals, and traveling to foreign countries. He helped develop a church library, shared math skills, and used many new technologies that have benefited the visually impaired.

A graveside service was held on Monday June 26 at the Anderson Indiana Memorial Park Cemetery. Elisabeth Henderson Haas played a Scottish lament on her flute, and a piper played Amazing Grace at the conclusion of the service.





Tributes have been paid in the *Strathspey Herald to* **Norman Grant,** who died in April, aged 73, at his home in Skye of Curr, Inverness-shire.

Norman was one of the key organisers instrumental in making Grantown-on-Spey's Hogmanay Party the huge success that it has become.

He led a successful international career in the field of silver and gold-smithing and jewellery. His work sold in Europe and the United States with pretigious outlets like Liberty and Harrods holding exhibitions of his work.

Many of pieces of his work and silver-smithing were bought by the famous. He made the gold Swan-Vestas matchbox with which the Queen lit her 1977 Silver Jubilee Bonfire.

He returned to the Highlands in 2000.

Part of his community work saw him heavily involved in organizing the Hogmanay celebrations in the Strathspey capital - a role which suited him down to the ground.

As estimated 5000 revellers enjoyed the latest Hogmanay celebrations in Grantown which included ceilidh dancing, spectacular fireworks and dancing in the Square.

His paternal grandfather, Alex Grant, was a sheep farmer at Lyndoer, near Carrbridge, and was a well known fiddler and Mod winner.

They include 6 and 12 string guitars, banjo, mandolin, fiddle, penny whistle, drum, stomp box, and upright bass.

The other three members (Randy, Ken, and Sherrill) have wonderful voices and harmonize quite well. It is such a pleasure playing behind them.

We have a lot of fun performing the 100+ songs from our list of tunes at various Irish pubs and local Irish clubhouses. We have been performing at two local Irish festivals over the past three years. We average about 2 performances a month for the last two years and are building a following of fans.

This summer, we are looking forward to playing at the Long Island Scottish Festival being held on August 26<sup>th</sup> in Old Westbury, NY. It will be our first Scottish Festival. We have around 30 tunes in our book that have Scottish origins that I think will be a lot of fun to play at the festival hosted by Clan MacDuff.

#### The History of Glamis in Scotland

The history of the village of Glamis dates back to the 8th century when it was the home of St. Fergus who lived in a cave that was considered to be a holy place. Records later show that a Royal Hunting Lodge was built at Glamis for the Kings of Scotland who frequented it for hundreds of years.

#### The Lyon family and Glamis

In 1372, the land was granted to Sir John Lyon

(1340) by King Robert II (1371-1390)and eventually became the family seat of the Earls of Strathmore and Kinghorne. The titles given to John Lyon, Laird and Thane of



Glamis, became even more numerous. He and Lady Jean had raised a son, John, who was born at Glamis in 1380.

Life has centered on Glamis for the Lyon family up until the present time.

By 1376, a castle was being built at Glamis, and

in the 15th century, the castle was rebuilt as an L-plan tower house. In 1376, Sir John Lyon married Princess Joanna (or Jean), the widowed daughter of King Robert II. The Lyon family prospered over the centuries. By 1606, the Lyon family was regarded as the wealthiest in Scotland.

And from Wikipedia: Glamis, castle and village are in the council area and historic county of Angus,

eastern Scotland.

The epresent castle, a fine example of Scottish Baronial architecture, dates from the late 17th century, though the site is believed to have been occupied since

the 11th century, when the Scottish monarch Macbeth was thane (ruler) of Glamis.

In 1372 the castle became the seat of the earls of Strathmore. The castle contains fine collections of paintings, tapestries, and weapons.

Glamis Castle was the childhood home of Her

Majesty Queen Elizabeth, The Queen Mother and birthplace of Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret.






