Jason Sweeney of Coatbridge, Scotland wins Alexander McCall Smith composition prize

Jason Sweeney, a music student at Edinburgh Napier University has won the inaugural Alexander McCall Smith Prize for Composition. His new song premiered at the 2013 Pipes of Christmas Concerts in New York City this holiday season sponsored by the Clan Currie Society.

Sweeney is from Coatbridge in Lanarkshire, Scotland. Currently in his 3rd year at Edinburgh Napier University studying for the Bachelor of Music with Honours degree, majoring in Composition, Jason hopes to follow his idols, John Williams and Alan Sylvestre, into the world of film scoring.

Of the piece *Christmas Card from Ettrick Bay*, Jason says, "I was inspired by the landmark "Boat on the Shore" of Ettrick Bay on the Isle of Bute, the skeleton of an old wooden boat that lies buried in the sand. Ettrick Bay is a place that I hold dear in my heart and I have many wonderful memories of childhood holidays with my family."

A two-time recipient of the Monklands' Rotary Club Young Musician of the Year Award, Jason is an accomplished musician on both piano and clarinet and performs regularly with the highly-esteemed Motherwell Symphonic Band.

In 2012, Jason was commissioned by North Lanarkshire Council to compose a Fanfare in honour of the Golden Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth which premiered at a special concert at Motherwell Civic Hall. Later the same year, the region's education department invited Jason to tutor at a workshop which he had attended as a pupil only two years before. The invitation was then repeated in 2013 and has been extended for 2014.


Cats Who Have It Made In The Shade

many friends as we have and love each one in their own individual way. To me, that IS extraordinary.



Words to The Last Post (TAPS)

If any of you have ever been to a military funeral in which *The Last Post (TAPS)* was played; this brings out a new meaning of it.

We have all heard the haunting song, 'The Last Post.' It's the song that gives us the lump in our throats and usually tears in our eyes.

But, do you know the story behind the song? If not, I think you will be interested to find out about its humble beginnings.

Reportedly, it all began in 1862 during the American Civil War, when Union Army Captain Robert Ellicombe was with his men near Harrison's Landing in Virginia. The Confederate Army was on the other side of the narrow strip of land.

During the night, Captain Ellicombe heard the moans of a soldier who lay severely wounded on the field. Not knowing if it was a Union or Confederate soldier, the Captain decided to risk his life and bring the stricken man back for medical attention. Crawling on his stomach through the gunfire, the Captain reached the stricken soldier and began pulling him toward his encampment. When the Captain finally reached his own lines, he discovered it was actually a Confederate soldier, but the soldier was dead.

The Captain lit a lantern and suddenly caught his breath and went numb with shock. In the dim light, he saw the face of the soldier. It was his own son. The boy had been studying music in the South when the war broke out. Without telling his father, the boy enlisted in the Confederate Army.

The following morning, heartbroken, the father asked permission of his superiors to give his son a full military burial, despite his enemy status. His request was only partially granted. The Captain had asked if he could have a group of Army band members play a funeral dirge for his son at the funeral. The request was turned down since the soldier was a Confederate. But, out of respect for the father, they did say they could give him only one musician.

The Captain chose a bugler. He asked the bugler to play a series of musical notes he had found on a piece of paper in the pocket of the dead youth's uniform.

This wish was granted.

Who has not felt the chills while listening to 'The Last Post'? I have never seen all the words to the song until now. I didn't even know there was more than one verse. I also never knew the story behind the song and I didn't know if you had either so I thought I'd pass it along.

I now have an even deeper respect for the song than I did before.

Remember those lost and harmed while serving their country. Also, remember those who have served and returned, and those presently serving in the Armed Forces.

In our January issue, you'll find an article about how the Dutch honor our service men and women who fought for the freedom of their own country.

Many of you may never have heard *TAPS* played in its entirety and with full orchestra. The original version of *TAPS* was called *The Last Post* and was written by Daniel Butterfield in 1801. It is rather lengthy and formal, as you will hear in the clip, so, in 1862, it was shortened to 24 notes and re-named *TAPS*.

You'll hear young Melissa Venema play The Last Post on the trumpet, whereby the original was played on a bugle.



FLOWERS OF THE FOREST

April 20, 1938 - August 18, 2013 The Rev. **John McClure Good** was Chaplain to the Clan MacLeod Society USA for many years, as well as a beloved pastor at Christ Church Cathedral in St. Louis, Missouri.

He is survived by children, grandchildren, and one great grandchild, including his son Ian, who is Clan MacLeod Society's USA's Regional VP for the Missouri Valley and is also CMS USA's webmaster.

Ian shared his feelings with clansfolk at the time of his father's passing. "My dad loved that I celebrated our Scottish Heritage and he loved what Clan MacLeod has done for me. He was a proud and loving father who rejoiced in his faith and the knowledge of the serenity that awaited him."

Murdoch Maclean MacLeod October 18, 1923 September 21, 2013.

Maclean Macleod has had a profound effect on the ability of Clan MacLeod to deliver on its mission promise to support Scottish cultural arts.

He will be missed, but as a wise person who helped establish activities that could sustain themselves, his good work will be with us for a long time.

Maclean was a founding member of the Eastern UnitedStates Pipe

Band Association and the United States Piping Foundation. He acted as its convenor or president for 50 years. He also received many honors internationally for his services to piping.

Personally, he was a talented woodworker, a great storyteller, and a gifted singer.

As friend and collaborator Arthur McAra reminded us, "[He was] always looking for ways to encourage up-andcoming young pipers.

In 1976, Maclean established the MacCrimmon Quaich competition for Grade I Amateur pipers, under the auspices of the Clan MacLeod Society USA, Inc. Today, a MacCrimmon Quaich Competition is held in each of the 13 Clan MacLeod Society regions of the United States."

He was born in Ullapool, north of Dunvegan, and after 33 missions with the Royal Air Force in WWII he pursued a career in forestry in Scotland. In 1956, he and his family emigrated to the United States. He helped found the festivalthat has grown to be the very successful Fairhill Scot-

tish Games, in Fairhill, Delaware.

Bruce served in the 8th Army Air Corps and flew in B-17's over Europe in WWII.

Back home, they started a family which included Brian Allen in 1942, Mark Wayne in 1947 and Bruce Craig in 1949.

Grandchildren and great-grandchildren abound.

Bruce Aaron was an insurance executive for over 30 years.

He and Pauline traveled to Europe, the Caribbean,

Born in Tillsonburg, a daughter of the late Charles and Victoria (nee Ball) Burn, Elizabeth passed away from heart failure at Collingwood General and Marine Hospital on Thursday, August 22, 2013 in her 80th year.

A graduate of the nursing program at Brantford General Hospital and Public Health Nursing at the University of Western Ontario and Health Care Organization, Elizabeth devoted her many managerial and nursing talents to the betterment of health care in Ontario.

She began her career in clinical nursing and in 1962 became the Director of Nursing Service at Brantford General Hospital and in 1971, she was the first Director of the Home Care Program for Brant County District Health Unit. She became the Assistant Executive Director of Ontario Red Cross Hospitals in 1978 and later moved to the Home Care Division of the Ontario Ministry of Health where she served as Senior Consultant and then the Manager of Systems and Project Development. In 1989, she became the Director of the Home Care Program with the Bruce-Grey Owen Sound Health Unit. Her career was punctuated by her many innovations and successes in the delivery of home health care.

Elizabeth retired in 1993 following a debilitating stroke. In retirement, she continued her love of cooking as well as travelling and seeing as much of the world as possible.

A favorite family trip was when Elizabeth, Don, Margot and Carla - with her children, Tori and Alex, all went to Scotland in 2004 for the MacNicol Clan Gathering on Skye. Elizabeth was particularly pleased to be part of the clan and wore her MacNicol tartan sash with great pride. Elizabeth and Don attended many more Clan Gatherings at home in Canada and in Scotland.

She was the beloved wife of Donald Nicolson of Thornbury and will be remembered as the cherished Mom of Carla Nicolson and her husband, Doug Johnston of Thornbury and Margot Nicolson and her husband, Cam Trott of Collingwood. After wedding vows, prayers and blessings, the newly married couple kissed and marched out to the cheers of their gathered friends and family.


A beautiful wedding cake, decorated with Pride of Scotland ribbon, and a groom's cake were enjoyed by all after dinner.



Raasay house reopens, overcoming many setbacks

Including material found at the *BBC*, *Scotsman*, and *Glasgow Herald* websites from the Clan MacLeod Newsletter.

The work to refurbish Raasay House was finally completed and a formal reopening celebration took place on 20 September 2013.

It was well-covered in the press, and attended by Liberal Democratic British MP Rt. Hon Charles Kennedy. Chief John Macleod of the Macleods of Raasay is the patron of the Raasay House Community Company, which owns the building.

Visiting Raasay and Raasay House is expected to be one of the high points of Parliament 2014.

You may recall that the building was the recipient of a number of grants, which allowed the entire building to be modernised and restored to use. Several small businesses, most notably the Raasay Outdoor Centre, operated out of



the building and collectively employed quite a few residents on the island.

Tragically, right before that first restoration project was about to finish, the building was almost completely destroyed by fire in January 2009. Fortunately no one was seriously injured, and the project was well insured. There were further complications when the contractor, Rok, went "into administration" (bankruptcy) in November 2010. RHCC persevered, found another company to work with, Mansell Construction Services Ltd, and was able to get the project finished.

Raasay House is now a multi-function facility, offering accommodation from "lodge" style to luxury, serving meals, and operating a variety of recreational activities - inside and out, on land and on the water. They also support training and business meetings.

The historic exterior of the building was preserved, and behind it you will now find a stunning interior. There are photos and a more detailed description of their services online at http://www.raasay-house.co.uk.

The original mansion was home to the Macleod chiefs of Raasay and was burned to the ground by Hanoverian soldiers in 1746 after the Battle of Culloden. The community had supported Bonnie Prince Charlie, who crossed briefly to Raasay while he was on the run. It was rebuilt in time to receive diarist James Boswell and essayist Samuel Johnson during their celebrated Tour of the Hebrides in 1773.




