Wallace and Bruce rare medieval letters to go on display at Stirling Castle May 3

Two unique manuscripts which give a fascinating insight into how William Wallace and Robert the Bruce took steps to secure the Scottish crown are to go on display together for the first time.

An exhibition titled Wallace, 'Bruce and Scotland's Contested Crown' opens at Stirling Castle on 3 May 2014 and includes a 700-year-old letter from King Philip IV of France to his agents in Rome (below) commanding them to ask Pope Boniface VIII to



support Wallace, and a letter to King Philip IV of France which dates to 1309 and was written by Scottish barons attending the first parliament following

Robert the Bruce's seizure of the throne in 1306.

The Wallace letter (bottom) was written in November 1300 and was discovered in the Tower of London in the 1830s. It is currently on loan to the National Records of Scotland from The National Archives in London. In 2011 a panel of experts concluded that it was likely to have been in Wallace's possession, although how and why remain unclear.

Tim Ellis, Keeper of the Records of Scotland and Chief Executive of the National Records of Scotland, said: 'The death of Alexander III in 1286 triggered a dynastic scramble that came to a head in 1306, when Robert the Bruce seized the Scottish throne.

'This exhibition brings together for the first time two archival treasures connected to William Wallace and Robert the Bruce, and adds to our understanding of this fascinating period of Scottish history.'







Declared "unruly by the Scottish Parliament, many of the Clan emigrated to the Ulster Plantation after 1610.

After William Bell, called "Redcloak" and Chief of the Clan died in 1628, the chiefship became dormant. Without leadership the Bells ceased to exist as a viable clan.

An Internet friend shared this. It makes you feel uplifted to read. It makes you proud. It made me cry.

On Monday, I played the Disney, Lake Buena Vista course. As usual the starters matched me with three other players. After a few holes we began to get to know each other a bit. One fellow was rather young and had his wife riding along in the golf cart with him. I noticed that his golf bag had his name on it and after closer inspection it also said "wounded war veterans".

When I had my first chance to chat with him I asked him about the bag. His response was simply that it was a gift. I then asked if he was wounded and he said yes. When I asked more about his injury, his response was, "I'd rather not talk about it. Sir."

Over a few holes I learned that he had spent the last 15 months in an army rehabilitation hospital in San Antonio Texas. His wife moved there to be with him and he was released from the hospital in September. He was a rather quiet fellow; however, he did say that he wanted to get good at golf. We had a nice round and as we became a bit more familiar I asked him about the brand new set of Ping woods and irons he was playing. Some looked like they had never been hit.

His response was simple. He said that this round was

the first full round he had played with these clubs.

Later in the round he told me the following. As part of the discharge process from the rehabilitation hospital, Ping comes in and provides three days of golf instruction, followed by club fitting. Upon discharge from the hospital, Ping gives each of the discharged veterans, generally about 40 soldiers, a brand new set of custom fitted clubs along with the impressive golf bags.

The fellow I met was named Ben Woods and he looked me in the eye and said that being fitted for those clubs was one of the best things that ever happened to him and he was determined to learn to play golf well enough to deserve the gift Ping had given him. Ben is now out of the service medically discharged just a month ago. He is as fine a young man as you would ever want to meet.



Lockerbie Memorial Cairn at washington's Arlington National Cemetery

It would seem unusual to hear about a memorial cairn here In the United States, but within the Arlington National Cemetery you will find The Lockerbie Memorial Cairn.

The Cairn resembling a castle tower was built by Frank Klein of New Jersey, and some of his crew.

Klein lost his daughter when terrorists detonated a bomb on a Pan Am flight over Lockerbie Scotland.

There were a total of 270 lives lost that day.

The cairn is eight feet at the base, eleven feet in height and made up of 270 bricks to represent each life lost. The sandstone bricks were sent from the Corsehill Quarry approximately 8 miles southeast of Lockerbie. Incidentally, the same quarry supplied the stone for the base of the Statue of Liberty.

The names of all of the victims and the following words are engraved on the base

On 21 December 1988, a terrorist bomb destroyed Pan American Airlines Flight 103 over Lockerbie, Scotland, killing all on board and 11 on the ground.

The 270 Scottish stones which compose this memorial cairn commemorate those who lost their lives in this attack against America.

The unidentified remains of victims from the ill-fated flight are buried underneath the Lockerbie Memorial Cairn.

A bronze plaque beautifully framed in Celtic knotwork on the side of the cairn reads:

The Stone of Destiny ... Lia Fail Or Just a Thought

I think on these things. I suppose that it's because I have nothing else to do (?).

Now that The Stone of Destiny is back in Scotland... at Edinburgh Castle along with Scotland's' Crown Jewels...... it might be time to consider THE stone itself.

According to 'history' (legend?) The Stone was brought into Scotland-proper by the Irish (The original Scots) when they took Dalriada (present day Argyll) from The Picts. Again, according to legend, this stone had been used for ages as a coronation seat for the Irish High Kings to be crowned upon.

It was called "Jacob's Pillow" and was described as being black in color and being inscribed with various Celtic motifs. It was thought to be a meteor, come down from Heaven.

When the Scots and the Picts were brought semitogether under King Kenneth MacAlpin, The Stone was moved to Scone where it was used in the coronation of future Kings of Scots.

When The Wars of Independence occurred, King Edward I of England claimed over-lordship of Scotland and sent some troops to Scone to take away The Stone of Destiny, a symbol of Scottish independence.

I believe, and I'm not alone in this belief, that the monks at Scone were 'tipped-off' that the English were coming and, in haste, quarried a sandstone chunk from the area to pass off as THE Stone.

Geologists have stated that the stone now in Scotland from England.

Edinburgh Castle actually came from the area near or at Scone.

This information does not jibe with the history of an Irish black stone.

The 'present' Stone of Destiny, a sandstone block with a simple cross carved on it, doesn't seem like the icon it has become.

Not to say that this stone doesn't have a history of its own... 'cause it does.

Ever since it was taken by King Eddies' troops, all of the monarchs of Great Britain have been crowned while sitting over this rock. It was also broken in two when Scottish Nationalists 'stole' it from Westminster back in The 50s.

But now, it's back in Scotland, where it belongs. The mystery of whether or not it's the REAL Stone of Destiny or not is one that won't be solved until, as another legend contends, there is a new King of Scots.

Then The Stone will be brought forth and the Scottish Monarch will be crowned upon it. Wadda ya think?

William Wallace sword returned from secret location to Wallace Monument

A treasured sword which belonged to William Wallace has been returned to Stirling's Wallace Monument after being kept at a topsecret location during the restoration of the monument. The 5ft 4 inch sword has been moved from a location shrouded in

secrecy where it was guarded 24 hours a day and has now been reinstalled at the Wallace Monument by renowned **historian and weapons expert David Caldwell**. As the sword is considered to be an irreplaceable national treasure, during the tower's refurbishment, it was kept under guard in an undisclosed location.

Now, it has been installed in its new display case in

the Hall of Heroes gallery, which focuses on the story of Wallace and how he came to be acclaimed as Scotland's first national hero. The broadsword is the centrepiece of the gallery and is displayed on a plinth built with stone originally quarried for the construction of the Monument 150 years ago.

A history of the Wallace Sword

Sir Walter Scott described the Wallace Sword as 'Fit for archangel to wield, yet light in his terrible hand'. The size of the sword, at just over 5 foot 4 inches, suggests that Wallace must have been unusually tall and strong. Estimates put him at about 6 foot 6 inches (about two metres tall.

It is said that after the capture of Wallace, the sword was taken to Dumbarton Castle where it was kept for almost 600 years. Despite protests from the people of Dumbarton, in 1888 the sword was installed in The National Wallace Monument with great pomp and ceremony. In 1912, the case containing the sword was broken by a suffragette called Ethel Moorhead to highlight the struggle to obtain votes for women and it was stolen in 1936 and again in 1972, but on each occasion it was safely recovered and returned.

Commenting on the reinstallation of the sword, Zillah Jamieson, Chair of Stirling District Tourism, emphasised the significance of the event: 'As the sword is of such historic value and has so many remarkable tales woven into it, the utmost care had to be taken to securely safeguard it and deliver it safely back to its home.


'Stirling will be in the spotlight in 2014 and we want to ensure that the reinstallation of the sword pays an appropriate tribute to Scotland's national hero and to the part Wallace played in shaping Scotland.'

The Wallace Monument restoration

The recent refurbishment of the Wallace Monument, which is due to re-open to the public in early April 2014, includes the use of an illusionary technique with mirrors and reflective glass to make characters appear and disappear in the presentation of a new film in which Wallace and Andrew de Moray discuss the Battle of Stirling Bridge, reflecting on Scotland's victory and the country's history.

The battle was a turning point in Scottish history as it marked the start of Scotland's successful campaign for independence, ultimately achieved after the Battle of Bannockburn which is commemorated by its 700th anniversary this year.

Wallace Turnbull Receives National Medal in Haiti

Rev. Wallace Turnbull, a missionary in Haiti since 1946, was inducted by President Michel Martelly into Haiti's National Order of Honor and Merit as a "Commander."

In a ceremony on March 21, 2014, Haiti's president recognized Rev. Turnbull for a lifetime of service to the Haitian people.

The President remarked that Rev. Turnbull has long been a model for foreign and national organizations interested in the development of Haiti.

"We want to tell Pastor Wallace thank you," President Martelly said during his speech. "Because when people like him do the work the state should be doing... You make the state say, if Pastor Wallace is doing this, so must we. You push the state to do more for its people."

Through the work of the Baptist Haiti Mission, founded by the Turnbulls in 1946, approximately 400 churches are currently affiliated with the mission, and nearly 68,000 children are in schools sponsored by these churches. In addition to its ministry of strengthening the church in Haiti, the mission has been a pioneer in rural medical clinics, agricultural support, erosion control, the building of roads, and community construction projects, which have helped many in this needy nation.

"Besides the fact that it has greatly contributed to strengthen the faith of many of our compatriots, he also saved countless lives through health care and medication he has made available to the poorest families needy, not to mention the many jobs he created.

For all this and more, I want to say thank you," declared President Martelly.

"How many children, how many elderly, how many generations have survived because of the work the Pastor has done?" President Martelly said.

"It's not me you should thank, but the Lord," declared Pastor Wallace Turnbull.


"If I die now, I have lived. Haiti made me live," Rev. Turnbull said in his remarks at the ceremony. "I give thanks to the Lord that He has permitted me to do many different things... I thank Him that He has given me to these people to encourage me. You are a good people; you are in my heart."

A letter from Keets Taylor

The summer real estate buying season is upon us and circumstances continue to underline that it's time to sell my properties on Ervin Cook Road.

Although Uncle Dick always said you needed to "set on the porch a while and chat before you got to the business," the business on my heart this spring is that I am offering a For Sale By Owner price of \$165,000. "as is" for our 1,800+ sq. ft. home and 1.05 acre property at 14301 Ervin Cook Road. The offer is good for 22 days. If we reach an agreement, I will pay for a termite inspection, share the report, treat, provide a one year termite warrantee and pay the fees customarily paid by the seller at closing.

While 14301 Ervin Cook Road was built in 1943, after we bought it in 2000, Uncle Dick and I remodeled the floor plan and upgraded the infrastructure. The roof was replaced with 30 year shingles in 2001. The wiring has been brought up to code. The plumbing has been upgraded. The HVAC was new in 2002 and has been serviced regularly by Bradham Brothers. Insulation was added to the ceiling and installed under the floor along with a vapor barrier. The septic tank lid was replaced and a new drain field was installed in 2005. The bathroom and sun porch addition were added in 2006. We remodeled the home to live in not to sell, so sadly, I will leave my mother's beloved Tulikivi stove in the sauna.

William Hunter of Nansemond County and His Early Descendants

A genealogical study of an early American family of Virginia and North Carolina

By the Hunter Family Research Group

In the seventeenth- and eighteenth-century records of Nansemond County, Virginia, William Hunter is documented as an immigrant, a weaver, a militia captain, a judge of the quorum, and a prosperous freeholder. Although evidence of his exact origins has not been proved, he seems to have come out of one of the shires of northern England, likely Northumberland, Durham, or Yorkshire, where the Hunter surname and the profession of weaving were prominent in the sixteenth century and earlier.

In America the Hunters initially were identified as Virginians, but after the refiguring of the state's southern boundary in 1728, their lands lay in North Carolina. Thus the Hunters of Nansemond became North Carolinians of Chowan County. William Hunter's descendants are legion. His children left many heirs, and this book traces them through five or more generations as they migrated to other counties of North Carolina, to South Carolina, to Georgia, and beyond.

Teeming with family names and identifications, this work, researched and compiled by the Hunter Family Research Group, is an essential resource for descendants wishing to know and understand their Hunter ancestry. It features meticulous documentation, citing wills, land records, military records, census records, and family papers. Included also are genealogical trees and an index of names.


