3* Prince Henry Stuart, died 1612. Bust three-quarters left; rev. Armorial shield of the Prince (M.I. 201-29; C.P. 38-1), brooch mounts have been removed from the obverse, otherwise very fine and very rare in gold 1

4* Prince Charles Matriculated at Oxford, 1616; The Prince's Plumes and motto; rev. Rose and inscription (M.I. 219-71), extremely fine and very rare

5* Prince Charles' birth, 1630. Four oval garnished shields; rev. ornamented oval tablet (M.I. 254-36), brilliant and very rare in gold 1

6* Installation of Prince Charles as Knight of the Garter, 1638. Sheep sheltering beneath the tallest tree of a forest; rev. Inscription within the Garter (M.I. 281-88), extremely fine and very rare 1

7* Charles I. Scottish Coronation, 1633, by Briot, crowned bust to left; rev. Thistle and rose tree combined (M.I. 266-60; C.P. 19-2), very fine

8* Charles II. Scottish Coronation at Scone, 1651. Crowned bust to right; rev. Lion rampant holding a thistle (M.I. 394-18; C.P. 21-1), cast and chased as usual, extremely fine and very rare

9* William III. Assassination Plot, 1696. Busts of Louis XIV and James II to right; *rev.* Louis XIV and James II in a netted enclosure, a fleet in the distance (M.I. 151-414; C.P. 56-22), *brilliant and extremely rare* 1

11* Defence of Gibraltar, 1782, by L. Pingo. View of the Rock, and harbour; rev. Names within wreath (C.P. 108-27), in brilliant condition and extremely rare in gold

12 St. Giles Church, Edinburgh, commemorating the restoration and re-opening, 1883. The Church of St. Giles; *rev.* a view of the interior (C.P. 137-11), weight 1.72 ozs., brilliant and rare 1

29* Elizabeth, Countess Palatine, Marriage, 1613. Bust of Elizabeth, nearly full face, long inscription; *rev.* Fame seated in a car drawn by a lion and a unicorn (M.I. 203-35; C.P. 39-1), two plates joined together by a silver band and loop for suspension, *in very fine state, very rare* 1

30 Lady Arabella Stuart, 1615, half-length figure to left, rev. long inscription (M.I. 207-41; C.P. 94-2), cast and chased, and another cast in lead; Frederick and Elizabeth of Bohemia, Coronation, 1619, cast in lead (M.I. 226-85), the first extremely fine, the others fine 3

31* James I Badge. Bust of James I to right; rev. The ark upon the sea STET SALVVS IN VNDIS (M.I. 233-96), cast and chased, very fine and rare

32 Charles I. Marriage, 1625; Coronation, 1626; Tribute to Henrietta Maria, two varieties; Order of the Garter augmented 1629; Birth of Prince Charles, two sizes (M.I. Charles I, 1-10-23-24-33-34-35), chiefly extremely fine 7

43 Arrival of Princess Mary in Holland, 1642, by Sebastian Dadler. Frederick Henry, Prince of Orange, on throne; rev. a palace garden and pleasure ground (M.I. 290-105), a very fine large medal 1

51* Dominion of the Sea, 1665. Small medal by Thomas Simon. Bust to right; rev. the King on naval car, the fleet in the distance (M.I. 506-145), the last work of this great artist, in mint state, very rare 1

52 Duke of Lauderdale, 1672, by John Roettier. Bust to right; rev. Minerva seated leaning upon a shield decorated with the Duke's armorial bearings (M.I. 550-208; C.P. 100-10), extremely fine but discoloured 1

53 James II Coronation, 1685 (M.I. 605-5); Mary of Modena Coronation, 1685 (M.I. 606-7); Opening of the Scottish Parliament, 1685, head to right; *rev.* crowned lion couchant (M.I. 607-10), two specimens pewter (struck), copper (cast), *the first two brilliant, the others very fine* 4

70 Flight of Prince James, 1688. Father Petre mounted on a lobster holding the young Prince, *rev*. Windmill (M.I. 644-72; C.P. 52-10); Abdication of James II, 1688, in white metal (M.I. 646-75); Flight of James II, 1689, bust of Louis XIV, *rev*. the Belgic lion, in lead (M.I. 650-4; C.P. 52-12), *very rare*; Louis XIV receives James II, 1689, bust of Louis XIV, *rev*. 72 William and Mary. Coronation, 1689, probably by Christian Wermuth. The Belgic Lion drives away Father Petre carrying the young Prince playing with his windmill, rev. Suppliants before the throne of Jupiter (M.I. 674-48; C.P. 53-13), unpublished in silver, fine and extremely rare; Mary II, Regent 1690, pattern farthing (M.I. 705-113), very fine; Assassination Plot, 1696, as medal in Lot 9, two specimens, silver and a cast in lead (M.I. 151-414; C.P. 56-22), mostly very fine 4

73 Prince James (the old Pretender), 1697, by Norbert Roettier. Armoured bust to left; rev. a ship distressed (M.I. 192-500; C.P. 57-23), very fine and rare




