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## INTRODUCTION TO REGISTER OF BURGESSES.

THE portion of the Guild and Trade burgess Roll from 1399 to 1631, now printed, comprises the admissions of the various classes of burgesses mentioned in the volumes of the Council Register up to the date when the first of the particular registers devoted to such entries was commenced. During the period of two and a third centuries covered by the list, there are blanks which in the aggregate amount to thirty-three years. The long lost volume in the series of the Council Register, covering the period from 1414 till 1433, accounts for twenty years, while the other blanks are caused by the carelessness of the keepers of the registers for the time being. Their good intentions are generally shown by the blank leaf or leaves occurring immediately before the Michaelmas Election, at the place where the entrants for the year are generally found recorded. The particular years wanting in the Roll are 1401-5, 1413-32, 1434-5, 1518-9, 1557, 1562-4. Other blanks have been filled in from the Guildry Accounts where such existed.

The entries prior to 1591 are contained in lists engrossed in the Council Registers at the close of the minutes for the year ending at Michaelmas, but after that date in addition to the lists which are continued, there is almost always a separate minute of admission under the respective dates. These minutes like the other contents of the earlier registers are written in Latin, and during the whole period of this list the form is continued, long after the regular minutes



were drawn up in English. Curiously enough this custom is continued to the present time, the ticket given on the admission of honorary burgesses being still written in Latin.

In the Roll of Burgesses there are four distinct classes who though all nominally admitted to the freedom of the burgh had very different privileges conferred upon them. The first class, the

#### BURGESSES OF GUILD,

had the fullest privileges of trading, and during the earlier part of the Roll appear as by far the largest body. The earliest charter in the possession of the Corporation, granted by William the Lion (1171-85), confirms to his burgesses of Aberdeen "their free Hanse, to be held where they will and when they will; as freely and peaceably and honourably as their ancestors, in the time of King David, my grandfather, had their Hanse freely and honourably".\* Through a long series of royal grants enlarging and confirming privileges, the burgesses of Aberdeen became possessed of mercantile and trading rights second to those of no other burgh in the kingdom. At a very early date, whether previous to or after the establishment of the municipal government it is now impossible to say, the Merchant Guild was formed, and at the period when the Council Registers begin in 1398, it is found as an institution almost overshadowing the municipal polity. In the *Leges Burgorum* or Laws of the Four Burghs and in the early Statutes, much information can be gleaned regarding the position, privileges, and liberties of the Merchant Guild.

As in the case of most of the other burghs, the term burgess was originally used to denote all classes who had any privileges within the burgh, but afterwards the term seems to have been restricted to the merchant or guild burgesses. This is nowhere more plainly exemplified than in 1581, when con-

tributions are ordered to be made and agreed to by the whole community of *burgesses* for defending the action raised by the *Trades* against the burgesses of Guild.\* The different interpretations put on the comprehensiveness of the term have led to much debate as to the privileges exercised by the different classes of guild burgesses and craftsmen. In the election of the Provost and Magistrates, the whole community assembled in their Head Court had a voice in the proceedings, while the Council was elected wholly from those composing the “*Curia Gildae*”.

In 1469 a law was placed in the statute book by which town councils became self-elective bodies. The reason assigned for this was “Because of gret truble and contensione yeirly for the chesing of the samyn, throu multitud and clamor of commonis sympil personis, It is thoct expedient that nai officiaris na consail be continwit eftir the kingis lawis of burrowis forther than ane yeir; And at the chesing of the new officiaris be in this wise—that Is to say, that the Aulde counsall of the toun sall cheis the new counsall in sic novmyr as accordis to the toun, And the new counsall and the aulde of the yeir befor sall cheis all officiaris pertenyng to the toun, as Alderman, Bailzis, Dene of gild and vtheris officiaris”.† The effect of this act was to confine the government of the burghs, as regards the election of the Council, in the hands of the guild burgesses, who continued to exercise this right till the passing of the Burgh Reform Act of 1833.

In trading privileges as already indicated, the interest of the guild burghess was paramount, and in some burghs such as Aberdeen, early noted as a place of extensive foreign trade,‡ these benefits were not inconsiderable. The pursuit of com-

merce was considered to be a highly honourable calling, and a suitable start in life to younger sons of the county barons was made by entering them as members of the merchant guild of some trading centre such as Aberdeen. There are sufficient indications in the Council Registers that at times it was thought desirable to entirely restrict these privileges to the burgher class.

In 1452 it was proposed that only sons and sons-in-law of burgesses should be admitted to the Guild, and in 1540 it was enacted that no burgesses be admitted for seven years under the sum of £20 unless sons and those marrying the daughters of burgesses. The obligations of guild burgesses were to pay their proportion of the taxations or stents levied by the Town Council—to scot and lot—and to share in the active burghal duties of watching and warding the town. Personal residence and possession of a tenement within the burgh was also absolutely essential.\* Time after time enactments were made against non-residence, and as often do we find parties deprived by the magistrates of their freedom for this reason on the petition of the Dean of Guild.†

Occasionally, licence was granted in special cases for burgesses to leave the burgh temporarily, without losing their freedom: as when in 1540, a burghess was permitted to remain away from the burgh for two years;‡ while ten years later, James Collison for the purpose of travel was allowed three years' absence without incurring the loss of his freedom. The obligation in his case was that he should arrange for some fellow-burghess to be answerable for his share in all taxations and charges. In like manner the obligation of personal residence was dispensed with in the case of Mr. George Abercromby, Commissary of Aberdeen, "as he exercises his office of Com-

missary in Old Aberdeen" (p. 93), and Mr. Alexander Skene,\* advocate, in 1576 was granted a like privilege as his business necessitated his presence in Edinburgh.

The obligations of the guild burgess are given pretty fully in the oath which he took at his admission. In 1611 Stevin Gordon, who had previously been admitted a burgess, gave his great oath on his admission to the Guild "to be leill and trew to his maiestie burghe and friedome of this burghe neuir skaith thair wairis Thair proffeit forsea Leall and well counsell give quhen it is askit Scott lot watche walk and ward with the Inhabitantes thairof ne Lordschip saithseat agains the libertie and preuilege of this burghe That he sall nocht governe unfriemenes guidis nor geir vnder cullor of his awin cheis nor elect na persone to be prouest nor bailleis of this burghe bot burges and burges sones".† This in substance was the oath taken by burgesses of all classes down till 1819; when the Convention of Royal Burghs declared for its abolition.

The dignity and honour of the Guild were zealously guarded by various statutes regulating the conduct of the burgesses in their dealings with one another. The purchasing of lordship by employing some of the county notables to use their influence in furthering a burgess's affairs, was an offence of the greatest moment, and like that of forestalling or regrating—"pre-occupying or bying merchandise before it cum to the mercat"—rendered him liable to lose his freedom. A large proportion of the entries in the earlier volumes of the Council Register is devoted to charges relating to these two offences.

Within the period covered by the present Roll there were at least two regulations made dealing with the dress of the burgesses. In 1576 it was resolved that no burgess after the ensuing feast of

St. Martin should wear a plaid under a penalty of forty shillings, and this order was re-enacted in 1611. The wearing of a "bleu bonatt" was evidently not becoming the dignity of a guild brother, and in 1598 it was prohibited under a penalty of five pounds.

The compositions paid by the guild burgesses varied at different periods, but the following dues paid by these entering the Guild as extraneans show the gradual increase which took place. In 1399, two pounds scots; 1439, five merks; 1492, fifteen merks; 1593, sixty merks; 1625, ninety merks; and in 1629, the composition was fixed at two hundred merks. Besides the money composition it appears to have been customary for the burgess on his admission to bear the expense of an entertainment to the Magistrates and Council, and this was continued down till about 1582-3. In that year, on the 23rd January, the following ordinance was enacted by the Council:—

"The said daye the Counsale for the maist pairt within the Counsale hous being present and convenit ordanit the Gild Wyne of all sic personis that sal happin to be maid frie Burgis of Gild for this Burt in tyme cuming to be convertit in silver, and na drinking of Gild Wyne fra this to be, bot the soume of four poundis to be taken off ilk persone maid Burges of Gild mair or less, as the Deanes of Gild happins to compone and aggrie for according to the facultie and puissance of the persone maid frie Burges of Gild to the sight and discretion of the Deanes of Gild, to be convertit and applyit to the common weill of this burt mending and reforming and repairing of the commoun decayit works thair of, quhair of the Deanes of Gild sal be holdin to gif compt yeirlie, and this act to induir during the Consalis will".\* The amount and destination of the Guild Wine money were shortly afterwards altered, for in 1598 the sum was fixed at ten merks, while in the previous year the Council ordered the fund to be employed in

support of honest decayed burgesses of guild and merchants, that have been of honest behaviour.

A further addition to the composition was made in 1600, when the Guild Box was established. Besides a number of fines or "unlawis" including those incurred by the merchants for "swearing, banning, or tacking the Lordis name in vane," which were to be devoted to the Box, it was also enacted that "Everie persoun admittit frie Burges of Guild of this burght the tyme of his admissioun, shall pay to the said Box sex sh. viiij<sup>d</sup>., and furder as they sal be movit to giff." \*

The total sum payable by an extranean for his admission to the Guild in 1629, would thus have amounted to £11 13s. 10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub><sup>d</sup>. sterling. Every burgess was also supposed to provide himself with such arms as were necessary for carrying out his obligation to watch and ward the burgh in time of peril, and to make a declaration that the weapons produced were his own property. †

The election of the Dean of Guild from 1437 onwards; his jurisdiction and powers as fixed by the Council, and the inauguration and constitution of the Guild Court in 1609, are matters closely connected with the welfare and privileges of the guild burgesses, but space forbids to do more than refer to them here.

The entrants of the second class were admitted as

#### SIMPLE BURGESSES,

or privileged traders who were allowed to exercise their calling of merchants dealing exclusively with Scotch wares. The export and import of foreign goods—English and Flemish—were privileges of too great interest for the simple burgess to share in, and consequently the terms of his admission particularly

restricted him from trading in such goods. By his admission he was "to have libertie be vertew of his burgesschip to tred and handill with Scottis wairis sik as ar maid and growis within the kingdom of Scotland, allanerlie Secluding him hereby to tred and handill with oversea wairis, or to saill to forane cuntries". The admission money was however considerably different, for in 1399, while a burgess of guild paid for his admission two pounds scots, a simple burgess paid only 13s. 4d. scots. The privileges of the latter class do not appear to have conferred any power of voting in the election of the Town Council, or in any way participating in the benefit of any funds belonging to the merchant guild.

The third class of entrants, the

#### BURGESSES OF TRADE,

were strictly confined to the exercise of their particular trade or calling, and had little or no mercantile privileges granted them. The trades which appear first in the Roll are naturally the commoner occupations of smith, flesher, baker, tailor, weaver, saddler, &c. Among some of the less common occupations with the date of their first appearance are pynour (1457); plumber (1476); barber (1477); glazier (1504); glover (1527); quarrier and candlemaker (1532); slater (1542); ferryman (1541); painter (1543); basketmaker and sausagemaker (1571); and gunmaker (1591). As is known, some of these trades as their members increased obtained municipal sanction by seal of cause for the purpose of enabling them to combine for their common profit, and for the prevention of abuses in carrying out their particular occupations.

Previous to the institution of these bodies in a corporate capacity with power to supervise the individuals in the respective trades, each person who was granted the privilege of the freedom of his trade, was directly responsible to the Town Council. Even after the institution of the trades as corporate

bodies, this was the case with many who were admitted to trades which had no incorporation, while it must be remembered that the various incorporated trades were always under the jurisdiction of the Council. Thus in 1604, Gilbert Gormack was made freeman, and liberty given him "to make malt allanerlie and vse no other preuilege," while Thomas Aiken in 1615 was granted "licence and libertie to brew aill and bear during his lyftime". As no one of the then existing incorporation was of a cognate nature to these occupations, these persons came in a special sense immediately under the supervision of the Council.\*

No burgess could exercise two trades at one and the same time, while the authority and sanction of the Town Council was necessary when a burgess wished a change of occupation (p. 157). An incidental statement in 1464 throws some light on the length of apprenticeships served to trades during the fifteenth century. The period—seven years—appears to be about the average time served to the various trades in the early part of the seventeenth century, when the apprentice book was commenced.

The status of a trade burgess, as could be conceived, was much lower than that of the guild brother, and so when the former was received into the Guild, a *sine qua non* of his acceptance was an undertaking to renounce his craft. Alexander Paterson, tailor, on his admission (p. 87) as a guild brother received liberty to continue his calling for a couple of months, on the understanding that after the Feast of Michaelmas he was not to occupy his craft, "with this certificatioun that gif he beis convicit for vsing of his craft, the said feist of Michaelmas being bypast to incur the vnlaw offane hundreth pundis toties quoties". In the case of Thomas Watson, mason (p. 135), he renounces and discharges his craft and all working thereat "with his awin hand in tyme comeing," as not compatible in his person after his

admission as a brother of the Guild. This restriction was not local however, but in terms of a statute passed in 1486\* which provided that no craftsman was to be a merchant unless he truly renounced his craft, the merchandise of those trading without conforming to the act to be escheated.

The few privileges which the craftsmen enjoyed were held entirely of the Town Council, which was composed of members of the merchant guild only. The appointment of deacons to assay and govern the work of each craft, and the regulation of the amount of wages to be paid to craftsmen, were rights exercised by the Council in virtue of public statutes. As regards the municipal government of the burgh it would appear—the Act of 1469 notwithstanding—that the craftsmen always exercised a vote in the election of the Provost and four Baillies. Although possessed of the right to vote in the election of the office-bearers of the Council, the craftsmen do not appear to have been eligible for admission to the governing body.

By an act passed during the minority of Queen Mary, in 1555,† it was provided that no craftsmen were to hold office within burgh except two of the most honest and famous who shall be chosen yearly on the Council, and shall be auditors of the account of the Common Good of the burgh. It would appear, however, that in some cases the statute was not acted on, for in 1581 Dundee put forward a claim of precedence over Perth in respect that the burgh of Dundee was governed by merchants to the exclusion of craftsmen. In Aberdeen, however, the statute of 1555 appears to have been acted upon. The two craftsmen of the old Council and the two of the new Council enabled the trades to have four votes in the election of the Provost and Magistrates, and as part of the outcome of the struggle between

the guild burgesses and craftsmen during the closing decade of the sixteenth century, they obtained in 1596 an additional six votes at the election of the Council's office-bearers.

As was naturally to be expected, differences arose at an early period between the burgesses of the Guild and the craftsmen in regard both to trading rights and to representation in the government of the burgh. About 1565 several of the craftsmen began to exercise certain trading rights which had hitherto been held as the exclusive privilege of the Guild, and in consequence several prosecutions took place, particularly in 1579. Two years later the craftsmen joining with those of Edinburgh, Perth, and Dundee, obtained from James VI. a new charter of privileges, which, while confirming their old liberties, granted an extension of trading rights. In most of the burghs this action of the craftsmen brought them into direct collision with the guild brethren, resulting in Edinburgh in the Decree Arbitral of 1584, and three years later in a similar settlement in Aberdeen. Previous to this, however, the Magistrates and Council had in 1581 extorted a promise from the most prominent of the craftsmen not to exercise the privileges obtained under the charter of James, while the craftsmen in turn the following year declined to proceed with the election of office-bearers until restored to their rights.

Doubtless both parties grew tired of these reprisals, and in 1587 their differences were submitted to arbitration, Commissary Alexander Cheyne acting as oversman, and the Decree Arbitral then pronounced has ever since regulated the dealings of the Town Council with the craftsmen. The diploma granted by the Council to a craftsman on his admission still bears that he is "admitted and received a Free Burgess of the Burgh of Aberdeen of his own craft only, with all the liberties and privileges thereto competent in virtue of the Decreet or Indenture passed between the Brethren of Guild and craftsmen of said Burgh, dated in July, one thousand five hundred and eighty-seven".

The Common Indenture, besides defining the respective liberties of trading of the two classes, fixed the amount of composition to be paid by entering craftsmen. Merchants' and craftsmen's eldest sons were to be admitted free—except the obligation of providing a banquet—other sons for forty shillings: apprentices who had learned their trade within the town, but whose fathers were unfreemen, ten marks, and other classes twenty marks. All these classes had in addition to pay for the cost of a banquet on entering. The composition was divided as follows: two-thirds were given to the Dean of Guild on account of the common charges of the burgh, and the Deacon of the respective crafts was entitled to retain the remaining third along with the payment for the banquet.

The agreement, however, did not produce the harmony and peace which was anticipated, for fresh differences arose through the action of parties on both sides. The cause of the fresh quarrel was the admission of craftsmen by several of the trades without the Council's sanction, and the usurping and arbitrary manner in which the Council conducted the election of Magistrates. Unfortunately, these differences came to such a height that, during the preparation for the election of 1592, "Upon Wedensday before Michaelmass Even it came to blood before the Grey-friers Kirk," and though no great harm was done, it appears to have made both parties pause and consider the danger they ran, for a few days later they held a solemn consultation at the Womanhill—the playfield—where parties were reconciled and the blood "remitted" on both sides.

The obligations and duties of the craftsmen as citizens were identical with those of the guild burghess in regard to personal residence, scot and lot, watch and ward, and as to providing himself with sufficient weapons for offence or defence. This later obligation during the closing years of the Roll appears to have been fully met by presenting some weapon, a musket or pike, to

the town's armoury. The oath taken by both classes was identical so far, there being an addition for craftsmen by which they bound themselves to obey the town's statutes and generally to keep within the bounds and liberties of the Common Indenture.

The true meaning of the later obligation is illustrated in the case of Andrew Moir, baxter, admitted 16th July, 1596, who "gawe his ayth according to the commoun forme and forder that he suld not aspyr nor seik any farder libertie nor privelege".

The last class of burgesses on the Roll is that of those generally denominated

#### HONORARY BURGESSES,

or, more strictly speaking, those who were admitted by the favour of the Council, either from their own eminence, or through the good offices of their friends. It would be a mistake, however, to suppose that all those thus admitted had merely an honorary connection with the burgh, for a great number were entitled to share in the fullest benefits of the guild or of a particular trade, as the case might be, and were bound in consequence to discharge the duties devolving on them as citizens.

To the class of honorary burgesses, strictly so-called, there were no privileges extended, however, and the terms of their admission are occasionally strictly guarded. The great test of full citizenship was the obligation of personal residence, and the duty of sharing in the service of scot, lot, watch, and ward, and wherever relief from these obligations was given, the honour, not the benefits, of citizenship is only conferred. Thus, when Patrick Cheyne of Esslemont (p. 75) was admitted with his friends, it was under the provision and restriction that they should not hold office or possess property within, or belonging to, the burgh. Again, in 1582, when the various members of the Gordon family were made burgesses, it was "as gentilmen nocht to be occupiaris nor handleris wt merchandris," and this

was in distinction to four gentlemen who were admitted the same day, but "quha occupeis wt merchandreis". To several persons admitted, at the request of the Marquis of Huntly, in 1630, the conditions of admission were that the persons, within a year, were to make residence and dwelling within the burgh, and "hald stob and staik fyir and flet within the samen scott lot watche walk and ward with the remanent nicht-boris of the toune with certificatioun gif they failzie in that cais this their burgessesship to be null and to ceas and expyir fra than furth *ipso facto* but any proces or declarator".

Some of the groups of honorary burgesses are interesting, and relate, in some cases, to particular incidents in the history of the burgh. The visits of the Justiciary Courts are generally marked by the creation of several burgesses, and some of the judges, such as Sir James Skene of Curriehill, appear to have been in great favour with the Council, if we are to judge by the number of the persons presented with the freedom, out of favour for him. The close connection and good feeling which existed between the burgh and the Huntly family are attested again and again, but particularly in 1582, when some twenty-five members of the Gordon family, along with a large number of other county gentlemen, were admitted to the rights of citizenship. The Council, between their duty to the Sovereign and the exercise of a neighbourly spirit towards this powerful family, were often placed in a delicate position, and, perhaps, at no time more than during the closing years of the sixteenth century.

The admission of the Gordons, in 1582, had its counterpart twelve years later, when, on the 5th and 10th of February, 1594-5, the Duke of Lennox, the King's Lieutenant and Justice "owir the north partis," with several of the court were created burgesses. Some six months previously, on the 4th October, 1594, the popish principality in the North, headed by Huntly, had been successful at the battle of Glenlivet, rendering



it necessary for the King in person to proceed northwards with a large force to quell the outbreak. This task accomplished, on the withdrawal of the royal army, Lennox was left in Aberdeen as Lieutenant of the North, and in a sense the representative of all that was opposed to the welfare of the family of Gordon. Lennox naturally looked on the citizens as in part participators with the Huntly family, and hence it was necessary for the burgesses to win the favour of the King's Lieutenant by every means in their power. In these endeavours they appear to have been in a measure successful, for we find him accepting of the freedom of the burgh, and what, doubtless, he considered of much more importance, a purse of £204. This was in 1594, but three years later both Huntly and Errol had seen the evil of their ways, and were desirous of being reconciled to the King and Church. It is believed that James was almost as willing to receive them back as they were to come, and terms were arranged by which both Earls should publicly confess their fault in Aberdeen, and have the sentence of excommunication passed upon them removed.

On Saturday, 25th June, 1597, a solemn fast was proclaimed, and on the following day, Sunday, the old church of St. Nicholas witnessed an impressive ceremony of which a full account has been given by an eye witness.\* He says: "On the morne, quhilk wes Sunday, the xxvi. of this instant, the sermoun wes in the ald kirk; the erles are sett in the mairage dask befor the pulpet, with the kingis commissionar; the grytest part of the bodie of the kirke emptee befor the pulpett. Of nobillmen, Baronis, gentilmen, and comoun pepill, sic a confluence, that the lyke wes neuer sein in that kirk, in the bodie quhair of the tabill for the communioun wes sett and coverit. The bishop preichit, and maid a godlie and excellent sermoun. The sermoun being

concludit the erles ryse furth of thair desk, cumis in befor the pulpett, makis ane vppin confessioun of thair defectioun and apostacie, affermis the religioun presentlie confessit to be the onlie trew religioun, renuncis all papistrie, &c., &c.; and of new sweris neuir to declyn again, bot to defend the samen to thair lyfis end. The erle of huntlie confessit his offence first to god, next to his maiestie, to the kirk and cuntrie, for the slaughter of the erle of Murray, and sua the bishop pronuncis oppinlie thair sentence of absolutioun fra the sentence of excommunicatioun. The erles are than receavit be the haille ministerie, being in number xij or xiiij persounis, quha, during all the tyme of the sermoun, sat at the tabill in the middis of the kirk, and with thame the provest, baillies, and the maist part of the consale; and efter the erles war receavit be the ministerie, than patrik murray, commissioner for his maiestie, receavit thame in his hienes name. Nixt the provest, baillies, and consale; and swa thay war receavit to the bosoum of the kirk." The next day the whole town held high holiday, and the central figures in the day's proceedings were the two earls, who "satt at the crose in chears with his maiesties commissioner and the ministerie". After the delivery of the wand of peace and mutual embracing in token of reconciliation with kirk and state, the narrator informs us that there was "Wyn drinkin in abundance, glasses broken; sirfootfeattis cassin abrode on the cassy, gadder quha so plesis". It was after this we learn that an adjournment was made to the tolbooth, where the whole company were admitted burgesses (pp. 90, 91). The Earl of Huntly was thus made a burgess for the second time, he evidently having lost the right conferred upon him in 1582 through his rebellion and subsequent excommunication.

The visit of Laurence Fletcher, the king's comedian, and his admission as a burgess of Aberdeen in 1601 (p. 162), have been the grounds of a discussion as to whether Shakspeare accompanied him

on his journey to the North. The close connection that subsisted between Shakspeare and Fletcher may point to the probability of such an event, but on this point the Roll gives no information. Indeed, the evidence of the Roll is the other way, for a cursory glance at its contents will show that the Magistrates conferred the freedom with a liberality which knew no bounds, and it is almost certain that had our famous playwright been among the company of "Kingis servantis quha playes comedies," his fame was such that he could scarcely have escaped the honour.

After fourteen years absence from his native country, James VI. paid a visit to Scotland in 1617, and the greatest preparations were made wherever it was likely his Majesty would visit. By letter dated 16th January, 1617, the Privy Council informed the Magistrates of the proposed visit of the King to "Munrewmonth for his sport and gayme," and they say "it is lyke aneugh that if the necessitie of his princelie affeiris and adois will not suffer him to come forder northe, that yitt divers of his tryne and followaris, especiallie noblemen and vthers of rank and qualitie, out of thair curiosity to visite the principall pairtis and cheiff burrowis of this kingdome, will tak purpose to come to that toun". The surmise of the Privy Council was not far wrong, for though James himself did not visit the burgh on this occasion, a large number of his retinue did so on the 28th May and were duly created burgesses. Among those honoured on this occasion was Archibald Armstrong, better known as the King's jester.\* It is to be hoped that the strangers found everything to their liking, "good bedding, weele washine and weele smellit naprie," and that they met with no "markis of incivilite nor tackynnis of penurie and

scant." against which the responsible parties had been well warned by the Council in their letter referred to.

The Roll covers only a short part, and that the earlier portion, of the period when George Jameson, the Scottish Vandyke, was labouring in Aberdeen laying the foundation of Scottish art. During this short time, however, it furnishes evidence of the attendance at the artist's studio of more than one distinguished sitter. Of the two portraits at Leslie House of John, 5th Earl of Rothes, one was probably painted on the occasion of the Earl's visit to the burgh in 1623 (p. 134), when the beginning of that friendship was commenced which lasted throughout the painter's lifetime, and his appreciation of which was shown by making the Earl one of his legatees. The entry of William, Lord Alexander, in 1626 was most likely the occasion of Jameson's portrait, which is however said to be dated two years later. But most interesting of all is the visit of the youthful Montrose in 1629 for the purpose of giving the painter sittings. The portrait taken on this occasion was discovered by the late Mr. Mark Napier on the walls of Kinnaird Castle, and represents Montrose at the age of seventeen dressed in his wedding costume. "On the 3rd November, 1629, Montrose rode to Aberdeen from Morphie, the seat of Sir Robert Graham, one of his curators, and there had his portrait painted." On the following day, as we learn from the Roll, he and his party, consisting of his kinsman, John Graham of Orchil, Sir John Colquhoun of Luss, who had married Montrose's niece, his brother Alexander Colquhoun, together with five servants, were all admitted burgesses. There are doubtless many more of the painter's famous sitters to be found in the Roll, but the foregoing are examples of the byeways in which it may be found useful.

The Roll of eminent persons who were admitted as honorary burgesses is a long one, and for this reason space forbids to do more than refer to two whose admission was marked by special



circumstances. On 28th December, 1439, Robert, Earl of Mar, was admitted to the freedom, for payment of five shillings scots to the alderman, in a purse, and through the many changes that have occurred, during the period of four centuries and a half since then, this custom has survived. Every burgess of guild or trade, on his admission, still hands to the Lord Provost "five shillings scots, in a white purse, as use is". The Council minutes throw no light on this curious custom, further than to show that, though the contribution by the Earl is specially marked, the practice was in operation before the date of his admission.

The custom of admitting burgesses by the Town Council during their perambulations of the outer marches of the Freedom is apparently one of ancient standing, and not, as some suppose, of recent origin. On the 16th May, 1603, Robert (afterwards Sir Robert) Keith of Benholm was made a burgess at the Craighead on the occasion of riding the marches of the Freedom, and we can well imagine that the same boisterous ceremony was then gone through, as was performed in the case of the entrant on the last occasion in 1889.

From a strictly local point of view, perhaps, the most interesting entries are those relating to parties who, though admitted *ex gratia*, were, nevertheless, accorded the full privileges of burgesses of guild and trade. There is scarcely a family of note in the county, whose members did not take advantage of their position in favour of the admission of some of their dependants or tenants to the privileges of burgess-ship, while, in some cases, the admission was conferred by the Council, in token of their appreciation of those asking the favour. Thus, on the 10th September, 1596, Stevin Smyth, a servant of Alexander Irvine of Drum, was admitted, "vpon consideratioun, that the said Laird off Drum is and hes stand at all tymes guid freynd and weill welar of this burght"; and, in 1444-5, David Hervy

was received *ex gratia* for the favour the Council bear to Mr. Henry Hervy, Precentor of the Church of Aberdeen”.

In some cases, the amount of influence brought to bear on the Council in favour of particular persons is remarkable. We find James V., in 1538, addressing a special letter of request to the Provost, Baillies, and community, in favour of Henry Drothy's admission as a “freman and burges,” as they “wyll report, o' speciall thanks, and do us ein plesour”; while, in the case of Thomas Spensar (1451-2), the freedom was conferred upon him at the request of the King, Lord Crichton, the Countess of Huntly, her sister Agnes, and Lord Glamis. In many cases, however, the privilege was conferred gratuitously in recompense for services performed in the interests of the burgh. The first medical man whose name appears on the Roll is in 1444-5, when Mr. Walter Pendingist, “medicus,” was admitted *ex gratia*, and, in 1554, William Urquhard, “chirurgion,” received the same privilege “for his gratuitous service to the toun”. The admission of Mr. John Levingston, vicar of Inverugy, in 1454-5, was most probably made, in connection with the submitting of his plans for building a bridge over the Dee at the Craiglug, for the carrying out of which, he agreed with the Council to become master of works, on 2nd December, 1459. The undertaking appears to have been too great for the resources of the community, as there is no reason for supposing that the bridge ever got beyond the plans drawn by the Vicar.

During the same year, 1454-5, there occurs a most interesting entry connected with the admission of Andrew Chapman, dwelling at Loriston. The struggle between the Crown and the powerful house of Douglas had just terminated in the defeat of the latter, and the retirement of the Douglas into England, where it was supposed he had the sympathy, if not the support, of the Yorkists, in his attempt to overthrow the Stuarts. It is at this juncture that we find in the Scottish statute book the details

of an organisation for raising the country to arms, in case of an English invasion. By means of "bales" or beacon-fires lit in such numbers as to indicate the strength of the invading force, and placed in positions "that all may see them," it was hoped that a speedy muster would be made for the defence of the land.\* It is evident that the service for which Chapman received his freedom was connected with the carrying out of this statute, for he was to make a fire at the cairn of Loriston every night up to the Feast of St. Martin, and to keep two watchmen during the day to warn against the English. On the appearance of a Spanish fleet off the coast in 1626, a similar arrangement of bale fires was made for raising the county, had the Spaniards attempted a landing.

Richard Kintore, the provost, in 1472 had his servant admitted a burgess in consideration of his good service to him, while a similar honour was paid to Mr. Alexander Skene in 1559 for his labours and gratuitous services bestowed for the good of the community. On the assumption that a man's good deeds live after him, we find William Gray made a burgess on 21st August, 1611, in respect of his father's good deserving in the discharge of his office of baillie.

The scarcity of ready money is well illustrated by a long series of entries in the Roll, which tell their story plainly enough.

The town-clerk in 1503, Sir John Stirling, received the right to nominate a burgess and collect the dues of his admission in payment of his expenses in a process relating to the lands of Tulloch; and the following year Sir John Black was allowed the same right for his costs made upon the constitution of the Grammar School.

The extraordinary pains taken by David Cargill, Dean of Guild in 1607, for the detection and prosecution of forestallers, and the additional revenue thus accruing to the town's funds was such,

that the Council "to gratifie his said panes," gave him the composition of a burgh of guild whenever he chose to present him.

The expenses incurred occasionally in entertaining distinguished strangers must have been a severe tax on the slender resources of the Common Good funds, and many were the devices resorted to for raising the necessary means to defray the cost of such entertainments.

A large number of noblemen and others, including the Duke of Lennox, paid a visit to the burgh in 1619, and the expenses of their entertainment must have been heavy. The Council on this occasion were fortunate in getting part of their debt cancelled without cost to themselves,\* for among those admitted on the 14th August of that year are the names of William and Walter Moreson, who, as a memorandum in the register informs us, were admitted gratis for the good service done to the town by Barbara Ferguson, relict of umqhile George Moreson, during the time of my lord Duke of Lennox, his grace being within this burgh, and for the "len" of her house and plenishing to that effect.

We have again a number of persons admitted for services performed in connection with the common works of the burgh. John Slynk, in 1406-7, had his freedom for his labours made in the common service; Thomas Yule, for his labour in the common work; and Thomas Reid, on the 7th October, 1533, for his labours in repairing the works of the town, received similar mark of favour. In some cases the nature of these common works is indicated, as in the case of John Mason, admitted in 1437, who was allowed to retain part of his composition for repairing the mill. The ports of the burgh were among the important works devolving on the Council to keep in good repair; and hence we find that, in 1440, David Farcharson grants five merks for repairing the port in the east end of Castle Street;

in 1457-8, John Duncan is admitted for building one of the ports ; while James Johnston, in 1521, grants as his composition a chaldar of lime for the repairing of the ports. Another of the common works of the burgh often referred to is the " Key " or bulwark of the harbour upon which considerable repairs seem to have been executed between 1449 and 1555.

Among the entries relating to the admission of burgesses for special compositions, we may note those of William Cantuli in 1452-3, for two hundred loads of " cause stanys " ; Thomas Gordon, gunmaker, in 1591, for keeping the three " knok " of the burgh, viz. : the Kirk, the Friars, and the Tolbooth for the year bye-gone ; and Malcolm Wedderburn, admitted 15th September, 1587, in consideration " of his pains in buying of three scoir peaces of stains in Dundye to the bow bridge ". In connection with this later entry there is a minute of the Head Court dated 7th October, 1586, to the effect that " The said day the heill toun grantit and consentit voluntarlie to contribut thairto according to thair substance and nominat Alexander Rutherford and David Endiaucht maisters of wark thairto ". The work thus sanctioned appears to have been only partially done, as twenty-three years later the Council entered into a contract with William Jamesone, the painter's father, to build the bridge with " two bows ".

From the known interest which the community took in their parish church, we should naturally expect that some of the entries in the Roll would relate to it. The first of these occurs in 1440, when John Ettale gave as his composition, five hundred roods of ashlar for St. Nicholas church ; and a few years later, David Dun obtained his freedom for the present of one good cord fifty fathoms in length. Within the belfrey of the church there hung for centuries two bells, the older of which was named St. Nicholas, and the other, gifted to the church in 1351, known as Laurance, but in recent times referred to more sympathetically as " Old Lourie ". Andrew Fowler, during the year 1451-2, received his

freedom *ex gratia* for repairing the bell of St. Nicholas church, which entry possibly refers to Laurance, as two years afterwards five pounds of the composition of a burgess was granted for repairing of the bell St. Nicholas of Aberdeen, the smaller of the two, and generally known as the prayer bell. Patrick Faber, a smith to trade evidently, made a set of keys and other things necessary, for which he was admitted freeman of his trade. Reference is made in 1480 to the organs of the church when Gilbert de Garviach was enrolled *ex gratia* in respect of his labours at the organs and in the worship and praise of Almighty God within St. Nicholas church. From the concluding part of the entry, it is evident that Garviach was the organist of the church and that his talent was shared in by other members of his family, as four years after William Garviach, younger, was admitted for his labours at the organs. The completion of the choir of the church is brought to mind by the fourteen shillings which Robert Jofray paid in 1505 for the stalls of the choir, and the various money grants made in 1526. A curious entry occurs under date, 8th April, 1541, when John Naughty was made free of his craft on agreeing to pay for the host for the celebration of the sacrament. For good service in the choir Alexander Wischart received his freedom in 1465, and Andrew Hewat, in 1604, was recompensed in like manner for his services in reading the Word of God in the new church for the past two years.

The payments made to the Abbot and Prior of Bon-Accord, the counterpart of the lords of misrule in England, for their expenses made on the processions and miracle plays, were often in the form of grants from the compositions of burgesses or the right to present a burgess. Richard de Kintore, the Abbot in 1440 presented three burgesses in the exercise of powers conferred upon him, and during the year 1445-6, he received the dues of a burgess for his expenses at the play of "by Haliblude" performed at the Windmill Hill. Similar concessions to the

lords of Bon-Accord will be found in 1536 and 1548. Part of a burgesses' composition was granted during 1449-50 to Walter Balcacole, for writing the play for the festival of Corpus Christi. Whether this was for copying out a stock piece for the use of the players, or for a new adaptation, it is now impossible to ascertain. Closely connected with those plays is the entry under date 8th July, 1559, when ten merks of the composition of Malcolm Moseis was assigned by the Council "to help the making of the playfield". The new playfield at the Well of Spa had for some time previous to this become the favourite spot—in preference to the Windmill Hill—for the performance of the miracle plays, and had evidently at this time been undergoing improvement.

Besides the cases already referred to, as illustrating the right to enter burgesses and to use their compositions for the common affairs of the burgh, there are a few additional cases mentioned in the Roll which are worthy of note. The composition of Thomas Donaldson, admitted on 18th April, 1440, was to the extent of forty shillings given to the "Vnicorn persewant," who was then most probably in town charged with the delivery of some royal letter. In 1444-5, Sir William Ettale received the composition of a burgess in consideration of the repairs he had made on the bridge of Polgovery, while the composition paid by John Cran for his freedom, in 1458-9, was granted by the Council for the repair of the house of the Preaching or Black friars.

Thus far it is evident that the Roll may be found useful in illustrating bye-paths in local history, but it is hoped that the portion of the register now printed may be found more generally of service in the wider field of family history. It is a matter of regret that the earlier entries are not given with the same fulness as characterises the later part of the Roll, but they are in keeping with the contents of the early volumes of the Council Register, which are all more or less of a fragmentary nature.

## NOTE ON NAMES IN REGISTER OF BURGESSES.

Cosmo Innes, in a little work entitled, "Concerning Some Scotch Surnames," says (p. 12): "I wish you would turn back with me to the twelfth or thirteenth century, and fancy yourselves dwelling in a Scotch town in the time of King William the Lion, or his son Alexander II. The place to which you will be pleased to bear me company is a little burgh by the sea-shore, and where a river's mouth gives shelter to a few rude fishing boats, and one or two barks of larger size," &c. He then goes on to ask how the people in his burgh were distinguished from each other by names. That Aberdeen was the burgh he had in view seems most likely. The list of Burgesses here given, beginning in the year 1399, is therefore most interesting, as the earliest list of names of Aberdeen folk known to exist. The date of it is considerably later than that selected by Cosmo Innes. Consequently the changes which were going on in nomenclature in William the Lion's time are now less apparent, and the methods of naming have, so to speak, become crystallised.

If one were to attempt to classify these early Aberdeen names, one would find them grouping themselves somewhat in this fashion :—

1. *Territorial names.* These seem to have been introduced by the Normans, and originally had *de* before them. Of the earlier names, the following seem to belong to this class: Balrain, *i.e.*, Village of Rayne, now Old Rain, Burnet, Kyntor, Moir or

More, *i.e.*, Moor or Muir (Cosmo Innes thinks it is territorial and not the Celtic word = *big*), Inverory, Marr, Borthwick, Lownan (Lunan ?) Leitht (Leith), Buchania (Buchan), Mirden (Myreden), Lambyntan (Lamington ?), Alves, Hervy (?) Petfour, Kent, Mernys, Polgowny (Balgownie ?), Moravia (Murray), Tulach (Tulloch), Cadiou (Cadzow), Liddale, Rettre (Ratray), Vaus (De Vaux), Greenlaw, Ruthirfurd, &c., &c. The "learned" Camden says : " Neither must all having their names from places suppose that their Auncestors were either Lordes or possessors of them ; but may assure themselves that they originally came from them or were borne at them ".

2. *Patronymics*. This was an earlier form, and it is interesting to see it surviving so late as the beginning of the 15th century. To this class belong names like :—John, son of Henry, *i.e.*, John Henryson ; John, son of Thomas, *i.e.*, John Thomson ; John Man, *i.e.*, John, son of Magnus, or John Magnuson (a Norse name). So we find Davidson, Johnson, Andrewson, *i.e.*, Anderson, Alanson, Walteson, Williamson, Howison (Hughson ?), Smythson, Glenyson (son of some one from Glenesk ?), Robertson.

Sometimes names occur like William Andrew, which means William Andrewson, or Anderson. Besides the regular termination, *son*, added to the ordinary name, other forms are found, such as : for Dickson, Dickie, Dickens ; Jones, Jack, Jackson ; Lawson = Laurenceson.

3. *Trades and occupations*. Blyndcele (from *sealing* or covering the eyes of the falcons), Cf. Fowler, Falconer ; Bosser, Cf. Bouchier (Cotgrave's Dict., a butcher), Wodman (Woodman), Cury (Currier ?), Banerman, De Camera (Chambers, Chalmers), Clerk, Sellar, Hukar (Hooker, in harvesting), Walker (= Fuller, Waulk Mills still preserve the name in many parishes), Sutar (Shoemaker, L. *sutor*), Huntar, Webster, Taillor, Scherar, Baxter (Baker), Dyer, Lorymer (Bridle-maker), Littstar (= Dyer),

Cordonar, Masson, Coupar, Skynnar, Flegear (Fletcher = arrow-maker).

4. *Personal qualities.* Strang (Strong), Sprinct (Quick), Slynk (Lean), Yhung, Gray, Broun, Qwite (White), Smale (Small), Sperk (Sparrow-hawk), Gychon (Gudgie, short, thick set), Crusank (Crooked-shanks), Girk (Gurk? same as gudgie), Coky, Leper, Hoggis, Wan, Sleich (=skilful, sly), Og (Celtic, young), Tode (Todd, fox), Red (Reid), Dog (Doak), Pyot, Quhitbrow, Littlejohn, Wisman, Thin, Hardgrip.

5. *Foreigners or Travelled Scots.* Scot (a name the bearer had gained while residing *furth* of Scotland), Aberdene, Inglis (English).

6. *Names from Signs.* Before shops were numbered, they were distinguished by signs. Hence we get names like Bell, Lamb, Oliphant (?) (Elephant), Swan, Herrowne (Heron).

7. *Names from Saints, Apostles, &c.* Michaelis (afterwards Mitchell), Michaelson. Most of the Christian names are of this class, and these became surnames with—*son* added—John, Thomas, Nicholas, Patrick, Andrew, Laurence, Philip.

8. *Certain Norman Names* belonging mostly to the Territorial Class are found disguised. Among these, Menzies (De Maneriis, Eng. Manners), Mowat (De Monte Alto), Vaus (De Vaux, *i.e.*, De Vallibus), Bisset, Bruce, Cumyn, Hay (De La Haye).

9. *Celtic names* are far from numerous. Indeed, the population would seem to have been mainly Teutonic. Macbeth is found. So also Donald, Duncan, Og, Farcharson, Kennedy, Gillespie, Kay, Mcrave (Macrae?), Raa (Rae), Farquhar, Findelayson.

It is interesting to compare the names given in these earlier lists with those found in the Aberdeen Directory for this year of Grace. Some names, once common, have ceased to have representatives. Others of frequent occurrence in these lists are

still amongst our most used surnames. In round numbers, and making allowance for various forms of the same name, the Register of Burgesses, as here printed, contains about 1200 surnames. In the Directory for 1890-91, there are some 1220 different surnames. It is thus possible to institute between the two lists a comparison, not complete, but, in many respects, interesting. Lists are appended of the names most common in the two lists.

It will thus be seen that while great family and territorial names like Gordon, Forbes, Menzies, Irvine, &c., have decreased in number, patronymics like Davidson, Anderson, names of trades like Smith, Milne, Walker, Taylor, have increased.

Among famous names which have become rare or extinct are:—Menzies which shows 116 names, and now only 6 (if 3 Mennies be included). They were a masterful race once, and the decay of the name is very striking. It is said to be of Norman origin, De Maneriis, or in English, Manners, the family name of the Duke of Rutland. The Cheynes, the Burnetts, the Leslie, the Elphinstones, the Irvines, the Hays, the Jaffrays, the Marrs, the Mowats (originally Norman, De Monte Alto), the Rollands, the Rutherfords, the Setons, the Skenes, the Vaus (Norman, De Vallibus, Vaux), all show great decrease, or are extinct.

To this Territorial Class belong names like Blackhall, Cullen (one in Directory), Edyndaich (a place in Keith, Banffshire?), Kintore, Tullideff, which are not now used. The holders of these names must have changed them for others. They could not all have become extinct.

The same fate has overtaken other names like Blyndseil, Fichet, Voket, Shearer, which are apparently not territorial.

Probably, when the occupations which gave these names died out, the names died with them.

The Register shows that, of the patronymics, the favourite name was Anderson. It is third in the Register and fourth in the Directory. Doubtless the Patron Saint of Scotland is the origin of this name. Davidson and Robertson would probably owe their origin to King David (the Sair Saunt), and to King Robert the Bruce. Nicolson (now less common than Nicol), would be derived from the Patron Saint of the City. One once famous patronymic, Collison, has now but one representative, unless a few Collies can claim the title.

One striking fact is the very small number of *Macs* in the Register. Twenty-three in all occur, of which eight are Mackies. This would seem to prove that the ancient Burgh had a Teutonic rather than a Celtic population. Of interesting names in the Register may be noted: Barbour (6), Gladstone, *i.e.*, Gledstones (name of place near Biggar), Howieson, now not found, although Howie is. Donaldson, Mathieson, Williamson, and other patronymics, in the Register, have more names than the father's name, Donald, &c. Elphinstone, Wynton, Wemyss, and Wedderburn have now no representatives; John has had to give way to humbler Jack.

The comparison may be further extended to the Christian names, and here a somewhat different method has been adopted. The burgesses of the 15th and of the 16th century have been taken separately, and for each group the percentage of the commoner Christian names has been calculated: as also for the men's names in the Directory. The results are given in the first three columns of Table V., only those names being included that reach one half per cent. in one at least of the columns. In the fourth column are given the percentages calculated *for the whole of Scotland*, from data supplied in Anderson's "Genealogy and Surnames," p. 149.

Among the more remarkable features of this Table are :—the increase both in Aberdeen and throughout Scotland in the number of names other than the more common ; the decrease of Andrew, Henry, John, Peter, and Thomas, with a corresponding increase of Alexander, Charles, George, and James ; the relative rarity in modern Aberdeen of the Celtic Allan, Donald, Duncan, and Hugh.

The list in Anderson's "Surnames" gives 39 names, the commonest in Scotland. The 15 so uncommon in Aberdeen, as not to claim insertion in the above table, are (in order of frequency), the Celtic names—Angus, Colin, Neil, Malcolm, Roderick, Norman, Kenneth, Dugald, Lachlan, Murdoch, Ronald; the Scriptural names—Samuel, Daniel, Ebenezer; and the Saxon—Edward.

Among the 15th century burgesses, occur the following names, not represented in the 16th or 19th century lists :—Borifius (1), Cristinus (3), Egidius (1), Galfrid (1), Girkyn (1), Gregory (1), Martus (1), Mathairus (1), Rayny (1), Sliscus (1), Valendy (1). In the 16th century appear Berowald (1), Gabriel (1), Jerome (1), Melchior (1), Ninian (1), and Theophilus (1). The names in the Directory, and not in the earlier lists, or in that of Anderson's "Surnames," are :—Aeneas (1), Alfred (12), Basil (2), Benjamin (6), Camille (1), Claude (1), Edgar (1), Edwin (1), Elijah (1), Elishia (*sic*, 1), Ernest (1), Ewen (2), Frederick (6), Gottlieb (1), Hans (1), Hercules (1), Herman (2), Hilkieah (1), Horace (1), Isaac (5), Jonathan (1), Joshua (1), Lauritz (1), Lewis (12), Marcus (1), Max (1), Moses (2), Nicol (2), Oswald (1), Owen (1), Ralph (1), Theodore (2), Timothy (1); besides a great variety of Surnames used as Christian names, such as Burnett, Forbes, Gordon, Keith, Leslie, Stewart, &c.

Not the least striking features of modern nomenclature as seen in, say, a School Catalogue, are (1) the great number of



what may be called fancy Christian Names :—Albert, Douglas, Ernest, Claud, Arthur, Norman, &c., which are rapidly superseding plain John, James, &c. ; and (2) the fact that almost every one has at least three names. The Romans thought that a man with less than three names was a Plebeian, and this feeling would seem to be now-a-days gaining ground. Time was when to have only one name marked a man as of the meaner sort or of bastard breed. Camden tells us that the daughter of a certain great lord refused to marry the bastard son of King Henry the First, answering :

It were to me a great shame

To have a Lord withouten his twa name.

“Whereupon the King gave his son the name of Fitz-Roy, who after was Earle of Glocester, and the onely worthy of his age in England.”

## INTRODUCTION TO INVENTORIES OF ECCLESIASTICAL RECORDS.

At a meeting of the Acting Committee of the New Spalding Club, held on 12th January, 1887, the following deliverance of the Committee on Ecclesiastical and Educational Records was read and adopted :—

“With regard to Ecclesiastical Records generally, your Committee propose as a preliminary course to send out a series of Queries, addressed to Synod, Presbytery, and Session Clerks, Parish Clergymen, Town-Clerks, and others resident within the five Counties which form the more immediate field of the Club's operations, asking for information as to the Records in their possession, the dates of the commencement of these Records, the nature of their contents, references to Educational and Social Questions, &c. Your Committee request that you will grant them authority to incur the necessary expenses.”

Accordingly, a circular respectfully requesting answers to the following queries was sent out :—

1. What is the name of the Synod, Presbytery, Session, or Congregation to which your replies refer ?
2. How many Volumes of Ecclesiastical Records are in your possession ?
3. What are the dates of the commencement and termination of each of these volumes ?
4. What are the dates between which entries have been omitted, or made with irregularity ?

5. The Committee will be obliged by your mentioning anything in the Contents of the Volumes in your possession which seems to you interesting, and suitable for the purposes of the Committee.

6. Are there any other documents of the nature indicated in your possession, or are you aware of the existence of any documents in your neighbourhood, which are non-official, and may contain material suitable for the purposes of the Committee?

Circulars were sent also to the Episcopal Incumbents within the same district, and replies were promptly received from most of these; but the materials in their hands were meagre, and only of recent date.

The Committee were disappointed at not receiving answers from so large a number of the persons addressed as they expected. They found, moreover, that it was hopeless, with the means at their disposal, to expect answers to query number five. Probably, in no way, except by the personal inspection of a single expert, could a satisfactory synopsis be obtained of the contents of the Records. The Committee were, therefore, compelled to confine their inquiries to statistical matter, and to give what may be called Inventories of the Church Records of the district.

On comparing the returns received with the notices of Session and other Records incidentally given in Turnbull's *Memoranda of the State of the Parochial Registers of Scotland*, 1846, and in the *Detailed List of the Old Parochial Registers of Scotland*, 1872, they were surprised to find many and serious discrepancies. The fact that, by the Registration Acts, all Session Records which contained entries of Births, Marriages, and Deaths were transferred to Her Majesty's Register House, Edinburgh, explains partly how the Returns received by the Committee differed from any account of the Records given before that Act came into force.

In the volume issued by the Register House officials, giving details as to the Records in their possession, it was shown that many Ecclesiastical Minutes were in the Register House mixed up with Lists of Births, Marriages, and Deaths. The writer of this introductory note, together with Mr. W. Cramond and the Secretary of the Club, spent some days in looking over these Records. They found that, in order to make the Returns complete, it would be necessary to examine every Church Record connected with their District in the Register House, for the official account had, in many cases, overlooked Session Minutes, which were mixed up with Births, &c., while professing to distinguish such mixed Records in all cases. A highly qualified Searcher was found, and the books were thoroughly examined, one by one. It may be claimed for the Inventories now issued by the New Spalding Club that they will bring to the view of many that would probably never otherwise have learned the fact, what volumes of veritable parochial records are deposited with the Registrar General.

Access was also kindly given by Mr. Nenion Elliot, S.S.C., to the Returns obtained by him from the various parishes, in accordance with a motion passed in the General Assembly of 1888. The Reports which were based on these Returns, and which appeared in the General Assembly volumes for 1889 and 1890, are almost as meagre as the Table of Contents prefixed to this volume—and moreover bristle with inaccuracies.\*

The forty-third General Assembly, which met in Glasgow in April, 1581, adopting the scheme of ecclesiastical government laid down in the Second Book of Discipline, provided for the reduction of the then existing Kirks to six hundred, the division of these into fifty Presbyteries, and the grouping of the Presbyteries into Provincial Synods. The old dioceses of Moray,

This division is identical with that now followed, save that in 1773 portions were disjoined from the Presbyteries of Inverness and Elgin and erected into the Presbytery of Nairn (*infra*, p. 283).

After the Revolution, however, when the ministers in each Synod were few in number, they were temporarily combined into a "United Presbytery".† Thus there are blanks in the Records of the Presbyteries of Strathbogie, Aberlour, Abernethy, Elgin, Forbes, and Inverness (pp. 246, 256, 262, 268, 278, 288), corresponding in date to the "Book of the United Presbyteries of Murray," now unfortunately lost (p. 256, footnote). In 1702 we find three Presbyteries—Strathbogie; Aberlour, Abernethy, and Elgin; Forbes and Inverness. In 1707 Elgin reacquired its independent position; while in 1708 and 1709 Forbes and Aberlour were disjoined from Inverness and Abernethy respectively.

The ministers within the Synod of Aberdeen were united in 1694 into one Presbytery (Records extant 1694-5, p. 165), which in 1697 was subdivided into three—Aberdeen and Kincardine; Garioch, Ellon, and Deer; Alford, Turriff, and Fordyce. Not later than 1708, after several temporary disjunctions and recombinations, the independent Records of the eight Presbyteries are resumed (pp. 165, 183, 193, 203, 213, 220, 230, 238).

For the conjoined Synod of Angus and Mearns no minutes are extant of earlier date than 1701, when it seems to have comprised three Presbyteries : Fordun (or Mearns) ; Brechin and Aberbrothock ; Forfar, Meigle and Dundee (p. 295). From 1698 to 1700 Fordun had been united to Brechin and Arbroath (p. 306). The separate records of Meigle, Arbroath and Forfar recommence in 1703, 1704 and 1717 respectively (pp. 335, 317, 325).

It is much to be regretted that in so many cases the earlier records of Synods, of Presbyteries, and, especially, of Kirk Sessions, have been irrecoverably lost—too often, it is to be feared, from lack of interest, on the part of their custodians, in anything pertaining to the past. The only sixteenth century records that the Committee have been able to trace are :—

Kirk Session of St. Nicholas, Aberdeen, from 1562.

„ „ Monifieth, from 1562.

„ „ New Machar, from 1571.

„ „ Elgin, from 1584.

Presbytery of Ellon, from 1597.

Kirk Session of Tealing, from 1599.

Of the 268 series that are inventoried in this volume, not one half go further back than 1700, while in a few cases the records begin within the present century.

What is now given will prove, it is hoped, the fullest and most accurate account of the Ecclesiastical Records of the N. E. of Scotland hitherto published. The initial and final dates of every volume are given, thus fixing, as at the date of these Inventories, the existence of the volume, and making it a simple matter at any future period to perceive if any, and what, volumes go astray, and thus possibly leading to their recovery.

The importance of such Inventories as are here given is shown by the following decision (Act viii.) of the General Assembly, 2nd June, 1890:—

“Whereas no strict rules have been laid down by the Church for the preservation of Session Records and relative documents: and whereas many of these papers, of much historical as well as ecclesiastical value, are liable to go amissing without the possibility of their being traced: the General Assembly hereby directs and enjoins all Presbyteries to see that the Kirk Sessions within their respective bounds cause Inventories of all records and documents to be made out, compared with the actual documents by a Committee of at least two out of each Session, and, when found correct, to be engrossed in the Session Records; and that this be repeated whenever a new Session Clerk is appointed in a parish, and that no Presbytery be at liberty to attest Session Records without this rule being strictly complied with”.

This overture was moved in the Presbytery of Aberdeen by Mr. John A. Henderson, who has taken a great interest in the local Church Records, and has given valuable assistance in preparing the present series of Inventories, revising all the proof sheets. Amongst other gentlemen who have given aid are:—Mr. W. Cramond, Cullen, whose name is a guarantee for accurate work; Rev. John Brown, Bervie; Mr. A. C. Cameron, LL.D., Fettercairn; Mr. James Davidson, Kirriemuir; Rev. Alex. Fridge, Lunan; Rev. J. Gammack, LL.D., late of Aberdeen; Rev. W. Gregor, LL.D., Pitsligo; Mr. A. Hutcheson, Dundee; Mr. J. G. Low, Montrose; Mr. John Mair, Ellon; and Sheriff Rampini, Elgin.

By far the heaviest part of the work, however, that of collating, reducing to a uniform plan, and arranging for the press, the heterogeneous and too often slipshod returns received from

ministers, session clerks, and others, has been done by Mr. Anderson, the Secretary of the Club.

The Assembly likewise hereby enjoin and ordain Presbyteries to record the time of the deaths of ministers as the same shall happen, with the names of their respective widows, and also the dates of the marriages or deaths of ministers' widows residing at the time of their death or marriage within their bounds, as also the dates of the several vacancies that were vacant the 25th of March last, or which have since happened, or shall happen hereafter within their bounds, with the causes of the vacancies."

From the earliest entry in the *Separate Register* of the Presbytery of Aberdeen it appears "that, as the robbers who had robbed Mr. Robert Melvill's house had then destroyed their *Separate Register* and all the papers relating thereto, it would be necessary to get another, and therefore [the presbytery] appoint another to be got ready and filled up as exactly and as soon as may be, and appoint their several members to give the Clerk an account of the state of their families, conform to the Act of the General Assembly".

- II. Elgin, Aberlour, and Abernethie, embracing *eight* Parishes.

In 1707 (October 30th) the Synod disjoined the united Presbyteries of Elgin, Aberlour, and Abernethie, and appointed them to erect themselves into two distinct Presbyteries, viz. :—

- II. Aberlour and Abernethie, embracing *five* parishes.

—the latter united Presbyteries with correspondents from neighbouring Presbyteries—which arrangement continued till 27th October, 1709. During this latter period the Records of the Presbytery of Aberlour were, of course, combined with those of the Presbytery of Abernethy, which also appear to have gone amissing, the earliest extant volume bearing date commencing 1722.

† On 27th October, 1709, the Synod disjoined the United Presbyteries of Aberlour and Abernethy, and erected them into two distinct Presbyteries, the former embracing *three* parishes—Dundurcas, Inveraven, and Aberlour—with correspondents, *ut supra*; the latter *four* parishes—Cromdale, Kingussie, Laggan, and Abernethy. October, 1718, the Presbytery of Aberlour was *dissolved* by an Act or Sentence of the Synod, its different parishes being united to the Presbyteries of Strathbogie, Elgin, and Abernethy, to which they severally most nearly adjoined—viz., to Strathbogie, Aberlour, and Boharm; to Elgin, Rothes, and Dundurcas; to Abernethy, Inveraven, Knockando, and Glenlivet.

In May, 1719, the sentence of the Synod was disapproved by the Assembly, and the Presbytery of Aberlour was re-erected; but it was again dissolved by Act of following Assembly or its Commission, the parishes being again annexed *ut supra*. There is thenceforth no separate Record of Minutes of the Presbytery of Aberlour, till, on 18th May, 1827, it was finally re-erected by the Assembly into a separate Presbytery, the parish of Kirkmichael being transferred to the Presbytery of Abernethy, while the ordained Assistant at Glenlivet was continued a member of the Presbytery of Aberlour.

## RULES.

*(As amended, 30th October, 1890.)*

1. The objects of the Club shall be to promote the study of the History, Topography, and Archæology of the North-Eastern Counties of Scotland, and to print works illustrative thereof.
2. The Club shall consist of five hundred members, subscribers of one guinea annually: each subscription to be paid on or before the first day of January in each year.
3. The general management of the affairs of the Club shall be vested in a Council, consisting of a President, at least ten Vice-Presidents, and not fewer than forty ordinary members, including a Secretary and a Treasurer: all to be chosen yearly at a General Meeting of the Club, to be held at Aberdeen, in the Month of October, or at such other time within each year as may be found convenient. At all Meetings of the Council seven members shall form a quorum.
4. Immediately after the Annual General Meeting the Council shall elect Acting Committees to carry on the work of the Club.
5. The accounts of the Club shall be audited annually by two Auditors, to be chosen at the Annual Meeting from among the members.
6. The name of any member in arrear with his annual subscription on the first day of October in each year may be removed from the list of members.
7. Vacancies in the membership shall be filled up according to priority of application.
8. Members may, at any time, compound for all future annual subscriptions, by payment of ten guineas over and above the

subscription for the current year; and it shall be in the power of the Council to exempt from subscriptions, annual or other, any member who may present to the Club a work, the printing of which, as a Club publication, has been sanctioned by the Council.

9. Every member not in arrear with his annual subscription shall, from the date of his becoming a member, receive one copy of every volume printed thereafter by the Club; and the editor of each work shall receive five additional copies of the same.
10. The number of copies printed in each case shall not exceed five hundred and twenty-five, and no copy of any work printed by the Club shall be offered by it for sale.
11. The Club shall undertake the issue of its books without the intervention of publishers or booksellers.
12. A General Meeting of the Club may be called at any time on presentation to the Secretary of a requisition signed by twenty members; and the above rules may be altered at any General Meeting, provided that the members have received from the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice of the proposed change.

## FOURTH REPORT BY THE COUNCIL.

*Approved at the Fourth Annual General Meeting of the Club on  
Thursday, 30th October, 1890.*

It is the pleasing duty of the Council to renew their assurances of the general prosperity of the Club. Both the membership and the finances are in a highly satisfactory condition ; the applications for admission being in excess of the vacancies due to deaths or other causes, and only four subscriptions being in arrear.

During the past year nine members of the Club have died : —Mr. T. J. Bremner of Glasslaw ; the Rev. William Burgess, Ardallie ; Mr. George Burnett, Lyon King of Arms ; Mr. Charles Carmichael, Johannesburg ; Mr. R. F. Ogilvie Farquharson of Haughton ; Mr. William Green, Aberdeen ; Colonel W. Ross King of Tertowie ; Mr. William M'Combie of Easter Skene ; Mr. J. J. Reid, Queen's and Lord Treasurer's Remembrancer.

Through the death of the Lyon, the Club has lost another of its editors. Shortly after the formation of the Society, the Editorial Committee suggested to Mr. Burnett that a history of the ancient baronial family of Burnett of Leys and its branches would prove generally acceptable to members of the Club. The suggestion was readily adopted, and extensive transcripts were made, under Mr. Burnett's supervision, of papers from the Charter Room at Crathes. These papers and all Mr. Burnett's manuscripts relative thereto are at present in the hands of the



Secretary. The history of the main line of the family has been written with considerable detail; and, although it is much to be regretted that the work cannot now receive the finish which the learning and accuracy of the Lyon could have imparted, it is hoped that the work will be completed by a relative, and in due course issued to members.

Colonel Ross King of Tertowie took, from the outset, an active interest in the affairs of the Club. He was a member of the Council, and of its Committee on Archæology; latterly, also of the Editorial Committee. Great regret is felt at the loss of his services.

Mr. Farquharson of Haughton was a member of Council.

Mr. Carmichael was a most promising young archæologist, whose early death is much mourned.

Mr. Bremner of Glasslaw and Mr. M'Combie of Easter Skene were among the number of those who, in 1839, "resolved themselves into a Society to be called the Spalding Club". It is believed that of the original members of that Society only eleven now survive, all of them members of the New Spalding Club.

The Club's issue for the current year comprises two volumes :—

I. SELECTIONS FROM WODROW'S BIOGRAPHICAL COLLECTIONS: Lives of Divines of the North East of Scotland. Edited by the Reverend Robert Lippe. With two photo-gravures from portraits in the possession of the University of Aberdeen. (Pp. lxxxviii. + 360, with pp. 12 of Club Reports.)

This volume is now in the hands of members.

II. THE MISCELLANY OF THE NEW SPALDING CLUB. Vol. I.: including the Roll of Guild Burgesses of Aberdeen for the period, 1399-1631, upwards of 5000 entries extracted by Mr. A. M. Munro from the first fifty-eight volumes of the Town

Council Register; and Inventories of the extant ecclesiastical records (Synod, Presbytery and Kirk Session) in the North-East of Scotland, compiled by the Church Records Committee of the Council.

The printing of this volume (which will also contain a list of the members of the Club, revised to date) is almost completed, and it will be issued with as little delay as possible. It had been originally intended that this volume should also contain Inventories of the Municipal and Judicial Records of the North of Scotland, from Dundee to Kirkwall, compiled by the Burgh Records Committee of the Council; but the extent of these has necessitated their postponement to the second volume of the Miscellany.

The Editorial Committee of the Club have approved of the printing and distribution, during 1891, of two books.

I. THE CHARTULARY OF THE CHURCH OF SAINT NICHOLAS. Edited by the Rev. James Cooper, M.A. Vol. II.: including an abstract in English of all the deeds printed in the first volume which was issued in 1888; together with a series of Appendices, comprising:—

1. Deeds illustrative of the history of the Church of St. Nicholas from the archives of the Burgh and of the University: 1487- .
2. Extracts from the Town Council Register illustrative of the same: 1410- .
3. Extracts from the Kirk and Bridge Work Accounts: 1571- .
4. The substance of Mr. James Logan's MS. Notes on the Church—preserved in the Library of the Society of Advocates, with the illustrations reproduced in colour.
5. Notes on the special Masses.

Prefixed will be an Introductory Historical Account of the

Church by the Editor. In the preparation of the first three Appendices Mr. Cooper will have the valuable assistance of Mr. A. M. Munro of the City Chamberlain's Office.

II. THE BOOK OF BANFF. By William Cramond, M.A. To comprise a History of the Burgh from the earliest recorded times to the present day, as compiled from a careful perusal of the whole of the Records of the Burgh, as well as of every other source of information known to exist.

The Council are glad to be able to intimate several desirable additions to the future programme of the Society.

I. In their last report it was intimated that "difficulty has been experienced in connection with the projected History of the Gordons. The family papers of the Marquis of Huntly have been freely placed at the disposal of the Club, but as yet no Editor has been found bold enough to venture on so wide a field". It is with much satisfaction that the Council now find themselves in a position to announce that this difficulty has been so far in the meantime removed through the consent of the noble Marquis to undertake the editing of a volume of ABOYNE PAPERS: 1428- . The Club may, therefore, look forward to an important contribution to the History of the Gordons from the pen of the nobleman who bears the Title longest associated with the name.

II. From the manuscript collections (in 15 volumes) of Dr. David Skene, presented to the University Library by the late Mr. Thomson of Banchory, "it appears that Skene pursued the study of nature to an extent, and with an accuracy previously unknown in Scotland; and from letters addressed to him by some of the most eminent men of the time, it is evident that his merits were thoroughly recognised by his contemporaries". The Editorial Committee have approved of the suggestion that a HISTORY OF THE PROGRESS OF NATURAL SCIENCE IN THE

NORTH OF SCOTLAND, based upon the Skene MSS., should be edited for the Club; and the work has been undertaken by Dr. J. W. H. Trail, Professor of Botany in the University.

III. It will be recollected that at the Inaugural Meeting of the Club, in 1886, one of the issues mentioned as contemplated was "Selections from the Writings of Arthur Johnston, illustrative of Northern History and Antiquities": to be edited by Principal Geddes. The Editorial Committee have cordially sanctioned the addition to their programme of such a volume—to form part of a *MUSA LATINA ABERDONENSIS*, including such *poetae minores* as Wedderburn, the Leeches, Dr. William Johnston, and Dr. Patrick Dun—the whole to be accompanied by an *interpretatio*, biographical sketches, and critical and illustrative notes.

The other works, promised in previous reports, are making satisfactory progress. For the second volume of the "Fasti" of Marischal College, now in preparation, Dr. Francis Edmond has caused to be reproduced in fac-simile, at his own expense, Mr. Dingwall Fordyce's painting of the Heraldic Ceiling in old Marischal College; and a charter of 1656, showing the King's and Marischal Colleges acting in concert as component parts of the Caroline University. The Council wish gratefully to acknowledge this presentation by Dr. Edmond.

The Family History Committee have accumulated a considerable mass of material, connected chiefly with the period of the Rebellions (1688-1746). This as yet awaits an editor.

In last year's Report allusion was made to an effort by the Archæological Committee to aid in carrying out the provisions of the Act for the better Protection of Ancient Monuments. It is to be regretted that the Committee have not met, at the hands of the custodians of local antiquities, with the measure of support that might have been anticipated. One negotiation,

however, has been carried to a successful issue. Two fine examples of sculptured stones have served for some time as part of the dyke enclosing the old churchyard of Dyce. These stones having, with the sanction of the heritors of the parish, their legal custodians, been scheduled under the tenth section of the Act, the Committee (with the approval of General Pitt Rivers, Inspector of Ancient Monuments), obtained estimates of the cost of having them placed under the arch of the western door of the ruined church in the centre of the graveyard. The Committee further recommended the outlay by the Club of the moderate sum required for the alteration, which, it is hoped, will serve to protect the stones from the effects of weather. General Pitt Rivers has presented to the Club a beautiful reduced model of the larger stone executed by his private archæological staff, and inscribed: "The first ancient monument in Great Britain placed under the Ancient Monuments Act and protected through the agency of a local Committee".

With reference to the desirability of issuing a supplementary volume of illustrations of "Sculptured Stones," it may be noted that Mr. J. Romilly Allen is at present engaged, on behalf of the Society of Antiquaries of Scotland, in preparing an exhaustive Catalogue of Sculptured Stones throughout Scotland, older than 1100 A.D. Mr. Allen suggests the possibility of the New Spalding Club co-operating with the Society of Antiquaries in illustrating the stones of the North-Eastern Counties. The matter is referred to the Editorial Committee.
