

It was kept under the Coronation Chair in Westminster Abbey and used during the coronation of English kings.

The movie relates how the stone was taken from the Abbey to Scotland. It was officially returned *on loan* from the British government in 1916. It is now kept in the Crown Room in Edinburgh Castle with the Scottish Crown Jewels.

I checked online, and the movie can be seen on several streaming services, including Prime Video and

Our 69th Grandfather Mountain Highland Games are a wrap, and what a Games it was! The weather was daunting to say the least, and the strong daily thunderstorms coming on the heels of Helene presented a big challenge to our Games crew. They performed in magnificent fashion, being able to restore the field to a great condition every day. Please join me in thanking them.

Despite a record 109 clans attending, our overall attendance was down slightly from the record year of 2024. I attribute the dip at least partially to the daily storms. It is unusual to have rain all four days, and except for Sunday, it rained hard all four days. We saw some strong performances from our shuttle partners, our parking attendants, golf cart drivers, and security personnel, all of whom contributed mightily to our handling the impacts of Mother Nature so well.

2025 was a very strong year for our events, from the Scottish Cultural Village to Highland Dance to Highland Athletics. We saw continued growth in our Children's events, and our seminars were well attended. We were able to squeeze in our traditional Torchlight Ceremony between storms, and the sky was magnificent during the event.
