Burns' Night Gala



Kirking Report by Judy Stubbs

After a three-year pause, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, members and friends of The Society joined with the congregation of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, New Albany, IN, to participate with them in the joint celebration of the Kirkin' O' the Tartans and The Feast of St. Margaret. The procession and recession were led by Piper Karen Brumley and Drummer Rick McKenzie of The Louisville Pipe Band.

It was an excellent service, and The Rev. Allan Wallace, Rector reminded us of the unique contributions made by St. Margaret to Christianity, to the people and families of Scotland. St. Margaret was Queen of Scotland, The Pearl of Scotland, and an English Princess of the Anglo-Saxon Royal Family. She married King Malcom III of Scotland in 1070, and taught him how to read the Bible. She was pious in her daily devotions and the St. Margaret Chapel in Edinburgh Castle is dedicated to her memory. She attended to the orphans and the poor, and provided for the restoration of the Iona Abbey. She established a ferry across the Firth of Forth, which has been named in her honor, among other charitable works. She was venerated as a Saint in the Episcopal Church, and recognized on November 16.



Burns' Night Gala Ticket Information


The Burns' Night Gala is just around the corner! If you have been wondering when you can buy your tickets online, the wait is over.
