## **Ingredients**

- ♦ Heat oven 375 degrees (middle rack)


I am so disappointed that the health situation has canceled them, but I completely agree.

# Family Search Affiliate Libraries vs LDS Family History Centers

Family Search Affiliate Libraries offer genealogists the opportunity to search many limited-access Family Search databases. Public or university libraries, archives, museums, or genealogical societies can become Family History Library Affiliates. While library affiliates will have some limitations in terms of services and accessibility to some Family Search historical records due to copyright and licensing restrictions, the level of access available surpasses what can be achieved from home or from non-affiliate libraries.

If researchers encounter restricted access records, the librarian or local genealogy society volunteers on duty are trained to suggest possible alternative options and solutions that include providing the patron with contact information for the nearest LDS Family History Center. This information usually includes the director's name, phone number, email contact, and hours of operation. At the Fort Myers Regional Library, we also provide driving directions to the two nearest Family History Centers in our reaion.

A major benefit of being a library affiliate is access to additional digital records not available outside a Family History Center. These digital records include images and name indexes. Currently, there are about 400 million original records available in a digital format that affiliate libraries can access. Library affiliates also receive a monthly enewsletter subscription for reference staff to stay abreast of what's new and the latest tips and tricks for supporting family history researchers.

The Family Search catalog uses icons to inform researchers concerning the accessibility of the records they are seeking.

- 1. A document icon means that the resource is only an indexed record or transcription of the document.
- 2. A camera icon means you can view the image of the original document from any web-enabled portable device.
- 3. A camera with a key icon indicates that access to an image is restricted, such as an image that can be seen only at a library affiliate or a Family History Center. If you encounter a record of this nature, the message will appear on the screen stating that access is restricted.
- 4. Wagon Wheel. When searching for a specific Family Search microfilm, you may encounter an icon resembling a wagon wheel. That could indicate a film in the process of being digitized or it may identify a film that is copyright restricted. If it is a restricted film, it normally contains a message to that effect and advised having to contact the nearest LDS Family History Center. If no message of this nature appears, check back to the site occasionally to see if the status has changed.

Family Search publishes copies of records only after gaining permission from the original record custodian (generally a government agency) and abiding by all the stipulated conditions and applicable laws. To remain in compliance with these agreements and standards, Family Search occasionally needs to adjust access to specific records. If you cannot find a record that was previously accessible, it is likely due to stipulations from the record custodians.

# County Histories and Genealogical Research

County histories can provide valuable data to help researchers extend their research back to multiple generations. The term "county histories" can also include local or regional histories. The period between the early to mid-1800s through the early 1900s saw a significant number of county histories published, many of which covered the Eastern and Midwestern regions of the United States. The rise in popularity of genealogy in the 1970s triggered another spike in publishing county histories. In some cases, these were updates of earlier publications; in others, the county histories were the first-ever published for a given area.

County histories typically provide useful information on the settlement patterns of the locality and origins of the early settlers. They shed light on economic, educational, religious, and social conditions. While the quality and accuracy vary, this information is important to genealogists and historians. To properly conduct research, one must know something about the past. Even if some of the details are enhanced or some unpleasant events are "sanitized", the basic facts and timelines usually are somewhat accurate.

The biggest issues with county histories usually involve the biographical sections, i.e., short historical sketches of prominent citizens and settlers. In some cases, biographical sections are long enough that they may be included in a separate volume. This can be a double-edged sword in terms of accuracy. On one hand, the information was often first-hand because it was provided by the families, close to the time the subject of the sketches was alive. The sketches were often accompanied by pictures. When accurate, this can be a bonanza of research information.

Many professionals caution users to take some of the information concerning profiles of individuals and families with a grain of salt because they often paid to be included in the county history. The publisher usually included the text verbatim from what was submitted by the person or family; therefore, much of the information

is considered secondary research.

Don't be upset if your ancestor doesn't appear in the text. One must remember that in most cases, individuals and/or families had to pay to have their sketches included. However, many people could not afford this luxury, and not everyone wanted to be included for a variety of reasons. All surnames that your research indicates should have been in the area should be checked, including surnames of in-laws and siblings.

County histories also include information about businesses, churches, cemeteries, civic and social groups. The names mentioned may have enough historical context to identify occupation and social status.
