

The Society sponsors local and regional activities and is a nonsectarian organization with no religious or political affiliation.






## President's Message



# Louisville's Scottish Community Celebrates Scotland's National Bard with Five Robert Burns Suppers in Three Nights

## January 22, 23, and 24 – Various Locations Across the City

Louisville, KY — Louisville's Scottish community is thriving, and the weekend of Jan 25 is the high point of their year. For three nights, celebrations honoring the life and legacy of Robert Burns, Scotland's famed national poet are held. The annual Robert Burns Supper, filled with poetry, music, traditional Scottish food, will take place on January 22, 23, and 24 at venues across the city.

For more than two centuries, Burns Suppers have commemorated the birthday of Robert Burns (1759–1796), beloved for his lyrical poetry, social commentary, and preservation of Scottish folk traditions. *“Auld Lang Syne,” “Tam o’ Shanter,” “To a Mouse,” and many of his other poems have defined Scottish identity. Since 1801, Burns Suppers have been held across the world to honor his life, ideals, and poetic works.*

The events commence with a lively, community-focused celebration at The Tartan House, Louisville's premier Scotch Whiskey bar.
