It played a prominent role in Scotland's history through 18th-century Jacobite risings due to its strategic location and defensive strength. There are many stories and facts about this castle on the hill. One fact is that the castle is best known as the place where the Honours of Scotland, the Scotlish crown jewels, were hidden from Oliver Cromwell's invading army in the 17th century. The castle has since been restored and is now open to the public for those wanting to visit, explore and learn more about the castle itself.

The board would like to thank Carter Keith for the presentation. Such a great presentation and discussion.




#### Clan of the Month
