CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM THE HONOURABLE ALEXANDER LESLIE,
CHIEF OF THE CLAN LESLIE



It has been an amazing year.

Early in the year I turned 50 and I am not sure whether this is a good or bad thing, but am leaning towards the 'good'. It was the 100th anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic, which attracted an enormous amount of media attention. My cousin, Angela, was on television, meeting for the first time Able Seaman Jones' Great Granddaughter and showing her both the plaque from Lifeboat Number 8 that Jones gave my Great Grandmother and the pocket watch that my Great Grandmother gave him. My father had to buy it when it came up for sale some years ago.

The middle of the year found me being Pursuivant at the Riding of the Marches in Dumfries. This is a re-enactment of Robert the Bruce sending his 'man' (me) to give Dumfries to its people and therefore the tiller of its own destiny. We rode horses around Dumfries in the pouring rain, staking out the Marches of the town.

The weather did not improve for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations which were an extraordinary spectacle, even though it was quite hard to see the enormous procession of boats that sailed down the Thames because of the horizontal rain. The Duke of Edinburgh ended up in hospital afterwards, having – at the age of 91 – stood ramrod straight by his Queen in appalling conditions, refusing to take refuge in the cabin of the Royal Barge.

The weather did improve for the Olympics, of which we are very proud. The usual British cynicism before it started gave way to a feeling of optimism and celebration that we are not used to seeing. It was an uplifting event.

Then, of course, came the Loon Mountain Games and the opportunity to meet new Leslies and to get to know my clansmen and women that much better. It was a great gathering and the Leslie hospitality was very special. My only regret was not spending more time in New Hampshire.

Since then I have been working on next year's events. It is the 500th anniversary of the Battle of Flodden and the Standing Council of Scottish Chiefs are hosting a Service of Remembrance in St Giles Cathedral in Edinburgh in September 2013. Donations are being requested for Erskine and Combat Stress, both charities help soldiers in their rehabilitation. As part of the committee (of two) that is organizing it, I am hoping it will be an occasion to remember.

The only slight shadow this year lies over the plans for 2014, the Scottish Government's next Year of Homecoming. With only 18 months to go plans are still not certain and even a clan village at Bannockburn seems not yet to be confirmed, while even a march of clans hangs in the balance. I think the Leslie Council's plan to investigate alternatives for 2014 is the right one, for the moment. Even with this small shadow, it has been a fascinating and exciting year. And now that it is nearly over, I would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Laura Messing presented her beautiful update of the old CLS "Trifold" brochure that we used to hand out at Scottish festivals. The old one was seriously out of date, and hasn't been used for years. Laura did an outstanding work which was approved by the Council. This new "Trifold," in color, will be available soon for the 2013 season. This should increase the appeal of our Society to visitors and hopefully increase our membership.

A memorial plaque to honor our founders, The Right Honourable Ian Leslie, Earl of Rothes and Hereditary Chief of Clan Leslie, and Alexander Leslie Klieforth, LLD. This plaque will be designed by David Leslie, Baron Bailie of Balquhain, and with the permission of the board, will be hung in the Chapel of the Garioch, near Leslie, Scotland.

The Council approved the award of Convenor of the Year to Frank W. Leslie, Convenor for the Southwest Region, for hosting five CLSI tents this year. Frank and his wife Lynne have been exceptionally active in tent hosting this year. Close behind were Lew and Chris Johnson, Convenors for Virginia and North Carolina having hosted four tents, and also William Leslie, Convenor for Central and Southern Ontario with four tents. THE LITTLE LINE THAT COULD

The winter 2012 issue of *Scottish Life* has a wonderful article by Candace Leslie, "The Little Line That Could." This delightful article is about the Kyle Line, a scenic railroad that one can take from Inverness northwest across the Black Isle to Dingwall on the Cromarty Firth. From there the line travels westward through the Highlands through Stromeferry, Plockton and finally arrives at Kyle of Lochalsh on Loch Carron on the west coast of Scotland, near the bridge to the Isle of Skye. Candace writes of the spectacular scenery along this magical line, rapid changes in the weather and the joy of a "local" line. The train stops at 15 possible stops, some of which are not scheduled, but where some passenger has told the conductor that passengers want off there. She writes of the majesty of the Highlands, interspersed with barren wilderness, rushing burns, wild deer, an occasional abandoned house or barn, and little stations and their tiny settlements.

CHRISTMAS GIFT SUGGESTIONS

Christmas is almost here, and some are still wondering what to get for that Scot in your life. May I make some suggestions? At the meeting of the Council of Scottish Clans and Associations (COSCA) at Grandfather Mountain in October, there were ten Scottish clan chiefs in attendance. Several spoke during the symposium and urged the members of Scottish clan societies and associations to be “authentic” and “knowledgeable.” They said that it is our responsibility to maintain and pass on the history, culture and customs of Scots and Scotland to the public and to our children.

For starters, I would recommend the history of Clan Leslie in the book *Grip Fast: The Leslies in History* by Alexander Leslie Klieforth, published in 1993 and both an outstanding history and very readable. Copies signed by our Clan Chief, the Honourable Alexander Leslie are available from our Treasurer. On sale this Christmas season for \$59 US. For those considering a trip to Scotland, I would recommend a subscription (four issues) to *Scottish Life* for \$29.95 US. You can order online at www.ScottishLifeMagazine.com or call 800-607-4410. This is an excellent source of interesting places to see in Scotland and with many color photos. Another magazine in the same vein is *Scotland Magazine*. Six issues per year for \$29.95. You can order *Scotland Magazine* online at www.britsubs.com/scogift and the promotion code G205AD or phone 800-925-8215.

For someone who is planning to purchase Scottish attire, I highly recommend the paperback book *So You're Going to Wear the Kilt* by J. Charles Thompson, 1989. Let's face it, purchasing Scottish attire is expensive, so it is wise to do it right the first time. That way you don't make expensive mistakes. This book has been and remains the authoritative source of information on what to wear when, and how to wear it. In addition, the author gives valuable information how to address your clan chief, or any of the titled (knight, baronet, baron, viscount, earl, lord, duke) person and their spouses and children. Usually available on Amazon for prices ranging from \$8.85 to \$14.00, with an exception at \$130. Don't think anyone of Scottish descent would bite on that one. Those of you who have attended Scottish festivals have no doubt seen folks wearing some outlandish clothing that they think is correct Scottish attire. Most often, it is not. If we are to be as “authentic” as we should, this book is essential.

For the person with an interest in historic Scotland, I recommend a subscription to *The Highlander: Magazine of Scottish Heritage*. This magazine is printed on newspaper, and not on glossy paper like the two previous magazines. Usually contains many interesting articles on Scotland and Scots. Subscription costs are \$34.95 per year for seven issues. You can order online at www.HighlanderMagazine.com or by phone at 800-607-4410. (Those of you who are sharp-eyed will note that *The Highlander* and *Scottish Life* are published by the same company.)

For those who want yet more about Scotland and Scots, especially those Scots around the globe who have made great contributions to the world, I recommend the book *How the Scots Invented the Modern World* by Arthur Herman, published by MJF Books, New York. Usually available on sale at Barnes & Noble, or online through Amazon.com. *The Sunday Times* (London) wrote “Herman's book tells us an exciting story with gusto . . . Its range and narrative verve make it an entertaining and illuminating read.” This is a really good collection of the remarkable discoveries and inventions of Scots around the world.

And last but not least, the incredible work by Alexander Leslie Klieforth and Robert John Munro, *The Scottish Invention of America, Democracy and Human Rights*, published by the University Press of America in 2004. This is a large (434 pages) paperback, with over 500 endnotes. A towering accomplishment. This may be a bit difficult to locate now as it was a big seller. You can try www.univpress.com or try Amazon.com. If that fails, there is always Google.



