SSL Membership Virtual Meeting September 22, 2020

Mr. Wilson welcomed everyone to our virtual meeting. Robbin introduced our presenters, Jim Hughes and Arch Cunningham, who presented the Scottish Trivia Quiz. - #12. Where is the Stone of Destiny housed? Answer: Edinburgh Castle
- #13. Which two canals are linked by the Falkirk Wheel? Answer: Forth & Clyde and Union canals
- #14. Who was the first actor to play James Bond? Answer: Sean Connery. There was some debate about this answer, but Jim said he would only accept Sean Connery.
- #15. Who is currently Scotland's First Minister? Answer: Nikola Sturgeon. This is the last question, which was worth 1-25 points according to how much was bet.

Program Commissioner Robbin Goodin asked if anyone had gone to the Games at Eminence, KY. Gary and Pat Schweitzer went, and reported that they had a good time. They said the music was great, and they were able to sit at a table on the outside edge of seating where they could see and hear the bands and stay away from other spectators. Pat said it was a good thing we did not set up our tables to help people look up information, as masks were required to get in, but many took off their masks once inside the grounds and did not follow social distancing guidelines. They saw only Clan Gunn there.

Mandy Dick is our October presenter, so you can look forward to some scary storytelling!

Robbin is working to set up the new calendar for 2021, so if you have any program in mind, please contact her at 502-894-8863 and let her know.

Mr. Wilson reported that the Board decided to cancel Burns' Night, since it is highly unlikely that we will be able to have a large gathering by then, and that Damien Burns will be putting together a video for us, which will be posted on the Scottish Society website.

Electronic Commissioner Damien Burns explained that he will take pictures and videos from previous Burns' Night festivities and make a composite video which he wants to permanently post on the website. Please send him any pictures or videos you may have as soon as possible to give him time to put the video together. He wants to post it on the same day we would have had Burns' Night, January 30, 2021.

Dianne Holland and Pat Schweitzer were both unable to attend, and there are no reports for At Large Members and the Clan McFritz.

Newsletter Editor John Moffett suggested a donation page for the video. There was some discussion, with some people approving of the idea, and others who did not. Damien does not think it is a good idea, as he wants to keep the video simple. John Moffett suggested we video future Burns' Night dinners in their entirety. John suggested that when we video new bits for this video, that we dress in our Burns' Night finery. As the discussion seemed likely to go on for some time, Mr. Wilson stated that we would continue at the next Board meeting.

John Dickson thinks we should use some of our resources to reach out to potential new members, since the Games are mostly cancelled. Mr. Wilson said we will bring that up at the next Board meeting.

Robbin Goodin stated that the next Members Night Out will be hosted by Shawn and Jennifer McLeod on the third Tuesday of October.

There were 22 members present for this meeting.

Mr. Wilson adjourned the meeting at 8:16 РМ.

#### A history Reminder...

John Knox (1514-1572) was a Scottish minister, theologian, and writer who was a leader of Scotland's Reformation. His efforts broke ties with the Papacy, and he is the founder of the Presbyterian Church of Scotland. Two centuries later Jonathan Witherspoon (1723-1794), an American Presbyterian Minister, President of what is now Princeton University, was a founding father of the United States and helped draft the Articles of Confederation and supported the Revolution.

# Scottish Haggis Loaves

# **Ingredients**

2 lbs -Ground Beef

1 lb-Ground Pork (or mild sausage)

2 cups of water

4 stalks Celery (diced)

1 Onion (diced)

2-3 eggs

Oates or Breadcrumbs

Salt

Pepper

2 tsp Cinnamon

#### Form into loaves



### **Directions**

- Brown meat in large Dutch oven or deep pot.
- ◆ Then add celery and onion, and water and cook 1-2 hours. Be sure that celery and onion are cooked (soft).
- ♦ Let cool and drain off most of the water.
- Once cool add 2 eggs and then use either oats or bread crumbs, salt, pepper, and cinnamon till thick enough to form into loaves or whatever shape you like.
- ♦ Bake at 350 degrees till brown. (Remember the meat is already completely cooked so it is just color we are after.
- ◆ This should feed 20-30 small portion. This recipe may make multiple loaves depending on the size of each loaf.
- ♦ It is usually served with tatties and neeps (mashed potatoes and mashed turnips mashed separately). Season to taste. Some turnips can be bitter, add sugar to sweeten.


