#### Did You Know?

Mardi Gras came to New Orleans through its French heritage in 1699. Early explorers celebrated this French Holiday on the banks of the Mississippi River. Throughout the years, Orleanians have added to the celebration by establishing *krewes* (organizations) which host parades and balls. Carnival quickly became an exciting holiday for both children and adults.

Mardi Gras means "Fat Tuesday" and of course is celebrated on that day of the week.

The official colors for **Mardi Gras** are **purple**,

green, and gold. These colors were chosen in 1872 by the King of Carnival, Rex. He chose these colors to stand for the following:

- Purple stands for justice
- Green stands for faith
- Gold stands for power

### Cousin Spotlight on J.P. Utley's Family

**Jacob Prentyce** (**J.P.**) **Utley** was the first son born to **Prentyce** and **Bernard Jacobs Utley**. **J.P.** was born on September 24, 1922 in Jackson, TN. He married **Wilma Rosamond Craig** on August 7, 1943 in Bryan, TX. **J.P.** died on August 26, 2001 in Jackson, TN. **Wilma** is still living and will celebrate her 86th birthday this year.

**J.P.** and **Wilma** had two children, a daughter, **Jackie** and a son, **Richard.** Our **Cousin Spotlight** in this issue will feature these two grandchildren of **John Allen** and **Lilla Maude Jacobs Utley**.

#### Martha Jacqueline "Jackie" Utley



In response to a questionnaire, Jackie Utley wrote:

"My full name is Martha Jacqueline Utley. I was born on March 20, 1949 in Jackson, TN. I am told that when my father's Aunt Martha Utley Sladek found out that Mom was expecting in March, she wrote a letter and said wouldn't it be wonderful if the baby (me) were a girl, and born on her birthday, March 20. I was, and Mom and Dad added Martha as my first name. They had intended to call me only Jacqueline. I have always been called "Jackie."

One of the first memories I have of my youth is playing in the backyard of the house we shared with my grandparents, **Prentyce** and **Bernard Utley**. We had a swing set, pear trees and lots of room to run and play. I'm told that I had an invisible cow, Spoodie, and I tended an invisible "veeegetable" garden right outside the back door to the house.

Christmas memories: I remember being so excited to go in to living room on Christmas morning to see what Santa had brought. And he always remembered to bring ribbon candy, nuts and oranges as well as Christmas gifts.

Memory of elementary school: I remember that I loved school! A neighbor, who was also in the first grade, cried every morning because she didn't like school, and I would walk her to her classroom every morning and try to get her to stop crying.

The vacation our family took which I remember best was a trip to Mammoth Cave as part of a week-long trip around Tennessee and Kentucky. We didn't take that many vacations as a family, and this one was one of the last ones we took together as a family.

My first paying job: I helped my dance teacher with younger classes. I wasn't paid, but I received all my lessons for free. When I was 12 years old, she took two weeks off to have her first baby and I took over the studio for her. My longest employment as an adult was as a dance studio owner (21 years), but I've now been employed as an aquatics instructor at the Jackson Family YMCA for 18 years. So that's a close second. Still haven't retired, although I only teach 9 classes a week.

My formal education: Jackson [TN] High School, graduated in 1967; Union University, B.S. in Psychology, in 1975. My favorite subject in school was English literature; and my absolute least favorite was physics.

I first met my husband, Lynn

Williams, in 1972. He was dating a good friend of mine. Needless to say, we haven't heard from her in about 30 years.

Lynn and I were married on June 11, 1976. The ceremony was in my parent's home in Jackson, TN. Justice of the Peace Bobby George, solemnized the ceremony, assisted by a good friend of ours, the Rev. John Turner. One outstanding memory of that day is: We had written our own vows which included the phrase, "We pledge to provide a stable, loving atmosphere for Becky (Lynn's daughter)." During the rehearsal the night before, Bobby George had stopped at the comma, making it sound as though we were going to have a stable. He got the sentence correct during the actual ceremony, but we both nearly laughed out loud.

He rarely smiled, but when he did it was a great big smile that lit up his entire face. I remember him puttering around the house and yard, always busy; shooting squirrels out the kitchen window; and falling through the third-story roof in his late 80s. My Mamaw, Bernard Utley, was addicted to soap operas, and would watch "As The World Turns" and "The Edge of Night" faithfully. She was never too busy to take time to sit and

visit with us, and always made us feel like the most important people on Earth.

Civic, social and church honors and activities: charter member of Northside United Methodist Church, Jackson, TN; Miss Dixie Dance 1966, Miss Union University 1968, talent winner and runner-up to Miss Tennessee 1968, Miss Madison County 1969, West TN Fairest of the Fair 1969. Member of Southern Association of Dance Masters since 1965. Past president and member of Jackson Business and Professional Women; 2005 BPW Woman of Achievement; past president and Life Member of Jackson Evergreen Garden Club; Regent of Jackson Madison Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution; Trainer for the American Arthritis Association in Arthritis Aquatics, Arthritis Exercise, and Tai Chi for Arthritis; choreographer for Jackson Theatre Guild, Lambuth

University and Jackson Parks and Recreation Children and Teen Theatre productions; past president, stage manager and member of board of directors for Ballet Arts, Inc. One of my "theatre kids" won the Tony in 2005, and another is currently performing in the musical "Spring Awakening" on Broadway.

If my home caught on fire and I could go back in to retrieve only one thing (assuming all people and pets were safely out), I would choose my computer back-up disks, since so much of my family history data and family photos are stored on my computer.

If I could give advice on how to live a happy life, I would say, "Live your life in such a way that you have a positive influence on every life you touch. Cherish your family ties and tell your family every day that you love them."

#### Richard Wayne Utley

In response to a questionnaire, Richard Utley wrote:

"My full name is **Richard Wayne Utley.** I was born on Wednesday,
March 5, 1952 around 10:00 a.m. at
Jackson-Madison County General
Hospital [Jackson, TN]. I have been
told it was snowing on the day I was
born. I was the first "**Utley**" grandson
of **Annie Bernard** and **John Prentyce Utley**.

One of the first memories I have as a child was riding my tricycle into the back of my sister's bicycle, breaking the reflector on her back fender.

One of my favorite memories about celebrating Christmas was the family gatherings and the great food.

The vacation our family took which I remember best was going to the Smoky Mountains, Ruby Falls, and Cherokee Village when I was young. I remember seeing Black Bears for the first time, going in caves, and standing next to the Indian children, wondering why they were so much darker than I was.

My first legitimate paying job was at Morgan's Service Station when I was in High School. Since it was a full service gas station (remember them?), I put gas in cars, cleaned windshields, fixed flats, did oil changes, and some minor repair work. But the best part was flirting with all the girls that came by.

My longest employment as an adult has been with Helmitin Adhesives. I've been with Helmitin from 1984 to present. I began as a chemist, which evolved into technical support, which evolved into sales, which evolved into sales and technical support. I am currently responsible for sales for a specialized portion of the woodworking industry for the entire United States and technical support for the US, Canada, Mexico and Puerto Rico. My bosses think I have too much spare time and should start doing tech support for parts of Europe. If I'm lucky, I may be able to retire by the time I'm 95.

I graduated from Memphis State University, now known as University of Memphis, in 1977 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology and Chemistry. My favorite subjects in school were the sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Math and Physics. My least favorite subject in school was history, which I now find fascinating.

I first met my wife, **Becky** [**Brown**], in a class during my last semester at MSU. We had both taken "Intro to Theater", which was one of the required classes for graduation. We had to see a play as one of the requirements for the class. I asked **Becky** if she would like to go with me to see the play and the rest is history.

**Becky** and I were married on Saturday, June 22, 1979 at Woodland Presbyterian Church in Memphis, Tennessee, with **Rev. Earl Wiggins** officiating. Waiting for the ceremony to begin, I remember standing in a small room beside the sanctuary with **Dad**, who was my best man. **Dad** looked at the window of that small room, looked at me with a grin on his face and said, "Son, it's not too late - yet!"

During my school years, I had the privilege of spending many afternoons with my grandparents waiting for **Mom** or **Dad** to get off work and take me home. I remember **Granddaddy** always staying busy. Whether he was straightening old bent nails or shooting squirrels he was always happy and usually whistling. **Mamaw** stayed busy too. Except for her, busy usually meant sitting in front of the TV watching her soap operas.

Becky and I have been blessed with four wonderful children and so far, two son-in-laws. Jessica Leigh Utley (Jessie) was born Jan. 26, 1982. Jessie was married to Matthew Frederick (Matt) Means on Oct. 28, 2006. Mary Rachel Utley was born on July 11, 1983. Rachel was married to James Cobb Andrews on Aug. 14, 2004. Amanda Rosamond Utley was born on March 15, 1985. And John **Prentyce Utley** II was born on July 27, 1989. All of our children were born at Baptist Memorial Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee. Becky and I have no grandchildren – so far only grand-pets.


