### Cousin Spotlight on Eloise Utley Stanley's Family

**Peggy Eloise Utley** was the first daughter and second child born to **John Prentyce** and **Bernard Jacobs Utley**. **Eloise** was born on February 1, 1927 in Lavinia, Carroll County, Tennessee. She married **Robert Wyly Fortner** on April 12, 1943. **Robert** died July 12, 2001. **Eloise** married **Luther Allen Stanley** on January 5, 2003. **Allen** died April 23, 2007. **Robert** and **Eloise** had two children, **Robert Wyly Fortner**, **Jr.** and **Bonnie Elaine Fortner**.

Our Cousin Spotlight focuses on these two: Robert Fortner, Jr. and Bonnie Fortner.

#### In response to a questionnaire, Bonnie wrote:

My full name is **Bonnie Elaine** Fortner Yates. I was born at 4:06 am on Sunday, October 27, 1946 at St. Mary's Hospital in Humboldt, TN, the first and only daughter of Robert and Eloise (Utley) Fortner. I have been told that my mother wanted to wait until daylight to go to the hospital, but my dad insisted that they go right away. I was born just a short while after they arrived at the hospital, well before daylight. Mom wanted to name me **Bonita** and call me **Bonnie**. **Dad**, being the practical man he was, said if you're going to call her Bonnie, name her Bonnie. And that was that!

I have two vivid early childhood memories. First and *fondest* is my mother reading to me. The other is sock-skating in the living room with my brother, **Robert Jr**. I was a little too young and uncoordinated and, of course, I slipped and fell and split my head open. (I suspect I was tripped!) I was quite upset, but the TLC and attention I got afterward made it *almost* worth it.

My earliest Christmas memories are from our children's Christmas programs at church. We performed well-rehearsed, but sometimes half-forgotten, parts for the congregation and afterwards we received gifts of fruit, nuts and candy. I always enjoyed decorating the

family Christmas tree and anticipating what wonderful things Santa was going put under it. The downside of Christmas was that I got sick every year. It only took 12 years to figure out that I was allergic to the live trees I loved to decorate. Artificial trees are just as much fun to decorate and they last a lot longer!!

I was so excited about going to school, and I wanted to have the same teacher that my brother had in first grade. I was really disappointed that I was not in her class, but I loved my teacher anyway. When I was in the sixth grade, my brother got a motorcycle, so I rode to school on the back. One day my teacher called me aside and asked if my mother knew that I was riding to school on a motorcycle. I said "yes" and didn't think anymore about it. I don't think she believed me, because later she called me aside again and asked me if my mother knew that I had a boyfriend that rode a motorcycle. I almost died of embarrassment before I could get the words out, "Yuk! He's not my boyfriend, he's my brother!!" (I must have enjoyed the thrill of the ride. For the past several years I had my own motorcycle. **Rick** and I took several road trips together, the longest for 30 days. I recently sold my bike and now ride in carefree comfort behind **Rick** on his Goldwing.)

Both my mother's and father's parents lived in Jackson. I vividly remember spending several weeks each summer visiting with them and being treated like a little princess. The most memorable family vacation was the first trip to Florida and my first glimpse of the Gulf of Mexico. It began a lifelong love affair with the ocean/beach.

My first paying job was the summer between my junior and senior years in high school. I sold baskets of golf balls to customers at a driving range. I got a percentage of my sales, but I was guaranteed to make at least

\$1.00 per hour. Boy, have times changed.

My longest employment as an adult was with the Internal Revenue Service. What started out as a seasonal job to supplement family income turned into a 30-year career. I held a variety of positions over the years from tax examiner to national project coordinator. At the time of my retirement in June 2002, I was the Disclosure Officer for the Memphis Service Center.

I attended public schools in Humboldt and Memphis and graduated from Overton High School in 1964. I attended Memphis State University and the University of Maryland, European Division, at Ramstein AFB Germany. My favorite subject in school was English. I planned to be an English teacher but changed my mind quickly after completing my student teaching. My least favorite subject in school was math, which is ironic since I loved my work with the IRS which for many years involved a great deal of math.

I first met my husband **Rick** in Atlanta in 1989 at a business conference. We were instant friends. Over the years as our lives changed, so did our friendship. For two people who love to plan, to dot every "i" and cross every "t" before acting, our wedding was uncharacteristically spontaneous. We got our marriage license in the morning and were married in the afternoon on Valentine's Day in 1997. We were married by Judge Hall on the Collierville Town Square. It is great to be married to my best friend.

Every time I think about Granddaddy Utley, I think about whistling, grapes, ice cream, squirrels and "humph". What a strange combination! I remember him as always happy and whistling. When I visited in the summers, he would let me pick grapes and he always brought home ice cream after work. He had a love/hate relationship with the squirrels in his yard and shot more than his share, many through the upstairs windows. And many times in our conversations, the only comment he would make was a non-committal "humph."

Ever time I think of **Grandmother Utley**, I think of soap operas, sweet potato casserole, and a hearty laugh. She surely loved her TV. I loved her sweet potato casserole with marshmallows on top. But most of all I loved to hear her laugh.

My children are **Neyl Williams**, born 04/16/69 in Landstuhl, Germany, and **Tracey Williams Svetz**, born 08/30/71 in Warner Robins, GA. I also have a stepson, **Coleman Yates**,

born 10/11/1987 in Dallas, TX. All three are a blessing from the Lord.

#### In response to a questionnaire, Robert wrote:

Born February 29, 1944 at **Prentyce** and **Bernard's** home on North Royal in Jackson TN. My Dad **Robert Fortner Sr.** was off fighting for the freedom that we all have been enjoying for the past 50 years.

From Jackson we moved to Milan and then to Humboldt TN. I attended Elementary and Junior high school in Humboldt, and then moved to Memphis for High School. My special memories of Humboldt include marching in the school band. I remember one trip the school band took to Murray Ky where we won first place in marching competition. I remember playing Little League Baseball. My Team was sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce (C of C). I pitched and played short stop. Our Team placed 1st most every year. I remember playing on the all Star Team (great memories).

My fond memories of my grand parents are many, one in particular is a hunting trip with **Prentyce**. I remember we went squirrel hunting with a 22 caliber rifle. At 10 years old the squirrel was a little too fast for my rifle.

I remember Christmas visits to **Prentyce** and **Bernard's** home. Also Thanksgiving visits to (**J. P.** and **Wilma**) and. (**Jack** and **Earl**) Houses. One Thanksgiving day we were watching football game at **Jack** and **Earl's** house and the Lions and Packers were playing in a terrible snow storm. That's the day I decided I wanted to live where it is warm.

I remember one of our earlier vacations with my parents **Eloise**, **Robert Sr.**, and **Bonnie** my sister went to Look Out Mountain in East TN great time.

My Teen age jobs included gas stations, grocery stores. My interest now was turning toward old cars and Hot Rods. About this time we had to move from Humboldt to Memphis because Dad had to get a better paying job to support his family. He was a very hard working man and we miss him very much!....

In Memphis I was in the first graduating class of Overton High school and in the summer I would work for my uncle Wilbert in his masonry company. Then I was off to Memphis State University (Now called Memphis University). I have great memories of those years. One night I was taking my 32 Ford Roadster for a ride and I stopped into a 7-11 to get a cold beverage and a guy said to me (Hey Boy, my boss would like to look at your car.) I looked over and saw a black Cadillac Limousine. Guess who got out?.... His boss was pretty famous!!!... They liked the Hot Rod car and invited me to follow them back to Graceland and hang out. Did you guess who the Boss was?

After College I was accepted into

the Management Program for Federated Dept stores specializing in their Operations Division. I liked the job but I couldn't wait forty years of hard work for their reward. While I was working for Federated (Goldsmith) I had a pretty scary experience. In 1968 there was a march in downtown Memphis and MLK was shot at a local motel (Loraine?). I drove into the parking garage off Main Street to report for work, as I entered the garage the security guards handed all members of management a hand gun and shot gun. All other employees except for management got to go home. The Street were filled with people breaking windows, looting and burning buildings on Main street downtown Memphis. They broke our windows in the front and looted but did not burn us down. I was on the second floor and was very happy to get home from that days work. Not long after that I went into sales so the reward would be based on performance not time served. I worked in Memphis for a couple of years.

In 1973 I got a chance to move where it's warm!!!... I moved to Fort Lauderdale, Florida and started working with what I like, Automotive parts (batteries), street rods, custom cars, custom Limos and Off Shore Power Boats. There has been a lot of water under the bridge since those days, lots of ups and downs. 34 years have come and gone and still breathing and I'm really thankful for that.

In the late 80's I met **Jackie** [Jacinthe Louis Maria Leger] and we became friends and got married July 1 1994. And now 13 years later happily married we are now living outside of Daytona in a little

### ~Abe~

In an email on April 6, 2007, Kate Utley wrote: "My work is going really well. I am really enjoying what I am currently doing, which is - I am the lead person responsible for all of the Tools & Diagnostic equipment for the International Space Station. When equipment goes out of calibration, I am consistently resupplying them with calibrated tools. In addition, I do a lot of new certification of all types of equipment for the Station, like ammonia respirators, urine separation equipment, water dispensers, etc. Certification of new hardware is a very long process of getting NASA to 'buy off' on the fact what we are sending to space is not hazardous, and is safe for the astronauts use. It is a very exciting job with a lot of impact on NASA. I really feel I am making a difference! In addition, recently, for my project in certifying the static separation for urine, I got to fly on the C9 (which is a microgravity plane). There are only about 5 in the world,

and very VERY completive to get on, unless you have very good reason for being there. Since I had an experiment I worked for, I got to fly. I have attached a picture of me in 0 Gravity (on the plane). To feel 0 Gravity, the plane does a series of parabolas. This means they get up to about 40,000 ft (normal elevation for a regular airplane) and start to do a 50 degree dive straight to the ocean! Sounds scary, but it allows us to feel 0 Gravity. Then, the plane has to pull up at the same angle, and we all experience 2 Gravities (2x what we feel on earth) to get back to normal elevation, and then we do it all over again. It was so weird to feel 2 G. I couldn't move! We did a series of about 75 parabolas, 30 sec. of microgravity a piece, a total of 40 min. of gravity. CRAZY! "


