Cousin Spotlight on the Family of John Utley

Archie Vivion Utley, also known as **John Utley**, was born on October 20, 1906. He was the eighth child and the fourth son born to **John Allen** and **Lilla Maude Utley**.

This Cousin Spotlight will feature the surviving spouses of two of **John's** sons. **Sue McLemore Utley** was married to the late **Everett Utley**. **Mary Pipkin Utley** is married to **John Thomas Utley**. **James Allen Utley's** wife, **Evelyn Cardin Utley**, died on May 9, 1998.

Lyda Sue McLemore Utley

The following are the answers to a questionnaire about her life:

My full name is **Lyda Sue McLemore Utley**. (Yes my first name is spelled correctly on my birth certificate.)

I was born on October 13, 1928 near Lavinia in Carroll County [TN].

Daddy was a singer and I remember that as a hard working farmer he was never too tired to sing.

A memory of celebrating Christmas: Sometime during Christmas week we visiting grandparents and aunts and uncles.

School memories: My first teacher was Mrs. Compton whose husband was principal. They were two very special people. When I was in second or third grade I sang between acts of a High school play. I still think that was a great honor.

Vacations: Our family didn't know about vacations when I was growing up.

My first paying job was teaching second grade in Lavinia. I think my salary was \$60 per month. My longest employment was teaching grades K-4 in Jackson. I retired from teaching at Alexander school in Jackson [TN] in 1994.

My formal education: Lavinia School graduated 1994; Milan High school, graduated 1946; Union University, B.A. 1953; Memphis State [now University of Memphis] M.Ed. 1969.

My favorite subjects were English and math. My least favorite was science.

How I met my spouse: I don't remember meeting [Everett Utley]. We grew up in the same community. We were married on May 6, 1951 at Spring Creek Baptist Church by Rev. Melvin Williams. Our wedding was the first performed by Rev. Williams. We forgot Mother's flowers and an aunt took her home to get them. The ceremony was a little late and the pianist declares that she played everything she knew including "Amazing Grace."

Memories of her in-laws: Because Mr. John [Utley] and I had worked at Milan Arsenal we could talk about lots of things. Somehow I managed to stay in his good graces. He said I could do business things well because I asked lots of questions. Mrs. Edrie was an excellent cook and loved doing things for her family.

My children are **Alan Thomas Utley**, born August 15, 1957, died January 9, 1988. **Mark Anthony Utley**, born November 23, 1958. Both were born in Jackson General Hospital, Jackson, TN.

I have been an active member of West Jackson Baptist Church a little over 50 years. Also a member of Eastern Star for 50 years. As a retiree I am a member of local, state, and national education organizations. I am a charter member of a local chapter of Alpha Delta Kappa teacher sorority. When I worked at the Milan Arsenal due to winning some contests I became an honorary member of the Guard and Fire Departments. In 1999 I won a J. C. Penny Golden Rule Award for volunteering.

If my house caught on fire and I could retrieve only one thing, assuming all people and pets were safely out, I would choose my purse because it would have important cards, pictures and notes in it.

If I could give advice on how to live a happy life, I would say, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart. Maintain an active mind and body."

I have always felt a part of **Utley** family. So many were so special even before I married. **Aunt Annie** was married to my **Uncle Lillian**. [**Annie Utley** married **Lillian McLemore** in June 1918. **Annie** was a sister of **Archie Vivion "John" Utley**.]

The following are answers to a questionnaire about her life:

My full name is **Mary Magdaline Pipkin Utley**. I was born in Henderson County. My grandmother was present at my birth and immediately informed my parents that she was naming me, and that she wanted one good bible reader in the family.

A memory of my youth: The closeness of our family and all the guidance given by my parents and my brothers. When I dated the boy must pass approval of 5 brothers and my parents.

Christmas memories: How appreciative I and my brothers were for all our gifts because it was usually one gift for each one. I had 6 brothers and one sister.

School memories: I loved school and my early school years were so much fun, as our neighbor was my teacher and I wanted to please him by making good grades.

Vacation memories: I don't remember taking vacations. Imagine a vacation with 8 children on a farmer's income.

My first paying job was as Pickwick Resort secretary and bookkeeper. My longest employment was at Russ Crocker Buick Co. before **John** and I were married. I was Secretary and bookkeeper. I worked for Sears Roebuck and Co. for 22 years and retired in 1985.

Formal education: Selmer High School, graduated 1950; West Tenn. Business College, business degree. I liked all subjects but my least favorite was algebra. My favorite was English and History.

I first met **John** while working at Buick Co. **Jean Parrish** introduced me to John and we double dated with

Floyd and Jean. We were married on December 21, 1953 in Corinth, MS, by Justice of Peace. I had been in a car accident and was just out of the hospital. Could not wear heels, so I carried my shoes up the steps of the courthouse and entered barefoot. My sister went with us to Corinth, MS.

John's parents were always so helpful to us and I remember each Wednesday night we went to their house for supper along with James Allen, Evelyn, Sue and Everett. The kids all looked forward to Wednesday nights.

My children are **Debbie**, born March 24, 1955; and **Cindy**, born July 7, 1958, deceased.

My grandchildren are **Misty Cupples**, born in Madison County [TN]; and **Logan Mayo**, born in Madison County [TN]. Both are children of **Debbie Mayo**.

We attend Malesus Baptist Church and have a wonderful church family and we enjoy all the activities of our church

If my house caught on fire, I would go back to retrieve my pictures and personal important document, extra clothing and shoes.

If I could give advice on how to live a happy life, I would say, "Follow the 'Golden Rule.' Live each day pleasing to God and everyone and rely on God for problems we can't solve. Do a good deed for someone else each day. Always communicate on large and small problem. Two heads are always better than one."

Anything else I'd like my family to know about me: Just that I'm proud of my family and I'll always be there for them. I love my family very much.
