2006 Utley Reunion—fun, food, fellowship

The 2006 Utley Family Reunion, held Saturday, July 29, was a smashing success!

Sue Bates designed and pieced patchwork quilt squares for the center of each table, plus a quilt topper for the registration table. After the meal everyone signed the white center of each quilt square with archival ink pens. These signed squares will be stored and displayed at future reunions. Folks will be encouraged to add their signatures at reunions in the years to come.

The centerpiece on each table featured silk flowers and old and new family photos. Everyone was encouraged to take home any photos that they wanted.

Mary Utley staffed the registration table and had everyone to sign in when they received their name tags.

There were goodie bags at each place setting with pens, "scooshy" pen grips, mini-Post It notes, candy bars and chewing gum.

Cousin Spotlight on Martha Utley Sladek's Family

Martha Pricilla Utley was the ninth child and the fifth daughter born to John Allen and Lilla Maude Utley. Martha was born March 20, 1909 in Lavinia, Tennessee. She married Frank Joseph Sladek on February 25, 1933. Their only child is Karen Ann Sladek Fourreau. Martha died in LaGrange, Illinois, on January 28, 1993.

Our Cousin Spotlight focuses on **Karen**'s husband, **Charles Wilkerson Fourreau**, "Chuck" to his friends and family.

Charles Wilkerson Fourreau

In response to a questionnaire, Chuck Fourreau wrote:

"My full name is **Charles W. Fourreau.** I was born on April 5, 1936, which was Palm Sunday, in Chicago, IL. I was born at home after 2 days of labor. Parents could not afford hospital.

One of my first memories: playing Marines with my brother on the roof of the building we lived in.

Christmas memory: I always got a doctor's kit each Christmas. I loved to play Dr.

Elementary school memory: I ditched school and my sister came and found me and I got spanked. I was in the second grade.

Family vacation: New Orleans, Mardi Gras in 1949. First time we ever stayed in a motel.

My first paying job was newspaper route at age 10 in Chicago.

My longest employment as an adult: Fuller Brush, Field Manager, overseeing the territories of 15 men. In 1994 I retired due to heart attack and diabetes.

Education: I went to 10 different grade schools and 2 different high schools. All in the Chicago and suburban area. Math was my favorite subject and English was my least favorite.

How I met my spouse: In 1954 I worked at a delicatessen in a shopping

center and **Karen** used to come in as a customer. **Martha** also would come in on the weekends.

We were married on June 20, 1959 in Brookfield IL at Brookfield Baptist Church with Rev. Robert Pettit. One outstanding memory of that day is how pretty my wife looked in her wedding gown.

Memories of my wife's parents: They taught me how to handle money, for which I am grateful.

My children: **Arleen K. Fourreau**, born November 18, 1960 in Augusta, GA; **Dennis G. Fourreau**, born November 18, 1962 in Hinsdale, IL; and **Scott T. Fourreau**, born October 8, 1970 in Hinsdale, IL.

My grandchildren: Arleen's children are James Torres and Jonathan Torres, both born on June 17, 1992, at Rush Presbyterian Hospital in Chicago, IL, and Justin Torres born on April 9, 1996, at Glen Oaks Hospital in Glendale Heights, IL. Dennis' children are Andrew B. Fourreau born on May 3, 1992, and Michael Fourreau, born on September 14, 1994. Both were born in Aurora, IL, at Mercy Hospital. Scott's child is Matthew Butcher Fourreau, born on May 30, 2004, in Joliet, IL.


Military service: August 1959 through August 1961, Army. Since it was peacetime, I was stationed in Georgia at Fort Gordon.

If I could give advice on how to live a happy life, I would say, "Have a good family life and everything else will take care of itself."


Anything else I'd like my family to know about me: That I am proud of the way my life has turned out and would not change it."

On August 9, Millie Hestand emailed. "We were invited to England [in July] to visit friends from other trips. They live in Hampshire, Kent and Essex. They spoiled us in the most delightful ways. They are all good cooks; it was like eating with Beulah and **Abe**. English food is absolutely delicious when properly prepared. Among the home cooking we enjoyed was an absolutely perfect lemon meringue pie, an apple pie, meat pie, toad in the hole, bangers and mash, traditional roast lamb Sunday dinner, and lovely salmon fillets. Fresh raspberries and strawberries (the kind we got before the needs of shippers ruined them) were in season; cream is abundant and thick.

Tho it was hot, the nights cooled down to require cover with open windows and pleasant sea breezes. We were often overlooking the sea from high cliffs; some beaches were sand but most are smooth rock called shingle. We shopped in Marks and Spencer's, Tesco, and little shops. Charity shops were in every block. Hanging baskets, planters on the sidewalks, beds along public ways were filled with blooming flowers. We saw a copy of the Geneva Bible, the Magna Carta, Stonehenge, Salisbury Cathedral with its very tall spire, 900 years old Christchurch Priory, attended evensong in Canterbury Cathedral, and a hog roast which made almost \$3000 for the parish church.

Our friends took us round and about in their cars so we learned to understand the signs and appreciate the function of the roundabouts. The roundabouts control intersection traffic without overpasses, traffic lights and minimum stopping. Imagine the saving! A traffic light in our neighborhood for the school and fire department cost \$100,000 recently. It was too hot to even think about London where there were power difficulties but we did travel by train in and out of Waterloo which serves the Eurostar trains. We were upgraded for our British Airways flight home during the day and had no jet lag.

NASA and Kate Utley

There aren't many internships where you feel like you're a part of history being made, but **Kate Utley** has one.

The past is what drew the Frisco [TX] native to NASA to begin with.

"It's just the sound of it and all the history behind it," **Utley** said. "So many great things have come out of NASA."

Utley heard about the space agency's Cooperative Education Program through her school and couldn't let the opportunity slip by. As a biomedical engineering major at Texas A&M University, however, she wasn't so sure that NASA wouldn't pass her up – after all, she associated NASA more with aerospace and mechanical engineers.

But she found that biomedical engineering is poised to play an important role in NASA's future. As NASA turns its attention toward flights to the moon, Mars and beyond, it's going to be important to study the physiological affects of long duration space flight and develop countermea-

sures. And that's right up **Utley's** alley.

"I see my part playing a little bigger role in the next 20 years than it has before," she said.

She intends to be here to see it through. **Utley** was one of about 150 students chosen from 40 universities across the country to take part in NASA's co-op program. Designed to prepare undergraduates for careers by supplementing classroom learning with real-world experience, the extremely competitive program allows students to alternate semesters at school with working at Johnson Space Center.

The paid, full-time positions in their field of study, give students a chance to see what they might like to do after graduation. For **Utley** that's meant designing parts of exercise equipment to be used by astronauts and working on a program that compiles two-dimensional medical scans into 3-D models.

Utley's mentor, Tom Duncavage, branch chief of Information Fusion Test and Analysis said it may not land them in a history

book, but it's still new and important work for NASA. And he said **Utley** did a great job on it.

"She is without a question the best co-op I've ever worked with," he said. "As a matter of fact, we'd love to hire her. She was that good."

The feeling was apparently mutual – **Utley** is planning to return to Houston after her graduation in December and take on a permanent position working on spacesuit fits.


