Honoring Our Veterans

In 1918, on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, 11:00 a.m. November 11th, Germany signed a treaty with the Allied Powers (France, England and the United States) to declare the official end to The War to End All Wars, World War I.

In 1938, legislation was passed designating November 11 as "Armistice Day" to honor World War I veterans. In 1954, after World War II and the Korean Conflict, Congress, at the urging of veterans groups, changed the name to "Veterans Day" to honor veterans of all wars.

In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill moved the celebration of Veterans Day to the last Monday of October to provide a three-day weekend for Federal employees. Many states resisted this change and in 1975, a law was passed restoring Veterans Day to November 11.

Many people confuse Memorial Day with Veterans Day. Memorial Day is dedicated to the remembrance of service members who died in service to their country or as the result of injuries received during battle. Veterans Day honors those deceased service members, but also honors and thanks those living veterans who have ever served honorably in the military in wartime or peace.

Our line of military service stretches back to the Revolutionary War, when our ancestor, **William Utley**, aided the

American patriots fighting for their independence from English rule. Our family has served proudly in war and peace in all the years since that struggle.

We honor all of our veterans and thank them for serving our country and for protecting our freedoms.





Cousin Spotlight: Raleigh Utley's Family

Raleigh Hulon Utley was the tenth child and the fifth son of John Allen and Lilla Maude Utley. He was born on March 29, 1912 in Lavinia, Tennessee. In 1928 he married Emma Elizabeth McLemore. They had one daughter, Sarah Wilma Utley. In 1943 he married Dorothy Mae McRae. Raleigh and Dorothy had two children, Emily Ann and Robert Hulon.

Robert Hulon Utley was born on December 10, 1946 and died on January 31, 1981.

Emily Utley married Jerry Ray Hatcher in 1963. She married James Herbert Oliver in 1993. Herbert Oliver is in poor health.

Our Cousin Spotlight focuses on **Elmer Massey**, husband of **Sarah Wilma Utley**.

Elmer Massey

In response to a questionnaire, Elmer Massey wrote:

"My full name is **Elmer Massey** (no middle name). I was born on April 20, 1926. I was told that my grandmother, **Addie Drake**, was with my mother when I was born.

My first memory is the death of my mother when I was two years old.

Christmas memories: Being at home with my two brothers, sister and Daddy and always having fresh fruit and candy.

Elementary school memories: Riding my bike or skating to school with my brother **Joe**. We lived only 2 blocks from school.

Vacations: Never took trips far from home. We did always go to the Mid South Fair and visited relatives for Sunday dinner.

My first paying job: My responsibilities were helping my father in the dairy and then became owner and later farmed with my sons, **Mike** and **Steve**. I retired when **Mike** and **Steve** bought the farming operation and land.

I graduated from Bartlett High School in Bartlett, TN. and then ran the dairy. My favorite subject in school was math and history, my least favorite was English literature.

I met my wife, **Sarah**, at Egypt Baptist Church in 1946. We were married on July 26, 19476 in Hernando, MS, by **Rev. Whitten**.

I remember that **Sarah's Aunt Bonnie** and her husband, **Jimmy Gilchrist**, were with us and it was a very hot day.

Sarah's mother, Elizabeth, was like a mother to me as I lost my mother at a very young age so she was always my Mom and a great one at that.


If my home caught on fire and I could go back to retrieve only one thing (assuming all people and pets were safely out) I would choose to save my family pictures.

Kate Utley has been offered a fulltime position with NASA when she receives her degree in biomedical engineering from Texas A & M in December. Kate is now working on ammonia respirator masks for crew members to use when conducting repairs in space.

She engineered the kit, composed of contamination bags, an ammonia respirator mask and ammonia cartridges to filter ammonia from the air.

"We just had a crew debriefing today where [astronauts] shared their

needs as to what worked well in past flights and what could be changed. We have direct interface with crew members," **Kate** said in an article published in the *Dallas Morning News* on October 19, 2006.

Her division designs tools and equipment for use in the space station or shuttle, such as hardware, headsets, wipes, cleaning materials and the ammonia respirator.

During the summer, **Tom** Duncavage was Kate's mentor in NASA's "information fusion branch." **Mr. Duncavage** said, "In the 20 years I've been working here, she is probably the best co-op we've seen in all regards. She has a positive mental attitude, superb work ethic and a willingness to learn. She is self-made, came here as a co-op without a whole lot of background in this functional facility and got herself up and running in that group. We normally do not expect a co-op to do what she did. By the time she was here a month, I was using her as a staff engineer."

Kate replied, "Overall, the co-op is something special and unique that I've had so much fun with. It's about being part of something that's so big, something that the future will be and



A Veteran Remembers

In a brief telephone interview recently, **James Allen Utley** was asked about his military service. He stated that he served in the US Navy from 1945 until 1951. He was stationed for most of his service at Agana Airfield on Guam as part of the crew of a R5D airplane. When World War II ended, the planes were used to bring American POWs back from Japan. He remembered that the POWs were in terrible shape, having

endured harsh conditions in the POW camps. His plane and crew were involved in the Berlin Airlift in 1948 and 1949. When the Communists swept into China in 1949, **James Allen's** plane was sent to help the Nationalist leader, Chiang Kai-Shek, escape to safety in Taiwan.

We are so proud of **James Allen Utley** and his service to our country!


