PREFATORY NOTE

THIS book is a continuation of (1) "An index to the papers relating to Scotland described or calendared in the Historical MSS. Commission's reports," and (2) "a catalogue of the publications of Scottish historical and kindred clubs and societies, and of the volumes relative to Scottish history issued by His Majesty's Stationery Office, 1780-1908," both compiled by Professor C. Sanford Terry, the first being published in 1908 and the second in 1909.

Since the appearance of the first of these works the Historical MSS. Commission has published fifty-four volumes, while His Majesty's Stationery Office has issued thirty-three Record Publications relating to Scotland, and eight reports of the Royal Commission on the ancient and historical monuments and constructions of Scotland.

Of the twenty-seven clubs and societies in existence when Professor Terry's "Catalogue" appeared in 1909, twenty-five continued their issues. A few have since ceased to publish, though not, in every case, to exist. Five new clubs or societies have been formed:—the Historical Association of Scotland in 1911; the Glasgow Bibliographical Society in 1912; the Deeside Field Club in 1920; and in 1922 the Orkney Antiquarian Society and the Scottish Church History Society. Signs of renewed life have also appeared in some of the older societies which had seemed to be approaching dissolution.

In Professor Terry's "Catalogue" such of the Aberdeen University Studies as contained matter of historical interest were referred to. This series has been continued, and St. Andrews and Glasgow Universities have followed Aberdeen's example. The first of the St. Andrews University Publications was issued in 1901, though a volume of historical interest did not appear until 1910. In addition to the numbered series, however, other volumes had been published by the University, and some of them

find their place in these pages. A series of University publications was inaugurated in Glasgow in 1925.

Thus, over four hundred and fifty volumes of the type described in Professor Terry's "Index" and "Catalogue" have appeared since his books were published. To the interest and value of the contents of these volumes it is unnecessary to refer here. In cataloguing them I have followed Professor Terry's admirable example as closely as possible. The title page of each volume has been given in full, followed by details of pagination. The number of leaves of plates, if any, which each volume contains, and its measurement in inches, have been added. In volumes of proceedings and transactions the chief contents have been stated.

Professor Terry's model has been my guide. In addition I have had the benefit of his unfailing interest and encouragement. For this, and for the counsel he gave me whenever I sought it, I am grateful.

To the Librarian and staff of the library of this University I owe thanks for the patient manner in which they assisted me in collecting the materials used in this book. I am additionally indebted to Dr. W. Douglas Simpson for his kindness in selecting the articles noted in the proceedings of the Society of Antiquaries. I wish also to thank Miss M. S. Best, Sub-Librarian, for the help she has frequently given me, and the secretaries of the clubs and societies with whose publications this volume is concerned. With their help the information I have collected is, I trust, complete.

I acknowledge the courtesy of Messrs. Jackson, Wylie & Co. of Glasgow in allowing me to reprint the subject-indexes of Professor Terry's "Catalogue" and "Index."

I am indebted to my friend, Mr. J. Gilbert Wallace, for help in the final revision of the proofs and in the labour of indexing.
