FOREWORD

FOR twenty-five years, in a limited manner and as opportunity presented itself, I have endeavored to learn as much of the history of my paternal kindred as a busy life would permit. This I have done in the belief that by preserving a record of certain sterling family qualities, which, while not spectacular, are worthy of emulation by younger generations of the family, I may be able to create a valuable record of information and inspiration.

The main purpose in this effort is to register, in as far as possible, the names and achievements, wherever obtainable, of the descendants of Richard Carlisle, my great-great-grandfather, who was born in South Carolina and died in Alabama.

Much of the genealogical material has been furnished by members of various families. To all who have helped in any way, I am grateful and extend my heartfelt thanks.

For purposes of accuracy, I have spent much time in careful research and in continuous checking of the information herein contained. Therefore, I believe that errors have been reduced to a minimum, and request your gracious forbearance, should any have crept in.

It must be noted that important links of connection are often unobtainable due to loss of family Bibles in fires and by enemy invasions, which have caused the destruction of many courthouse records and public documents.

For identification purposes each descendant of Richard Carlisle is numbered in two ways. When his name first appears among the children of his parents, he is given a number preceding his name by which from then on he will be designated. He is also given a small number to the right and above his name, in exponent form, which indicates the generation to which he belongs. If enough material is available to include a biographical sketch of the person, the fact will be indicated by a small plus sign preceding his name. His biography will be found in its proper sequence in the chapter which covers the generation to which he belongs.

Since given names are so often repeated in families, it is advisable to check the line of descent as shown in the parentheses at the beginning of the biographies. For example:

FOREWORD

Ralph Cary⁵ Carlisle (George Washington⁴; Charles Milton³; Jason²; Richard¹). This merely indicates that Ralph Cary is a son of George Washington, who was a son of Charles Milton, who was a son of Jason, who was a son of Richard. When a woman's name appears in the line of descent, her full maiden name is used for identification.

Abbreviations in this book, besides those which are of customary and general use, are as follows: b. for born; d. for died; m. for married; dau. for daughter.

It is beyond the scope of this effort to attempt a complete genealogical record of the Carlisle family. I shall be compelled to leave the further pursuit of this fascinating undertaking to some other descendant who may have the time, the means, and inclination to follow it through.

INTRODUCTION

THE Carlisle family is one of the oldest families of Great Britain, a branch of which was ennobled in Scotland. Its origin was either British or Saxon, most probably British. The surname is derived from the city of Carlisle, the Capitol of Cumberland, England. The name of the city, as well as of the family, was variously spelled at different periods. Called Lugavellum by the Romans, during their occupation, it was abbreviated by the Britons to Luel or Leol, to which was added the prefix Caer or City, hence Caerluel, Caerleol, Carliell, Carliol, Karlel, Karlyl, Carleil, Carlile, Carlyle and Carlisle.

The recorded history of Carlisle, England is complete since the year 1092, the city having been first mentioned in 685. Situated eight miles south of the Scotch border, it was a fortified town during the long wars between England and Scotland. From this circumstance comes the meaning of the family name Carlisle as "dweller at the fortified tower."

Sir Hildred de Carliell (1060 A.D.) was the founder of the Carlisle family. A man of great importance, he was honored by successive monarchs. The Barony of Carliell, or Carlisle, on which the City of Carliell was erected, the manor of Cumwinton and large possessions on the east side of the Riven Eden, belonged to Sir Hildred, a knight. He lived at Carliell and was called Hildred de Carliell. That ancient surname descended to his posterity who were knights, successively, in England and Scotland.

The Carlises were originally English. The first members of the family to live in Scotland were colonists who went to Annandale with the Bruces about 1170 A.D. Their descendants were valiant contributors to the final success of King Robert Bruce. Sir William de Carliol was a person of such grandeur and consequence, that he obtained in marriage Lady Margaret Bruce, one of the daughters of Robert, the seventh Earl of Carrick, and sister of the King.

Some members of the Carlisle family removed to Ireland at an early date. Robert Karlel is on record as holding land in 1348, while William de Karlyl was in government service in 1371. He was constituted Chief Baron of the Exchequer in Ireland in 1384.

INTRODUCTION

A study of the origin of the various branches of the family, scattered as they are throughout the British Islands and the United States, indicates that their ancestors all came from the relatively small and closely interrelated areas of Northern England, Southern Scotland and Northern Ireland. In fact, it is believed that their common ancestral background is found as early as the eleventh century, A.D., in Carlisle, England.

Many members of the ancient family of Carlisle were outstanding, as confirmed by history. They served as members of Parliament frequently between 1373 and 1449, during the reigns of Edward III, Richard II, Henry V, and Henry VI.

The first Lord Carlyle was Sir John Carlyle of Torthorwald. He was elevated to the peerage in 1473 by King James III, and was instrumental in suppressing the rebellion of the Earls of Douglas at Annandale, Scotland in 1485. At that time he was rewarded with large grants of land.

A few generations later it was necessary for his estates to pass through the female line, and the title Lord Carlyle became extinct. The estates passed to the descendants of Sir James Douglas of Parkhead, who had been stabbed to death on the street in Edinburgh July 14, 1608, his son holding the estates until his own death in 1638. Then they passed to the Earl of Queensberry, but the title which was a male fee and did not pass with the land, became dormant. It is believed that the title rests with the Lymekilns branch of the family. The Carlyle property, which once comprised nearly half of Annandale, was reduced by 1700 to a few isolated estates.

One of the early Carlisles of London, England was Christopher Carleil, born 1551, and educated at the University of Cambridge. A great soldier and navigator during the reign of Queen Elizabeth, he took an active interest in American discoveries as early as 1574. Historians speak highly of his military skill. He was Lieutenant General of the land forces in the expedition of 1585-86 to the West Indies, with Sir Francis Drake as Admiral, at the head of the fleet.

The family name has acquired considerable literary luster from its being borne by Thomas Carlyle (1795-1881), distinguished author, historian and philosopher. This remarkable man of genius was born at Ecclefechan, Scotland, Dec. 4, 1795.

INTRODUCTION

By the time of the American Revolution (1775-1781), many Carlises had migrated to the colonies and took an outstanding part in the struggle against England. A few, however, had loyalist leanings and did not favor rebellion against the mother country. An interesting example is that of Abraham Carlisle of Philadelphia, Pa. When the Royal troops took possession of Philadelphia, he accepted an appointment from Sir William Howe to guard the entrances to the city. At the evacuation of the British Army in 1778, the Colonial troops returned, and seized, among others, Abraham Carlisle. He was tried and executed, despite the fact that great efforts were made to save his life. Many citizens denounced the execution as judicial murder. Four thousand people attended his burial.

The Carlises of England, Scotland and Ireland were distinguished by frankness of manner and integrity of conduct. These traits characterized, as well, their posterity who emigrated to America, many of whom were outstanding also in the fields of literature and statesmanship. Obviously it is impossible to list all who have achieved renown, but the following are of interest.

One such member was John Snyder Carlile (1817-1878) of Virginia, a Representative and a Senator in the Congress of the United States. He also served in the State Senate.

Another member of distinction was Dr. James H. Carlisle (1825-1909), who was for many years president of Wofford College, Spartanburg, S. C., and one of the most profound of mathematicians.

John Griffin Carlisle (1835-1910), served as Lieut. Governor of Kentucky, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Senator and member of President Grover Cleveland's cabinet, being Secretary of the Treasury.

Nicholas Carlisle, a distinguished English author, in 1822 at London, England, published a genealogical collection of the ancient family of Carlisle. In compiling this volume, I feel much as he did when he wrote, "I knew the Name to be honorable—I wished it might have an Historian."

CARLISLE COATS OF ARMS

CHAPTER ONE

FIRST GENERATION

ALTHOUGH there are numerous branches of the Carlisle family and the surname is now found in nearly every state in the union, this history is primarily a study of Richard Carlisle of Marlborough District, S. C., and his descendants. He was born May 29, 1774, and died Dec. 15, 1854. Following the pioneering trend of that period when settlers left the seaboard states and migrated westward in quest of permanent homes, Richard Carlisle and his immediate family left South Carolina in 1832 and settled in Jefferson County, Ala., where, after one hundred twenty-nine years, many of his descendants are still found.

Much authoritative information exists concerning Richard and his sons which is authenticated by early census reports, family Bibles, courthouse and church records. Tradition and research both indicate that Richard's ancestors came to America from England. His mother's name was Phoebe; and it is believed that she was descended from the Puritans of New England. According to the "History of the Old Cheraws", her husband was among the first to volunteer to resist British oppression and was mortally wounded at the battle of Bunker Hill during the American Revolution.

Carlisles In Early South Carolina

According to tradition, the Carlisles came to South Carolina from Virginia. Phoebe Carlisle is shown as head of the household with a sixteen-year-old son, [Richard] in the U. S. Census of 1790. At that time they were living in Cheraw District, S. C., which was later divided into several districts, one of which was Marlborough, now Marlboro County. At one time they lived in the area of Dyer's Hill and Crooked Creek. After Richard married, it is believed that he lived in the village which grew up around Marlboro County's first courthouse.

The village where the first courthouse was built was called simply "the courthouse." In later years it became known as "Carlisle," having been named for Richard Carlisle. The village

of Carlisle was located six miles west and a little south of present-day Bennettsville. It was the county seat for thirty-four years, until the increase of population in the central and eastern parts of the county made it desirable that the seat of government be moved to a more conveniently accessible place. A granite block set a little back in a field, alongside a dirt road, is the only reminder that here was once the village of Carlisle. Incised into the stone is the legend:

“The site of the first courthouse, built 1785, removed to its present site, Bennettsville, S. C., Dec. 14, 1819. This marker erected Dec. 14, 1919, by Pee Dee Chapter D. A. R. and citizens of Marlboro County.”

The first appearance of Richard Carlisle's name at the new Marlboro County Courthouse was in regard to real estate transactions. The record shows that he bought 107½ acres of land on the northeast side of the Great Pee Dee River for \$125 from Bartholomew Cosnahan Aug. 12, 1818, and 100 acres of land on the northeast side of the Great Pee Dee River and on Muddy Creek for \$400 from Benjamin Stubbs, four years later, Mar. 12, 1822. He executed a mortgage on a debt of \$109.10 to John F. Wilson on Mar. 4, 1823, and sold 100 acres of land on the east side of Muddy Creek to John L. McRae for \$237 Sept. 4, 1823.

Another record at the courthouse shows that Richard Carlisle served as administrator of the estate of Lewis Terrill, who died in 1821.

Richard was a staunch member of the Baptist Church, and is mentioned in the “History of the Pee Dee Baptist Association” as having represented Muddy Creek Baptist Church at Baptist conventions, alone for several years; but in 1822 William Thomas and Richard Carlisle together represented the church.

A few years later, it is presumed, that he moved to the Salem Baptist Church community, near Bennettsville, where he had a farm adjoining that of James Carlisle, who, according to tradition, was his nephew.

The records of the Salem Baptist Church show that Richard Carlisle was received as a member by letter Apr. 9, 1825. His son, Jason Carlisle, became a member of the church June 18,

1826, and Permelia Carlisle, Jason's wife, joined the church in Aug., 1826. Joel Carlisle, Richard's son, became a member May 18, 1829. Edward James Carlisle, Sr., also, a son of Richard, and Edward James' wife, Luensor, joined the church June 20, 1829. Sarah Carlisle, wife of Richard, joined July 18, 1829.

Carlisle Migration to Alabama

After the death of Phoebe Carlisle, mother of Richard, June 17, 1831, he and his family made a momentous decision, that of moving westward, as some of their neighbors were doing. Being devout and meticulous church members, they requested their letters of dismissal from Salem Baptist Church: Jason Carlisle, Nov. 20, 1830; Joel Carlisle and wife, Nancy [Ann], Dec. 18, 1831; Permelia Carlisle, wife of Jason, 1832; Richard Carlisle and wife, Sarah, Jan. 14, 1832; and Edward James Carlisle, Sr., and wife, Luensor, Feb. 9, 1832. These dates indicate that Jason, as the eldest living son, had been designated to go to Alabama in advance of the rest of the family to discover what opportunities were available there for new settlers.

Jason, undoubtedly, located an ideal spot; and we next find Richard Carlisle and his family in Jefferson County, Alabama. They settled in beautiful Ruhama Valley, known today as Jones Valley. The place where they built their homes is now the East Lake section of Birmingham. The Creek Indians had lived in Ruhama Valley, one of their favorite hunting grounds, where there were many springs; and although a treaty had been signed following the Creek War, (1813-1814), many Indians still roamed the forests.

Richard Carlisle was received into Ruhama Baptist Church by letter in May, 1832. During his connection with the church, he served on many important committees, and was appointed a delegate to various Baptist Association meetings. Active in all affairs of church, he sometimes led the services in the sanctuary. His name is mentioned twice in the book, "Ruhama—The Story of a Church," by Thomas E. Huey. Richard received a letter of dismissal from Ruhama in Jan., 1854, presumably to unite with a Baptist Church in Jackson Co., Ala., to which section he had moved prior to his death. He is buried in the Longacre Ceme-

tery, which is four miles west of Stevenson, Ala. His grave is marked with a large flat rock into which is incised: "R. Carlisle."

Richard Carlisle married twice, first, Aug. 28, 1800, Priscilla Rabon, who died Aug. 29, 1821; second, Dec. 24, 1821, Sarah Burkett, born 1786 in South Carolina.

CHAPTER TWO

SECOND GENERATION

- 5 Jason² Carlisle, (son of Richard¹) was born in Marlboro Co., S. C., Oct. 23, 1806. It is quite probable that his early childhood was spent in the village of Carlisle, site of the first courthouse of Marlboro Co., which had been named for his father, Richard Carlisle.

At the age of nineteen Jason married Permelia Ann Elizabeth Stubbs, daughter of Lewis and Mary Stubbs, residents of Marlboro Co. Both were born in South Carolina, Lewis Stubbs in 1781 and his wife in 1782. They migrated in 1833 to Pike Co., Ala., where they farmed. Lewis Stubbs was an industrious and patriotic citizen, served in the War of 1812. He died in 1853 at the age of 72. In his will, made Aug. 20, 1853, and recorded in the Pike Co. courthouse, Troy, Ala., he mentioned his daughter, Permelia (Stubbs) Carlisle.

Jason moved from Marlboro Co., S. C., to Jefferson Co., Ala., in about 1830. The first land he owned in Alabama was 81 acres which he purchased Dec. 30, 1831, near what is now the East Lake section of Birmingham. Two or three years later he moved to Pike, now Bullock Co., Ala., settling six miles south of Union Springs. He lived there about six years, after which he came back to Jefferson Co., and farmed.

Again Pike County called Jason; and he returned, this time settling near Orion in 1846, where he lived for about twenty-five years. The U. S. Census of 1850 shows him a prosperous farmer with thirteen slaves. He owned 1,000 acres of land and was outstanding in the community. During the Civil War, four of his sons served in the Confederate Army, the youngest of whom was killed in battle. The war was costly to Jason in more ways than one. Another son, who served throughout the war, died soon after its close, of disease contracted in the service. His slaves had been set free and he sold considerable land for Con-

federate money, which at the close of the war became worthless.

In 1872, Jason moved back to Jefferson County where he spent the remaining years of his life. His farm, consisting of 140 acres, which he purchased Aug. 23, 1872, was situated between Trussville and Chalkville; the house in which he lived is still standing. He was a hard-working, self-made man, devoted to his family. He served in the Creek War in 1836. A consistent and liberal member of the Baptist Church, he served as a deacon for nearly a half century. Jason Carlisle died Jan. 13, 1880. His grave, clearly marked with complete information on a well preserved stone, is in Cahaba Baptist Church cemetery, Trussville, Ala.

Jason Carlisle married three times; first, July 23, 1826, Permelia Ann Elizabeth Stubbs, born in 1808, Marlboro Co., S. C.; died in 1853 near Orion, Ala.; buried in China Grove, Ala. His second wife was Matilda Emeline Rogers, whom he married Dec. 29, 1853. He married Catherine Fortune Jan. 26, 1860. Born Catherine Allen in 1823, as a young woman she had married Joshua Fortune, who was the first person to be buried in the Baptist Church cemetery at Spring Hill, Pike Co., Ala. He was born Jan. 12, 1820, and died Aug. 8, 1859. Her second husband was Jason Carlisle. Although Catherine never had children of her own, she was a devoted mother to Jason's small children, Mutie and Bennie. Her third husband was Billie Massey of Argo, Ala. After his death about 1901, she returned to Trussville to live with Jason Carlisle's relatives, and was affectionately known as "Grandma Massey." She died July 27, 1910. Her grave is by the side of that of Jason Carlisle, her second husband, in the Cahaba Baptist Church cemetery.

CHAPTER THREE

THIRD GENERATION

She was the daughter of Robert and Patience Rabb, natives of South Carolina, from which state they removed to Georgia and about 1846, to Pike Co., and there died.

The will of Robert Rabb is recorded in the Pike Co. courthouse, Troy, Ala. He was a son of James Rabb of Fairfield Co., S. C., a soldier in the American Revolution. The will of James Rabb is filed in the courthouse of Fairfield Co., Winnsboro, S. C. Robert Rabb's wife, Patience, was the daughter of John Glazier, who served as a Captain in the American Revolution. His will, also, is filed in the courthouse of Fairfield Co., Winnsboro, S. C.

Universally considered one of the outstanding citizens of Pike Co., Ala., Charles Milton served the people of that county; first, as physician and then as superintendent of education, to which office he was elected in 1890. He graduated when twenty-four years of age, from Orion Institute, a newly organized academy founded in 1848 by an act of the Alabama Legislature, and supported by donations from private citizens.

For three years after leaving Orion Institute, Charles Milton taught school; but soon decided to give the greater part of his time to agriculture. He acquired through his own effort considerable land, which he lost during the Civil War. However, at the time of his death he owned an excellent farm of 540 acres. At the beginning of the war he was Postmaster at Henderson, Ala.

The need for physicians at this time was so great that he began in 1863 the practice of medicine. As a loyal member of the medical profession, he took an active interest in the proceedings of the Pike County Medical Society, and the Ala. Medical Association, with which he was affiliated.

Dr. Carlisle was a member of the Masonic Order for forty-two years, having been initiated Oct. 14, 1854. Spring Hill Lodge No. 536, A. F. & A. M., Pike Co., Ala., was established mainly through his efforts and means. The following quotation is from the Memorial Resolutions of Spring Hill Masonic Lodge:

“As a physician, Dr. Carlisle was an original thinker and painstaking practitioner. He was ever charitable to the poor, and gave all the years of his life to his God and to the well being and advancement of his fellowman.”

Among her survivors were six daughters, two sons, one sister, thirty-two grandchildren, eighty-seven great-grandchildren and thirteen great-great-grandchildren. Her grave is in the Baptist Church cemetery, Spring Hill, Ala.

The long and courageous life of Mary Ann Elizabeth is of special interest. Her mother having died, Mary Ann

Elizabeth married at the age of seventeen. When the Civil War began, she and her husband were pioneering on a homestead in Taylor Co., Fla. He enlisted in the Confederate Army, leaving her and their small children in the wilderness. In those days there were few white settlers in Florida, and life was rugged at its best. Her husband died at the close of the war of wounds received in the service. After his burial on the homestead, she packed some of her household goods in a wagon, and abandoning what remained, started with her five small children on the long hazardous journey back to her father's home in Pike Co., Ala. The trip was fraught with constant danger; lurking Indians, flooded streams and nights spent out-of-doors. At one river crossing the horse and wagon had to be pulled across on a small raft. Finally, after many days, she reached her destination where she lived until her second marriage.

Mary Ann Elizabeth Carlisle married twice; first, Oct. 2, 1853, John Marion Faulkner, born Oct. 5, 1830, Pike Co., Ala.; died Feb. 4, 1865 in Taylor Co., Fla. Her second husband was William Nathan Harvell, born Mar. 10, 1849, Pike Co., Ala.; died there June 10, 1922.

Richard and Mary made their home in Fox, Upson Co., Ga., where they engaged in farming and operated the Post Office, Richard being Postmaster. The old homestead where they reared a large family is still in existence. Late in life, after having lived in Unadilla, Ga., for several years, Richard and Mary moved to Macon, Ga., to live with their youngest daughter and her husband, Aulena (Carlisle) Yates and Durwood Yates. It was there they died, having lived long lives of usefulness, an inspiration to all who knew them. Their graves are in Riverside Cemetery in Macon.

Richard Carlisle always took a keen interest in matters pertaining to the medical profession. He originated, developed, and promoted several remedies which he manufactured and distributed in Georgia. He was affectionately known as "Dr. Carlisle." He was a modest and reserved man, who did many acts of kindness. For instance, the author of this history, as the oldest child in a large family, would never have had a college education, except for his grandfather's generosity. The fact that his gifts were kept secret was made clear when the author repaid this sum to the heirs of his estate, and it was found that the transaction had not been recorded.

Returning to his home in Pike Co., he remained there a short time and then volunteered for service in the Confederate Army. Thomas enlisted in Co. I, 17th Ala. Infantry in Montgomery, Ala., Oct. 16, 1861. Wounded at the battle of Shiloh, Apr. 6, 1862, he was captured at Pitts Landing the next day. He was admitted to U. S. A. General Hospital, Camp Dennison, Ohio, Apr. 20, 1862. He was among the 1020 prisoners of war from Camp Chase, Ohio, exchanged on board the steamer "John H. Done" near Vicksburg, Miss., Sept. 11, 1862.

According to tradition, Thomas told his older brother, Francis Jason, on the night before one of the several battles fought at Resaca, Ga., in 1864, of his premonition that he would not survive the next engagement. Thomas wanted to give his gold watch to his brother, but was encouraged to keep it. In the autumn of 1877, soon after William Thomas' untimely death, Mary, his widow, visited his grave in the Cahaba Baptist Church cemetery in Trussville. CHAPTER SEVEN

RELATED CARLISLES IN SOUTH CAROLINA

WHEN Richard Carlisle migrated with his family to Alabama in 1832, he left in Marlboro Co., S. C., James Carlisle, who, according to tradition, was his nephew, having been reared in the home of Richard's mother, Phoebe Carlisle.

James Carlisle (1802-1882) was an energetic and successful farmer. Being a public-spirited citizen, he established and helped maintain a school in his community. He was a deacon and trustee of Salem Baptist Church near Bennettsville, and for fifty years a devoted member.

James married four times; first, Isabella Johnson, who died Apr. 11, 1829, daughter of Peter Johnson; second, Willie Johnson, who died Apr. 23, 1833, daughter of William Johnson; third, Charlotta McDaniel, born June 26, 1812, died Sept. 14, 1852, daughter of George McDaniel; fourth, Mary Graham, born 1824, died 1902, daughter of John G. Graham.

The only child by the first marriage was Mary Ann; another daughter, Celia Ann, was born to the second marriage. The children by the third marriage were: Elizabeth, Ellen, Susan, Thomas Franklin, Joseph A., Benjamin and Jane.

Still living in the general area where James Carlisle made his home are the descendants of two of his children, Ellen (Carlisle) Freeman, and Thomas Franklin Carlisle. These descendants have contributed greatly to the cultural and civic life of their communities.

Ellen, second daughter of James and Charlotta (McDaniel) Carlisle, was born May 1, 1839, and died Oct. 26, 1919. She married John W. Freeman, who was born May 11, 1827, and died May 13, 1899. Their children were: Mary Freeman, Robert Lawrence Freeman, George W. Freeman, Sr., Annie Freeman, Carrie Freeman and John J. Freeman.

Robert Lawrence Freeman, oldest son of John W. and Ellen (Carlisle) Freeman, prominent leader in public affairs, was born Jan. 1, 1871 and died Dec. 31, 1926. He served as State Senator, member of the Legislature and Superintendent of Education of Marlboro County, S. C. For twenty-five years he was

owner and editor of the "Pee Dee Advocate", county newspaper published in Bennettsville.

C., he served as first vice-president and director of Planter's National Bank and trustee and deacon of Thomas Memorial Baptist Church. In 1920, he and Warren Moore founded Freeman-Moore Co., which later became Freeman & Company.

The author is deeply grateful to Mr. Freeman, who, in 1937, furnished information which resulted in establishing Marlboro Co., S. C. as the early home of the Carlisles, from which Richard Carlisle and his family migrated to Alabama.

By profession, Mrs. Blackmon is a teacher of science. She is a leader in the civic and religious life of Hartsville where she has worked with the Girl Scouts and American Red Cross. In the American Legion Auxiliary she has held offices on unit and department levels.

Lorraine Spates Carlisle, born Aug. 25, 1924, in Hartsville, S. C.; attended Coker College; married James DeVore McNair Aug. 18, 1943. Their home is near Aiken, S. C. Her civic work includes membership on the executive boards of Aiken County Crippled Children's Society and the City of Aiken Park Commission.
