





It can pay off handsomely if you take the time to make 'the switch'

CURRENT accounts have been put under the microscope once again, with the competition watchdog unveiling proposals that could help customers see more easily if they might be better off elsewhere.

At the moment, it's too easy for banks to sit back and take existing customers for granted, according to the Competition and Markets Authority (CMA).

The watchdog has put forward a series of proposals which it hopes will shake the situation up – and which it says could bring benefits to bank customers to the tune of £1 billion over five years.

What are the problems with current accounts?

One major issue is our reluctance to switch deals. It is sometimes said that people stay "marned" to their current

account provider for longer than they stay wed to their spouse.

More than half (57 per cent) of consumers had been with their account provider for more than 10 years and 37 per cent for more than 20 years.

Current accounts have no particular "use by" date, so many of us stick with the same provider year in, year out, without considering if we might be better off elsewhere.

By contrast, with a financial product like car insurance, for example, many people will shop around when their annual policy is about to end, to see if they can get a better deal.

The array of mind-boggling charges that can come with current accounts may cause further confusion and put people off switching.



Yet the CMA found that many of us could be much better off if we made the leap to a new provider.

The annual savings could be on average £116 – ranging from £89 on average for

customers who do not use an overdraft to £153 on average for overdraft users.

In 2013, a new current account switching service was introduced. This has cut the length of time it takes to switch deals and

has taken much of the hassle out of switching – so it may not be as hard as you think.

What is the CMA proposing to do?

A final report is being released later this summer, but the remedies CMA has provisionally put forward include a cap on monthly unarranged overdraft charges.

Other suggestions include improving the current account switching service and making more of advances in technology to help customers see the best deals for their personal needs.

In the meantime, if you're wondering if you could be getting a better current account deal, how do you choose?

The good news is that many current

accounts offer perks such as cashback, rates of interest which are much higher than you could expect to get from many savings accounts and also cash to switch.

But while perks like this seem attractive, there are also the fees and charges to consider.

So it's worth taking some time to sit down and decide how you use your account – are you someone who always stays in credit or regularly goes overdrawn, for example?

Rachel Springall, a finance expert at financial information website Moneyfacts.co.uk, explained: "Customers need to be careful when picking a new current account. It needs to support their day-to-day banking needs, which can include dipping into an overdraft.


"Daily usage fees can really build




up so consumers would be wise to be wary of these charges when they look to borrow over the short term.

"Packaged current accounts are a great way to get a little extra from a current account, such as worldwide travel insurance, but they can be a costly mistake if the benefits are not used or if people find that they are not eligible.

"Anyone looking to switch their current account could take advantage of some attractive cash incentives such as the Co-operative Bank that is offering £150 up front."

include meat, fish, wholegrains, fresh fruit, vegetables, Brussels sprouts and peppers.

Magnesium and zinc can be found in broccoli, peanuts, wholegrain cereals, nuts and seeds, and high protein foods such as beef, pork, lamb, peanuts, and legumes.

Alcohol and cigarettes can both interfere with the body's ability to absorb nutrients, so cutting out - or at least cutting back on booze and nicotine will make a big difference.

Breakfast really is the most important meal of the day. A nutritious, protein-full breakfast such as porridge or muesli will maintain blood sugar levels, boost energy, improve concentration, and help the body and mind to cope with

Skipping meals during the day, particularly breakfast, is counterproductive. You will not lose weight because your metabolism slows down, and depriving your body of essential nutrients makes it less able to fight off infections.

Diet and keeping fit really go hand in hand. There is little point cutting out fatty foods and eating healthily if you are going to live the life of a couch potato. Weight loss may be your goal, but exercise is vital to keep the body

As well as whisky, across Moray there are also excellent local brewers and gin producers that make fine use of the area's natural resources.

Earlier this month a new drinks festival was held in Elgin Town hall that united for the first time Speyside's famous whiskies with the region's award-winning brewers, gin-makers and food producers.

The Spirit of Speyside: Distilled brought together an array of great flavours through drinks, food and masterclasses over one weekend in one venue.





Aiming for 'magic 30'

AS you can see, healthy living provides many benefits.

Getting physical activity into your daily routine, combined with healthy eating, is the best way to get those short- and long-term benefits into your life.

To achieve an active lifestyle. adults should have at least 30 minutes of moderate physical activity most days of the week.

Children should aim for at least one hour or more of moderate physical activity most days. It needn't all be done in one go, though.

Develop an active lifestyle piece by piece - small chunks of moderate activity over time will add up to a more active, healthier lifestyle.

Moderate activity is the equivalent of brisk walking.

Moderate intensity physical activity should feel comfortable and not lead to injury.

If physical activity is painful, it's likely you're overdoing it and may need to reduce the intensity and possibly the frequency of the activity.

Active commuting is one way to keep regular physical activity in your everyday life. After two or three weeks, try to increase your walking time or how often you

Consider cycling to work or walking the whole way. By doing this you can gradually add more minutes of regular physical activity into your day.

Ideally, after a month or two. you want to be building up to 30 minutes on most days.

If you've been gradually increasing the level of your physical activities, this will feel like a natural progression.

One way to ensure you get the maximum enjoyment is to join others in taking exercise.







Don't be driven up the wall by making wrong colour choice

A WALL colour you don't like is hard to live with - and, as there are so many different colours and finishes to choose from, it's important to try a new paint first. It is a good idea to apply a little of a new colour to each wall, so you get the full effect and can see how it looks at different times of the day.

Printed colour charts aren't always accurate, so don't rely on them, and the same is true of paint colours viewed online - always try

the paint in the room it'll be used in. Once you've found an emulsion

you like, you'll need to work out how much to buy. The paint tin will have information on coverage, and you can use an online paint calculator to work out how much paint is needed per room. These calculators take into account things like the size of the walls, windows and doors, but not the type of emulsion you're using or the state of the walls themselves.

Around the home

Brush up well and be happy!

AS soon as you start applying an emulsion, you'll be able to see how well it covers and get an idea of how many coats you'll have to do. The quality of the emulsion will affect the number of coats, as will the state of the walls.

More paint will be needed to cover textured wallpaper and lumpy and bumpy walls than smooth ones (new plaster should be sealed first to make it less absorbent). Some emulsions cover better than others. It's worth paying more for a goodquality paint that provides excellent coverage than scrimping and paying for it later.

The colour you use can also affect how much emulsion you need. Pale colours may not cover as well as dark ones, and if you're painting new plaster with pale emulsion there may be patches you can't cover easily - use a stain-block paint or a basecoat emulsion on these.

Basecoat emulsions, which are white and cover better than most standard emulsions, are useful if the emulsion you're using isn't covering well.

If you're painting over dark walls with a pale colour, for example, you'll save time, effort and paint by applying a basecoat first.

When it's always better to have too much

It's obviously better to have too much emulsion than not enough, as long as you can return it most DIY stores will refund unused tins, although usually not from paint-mixing machines (unless faulty).

Sometimes the same colour can change slightly between batches of paint, especially with paints that use natural pigments, so not buying enough in the first place can be disastrous.




Ceramic and porcelain enables you to tile in style

TILES come in various shapes, sizes and materials, and it's important to get ones that suit the style and function of the room you're tiling, as well as your budget.

Often an affordable option, ceramic and porcelain tiles are popular because they're easy to lay and care for. Glass tiles are also low maintenance and look fantastic, but they tend to be expensive – as are many stone tiles (such as slate, marble and limestone) which are often higher maintenance and can vary a lot in thickness, colour and texture, so they're not for everyone.

Mosaic tiles are available in lots of different materials and are ideal for a feature wall or splashback, but they're rarely cheap. They can be hard to keep looking good, depending on where they are and the colour of the grout, because there are so many grout lines compared with larger tiles. Mosaics aren't the most practical option as a cooker or hob splashback, for example, especially if the grout is pale.

If you're buying tiles online that you haven't seen in person, make sure you get a sample first because you could end up with tiles you don't like that are expensive to return. Of course, you may prefer to buy tiles in store, where you can see what you're





getting. Another advantage of buying in store is that you can ensure all the tiles come from the same batch (as long as there's a batch number on the boxes), so they're exactly the same colour and finish.


To work out the number of tiles required, multiply the length by the height of each wall or part wall to be tiled (minus the area of any doors and windows) and add them together to get the total area, plus around 10 per cent more for breakages and wastage. Lots of tiles are sold per square metre and, even if they're not, it should say what the price is per square metre—this is the easiest way to work out the cost.

Don't forget to factor in the cost of the tile adhesive and grout, tools, spacers and other accessories.

The adhesive and grout must be suitable for where you're tiling (not all can be used in showers, for example) and the sort of tiles you're using. The grout can make almost as much

MEET YOUR MATTE

"Powder bronzers generally give more of a matte finish, which is great for oilier complexions," says Sascha Jackson, UK head make-up artist for Stila. She recommends that bronzing beginners choose "a shade lighter than you think you need".

She explains: "You can always build the colour intensity as you go. It's easier to apply more than it is to tone down."

HOW GLOW CAN YOU GO?

"Bronzer should enhance a tan, or warm the skin for a healthy glow," says make-up artist Lisa Prostamo. She advises that those with warmer or darker skin tones should try a shimmering bronzer, while "fair, untanned skins should avoid shimmer finishes".

Pleasures and challenges which go with the territory


DRIVING on rural roads such as those in the north and north-east can be quite a challenge – whatever the time of year. Tight bends, unexpected animals and narrow lanes complicate matters, but if you get it right these roads can be enjoyable too.

Planning ahead is the key, according to Richard Gladman, IAM RoadSmart's head of driving and riding standards. He says we should expect the unexpected, and offers these top tips on getting rural roads right:

1 Look as far ahead as possible to see what direction the road is taking – hedge lines, telegraph poles or lampposts all give clues on twists and turns ahead. And always be prepared for something you can't see round the bend – a group of cyclists or a horse, for instance.

2 Wet roads can have a serious effect on car control. Keep an eye out for wet leaves or standing water on the road – as well as being slippery, they can hide a multitude of hazards.


3 Be mindful of any animals that may also use the road and look out for these warning signs. Horses in particular can be






easily startled, so when approaching reduce your speed and give them plenty of room. Pass wide and slow when it is safe.

4 Keep an eye out for agricultural vehicles on the road – they probably can't go as fast as you want to, so try and be patient. On a single-carriageway road only overtake where there is plenty of room to do so and where there is no oncoming traffic. Remember, any break in the hedge line is a

potential junction for a tractor – if in doubt, hold back.

5 If you're driving behind a bus or a school coach, keep a look out for passengers that start to move around inside. This is usually an indication of passengers getting off at the next bus stop – be prepared to slow down for children crossing the road in front of or behind the bus.

Mr Gladman said: "Most country lanes will have

a speed limit of 60 mph – but this doesn't make it a target. You should be able to stop in the distance you can see to be clear on your own side of the road. On a single-track road you may need to stop in half of that distance to allow for oncoming traffic – if you can't see, slow down. There are so many potential distractions in this environment, but nothing beats driving through a country road with beautiful scenery on a nice day."

Regular check on tyres is vital

THE safety organisation TyreSafe has underlined the importance of carrying out regular tyre checks.

While various tyre types are available, all of them need to be in good condition and at the right pressure to perform at their best.

Summer tyres are the type most commonly fitted and are designed for road conditions experienced in the normal UK climate.

Winter tyres are manufactured with a rubber compound and tread pattern specifically designed to perform when temperatures drop to 7C and below, and are particularly competent in snowy and icy weather as they have higher levels of grip in these conditions.

Like winter tyres, all-season tyres are manufactured with a slightly different rubber compound



If your tyres show any sign of bulges, cuts or cracking, you need to have them examined by a tyre professional.

of which are fitted. Compared with warmer months, the distance a vehicle takes to stop may well increase and grip around corners is also likely to be reduced.

"The particular circumstances of the driver will dictate which tyre is best suited to their needs and some will opt for the reassurance of winter tyres," said Stuart Jackson, chairman of TyreSafe.

"Of course, many motorists are not in a position to buy a set of tyres specifically for winter. They should at least regularly check that all their tyres are in good condition with adequate tread depth, and at the right pressure, and drive with extra caution throughout the toughest season of the year."

TyreSafe recommends drivers check their tyres at least once a month and before long journeys. A tyre's tread depth should be at least above 1.6mm - the legal limit - as it determines how quickly a vehicle can brake, change direction and clear water from the road surface to avoid aquaplaning.

To check whether a tyre is close to the limit, a 20p piece can be used as an easy guide as its

border is exactly 1.6mm. Simply insert the 20p into the tyre's grooves at three points across its centre and then repeat twice more around the circumference. If you can see the border of the 20p piece at any point, your tyre may be below the legal limit and you should have it checked by a tyre-fitting service.

While you're checking tread, have a look at the tyre's general condition. Tyre manufacturers don't make tyres with bulges, cuts, nails or cracking in them so if any of these are visible you need to have it examined by a tyre professional.

Finally, use an accurate gauge to confirm your vehicle's tyres are at the vehicle manufacturer's recommended pressure. Two units of measure are typically used: "psi" and "bar", and as a rough guide one bar is equivalent to approximately 14.5 psi.

You'll typically find the right pressures either in the door shut or behind the filler cap, or alternatively you can look up the right pressure for your car at tyresafe.org

Remember that when a vehicle is fully loaded, the pressures will typically need to be increased and the spare tyre should also be checked.



The legal requirement for tyre tread depth is at least 1.6mm.



Turning the heat up in the push to keep the bills down

WITH summer but a distant memory, homeowners are turning their attention to how best to heat their homes during the colder months.

Energy costs are among the biggest household expenses so more and more people are considering installing renewable and environmentally-friendly systems to save money and help in the environment over the long term.

Here are five top tips if you are considering going green:

1. Heat pumps are one environmentally-friendly way to heat your home. Ground or air source heat pumps are most popular, as water source heat pumps aren't practical unless you have a lake, river or stream in your garden. Ground source heat pumps extract warmth from the earth and use it to heat your home or hot water. The (above-ground) pump is connected to a series of pipes (the ground loop) buried in the garden and can be used all year round, although you may need a back-up heating system in winter.

2. Air source heat pumps take heat from the air outside and use it indoors. They're either air-to-air pumps, which produce warm (and also cool) air and circulate it through fans, or air-to-water pumps, which supply your home's (wet) central heating system. Air source heat pumps can be less effective when it's colder than -5C, so another form of heating again may be necessary in winter.

3. If your home is heated by radiators, they won't get as hot with a heat pump as they would with a boiler - you'll need to have them on for longer or replace them with more powerful ones. The perfect partner for a heat pump is wet underfloor heating because both work at lower temperatures, but this type of heating isn't particularly easy to retrofit.


4. Biomass boilers are another eco heating option, ideal if you want to reduce your carbon dioxide emissions and have access to a regular supply of wood. These boilers burn wood chips, pellets or logs and can be used for central heating and hot water. The Energy Saving Trust (www.energysavingtrust.org.uk) says that an automatically fed pellet boiler for an average home costs £9,000-£21,000, including installation, so it's not cheap. However, if you replace an older gas heating system with a biomass system, you could save up to £360 a year, or up to £990 a year compared to an old electric heating system, according to the Trust.
